




The changes to the Constitution are important and it would be an oversight on my part if I did not acknowledge and thank the key parties that worked behind the scenes to enable the change. These include:

Despite an estimated 72,030 beach attendees while Anglesea volunteer patrols were being conducted, we managed to have a very minor number of first aids/rescues. This is a metric to be extremely proud of; when the flags are up, incidents on Anglesea beach are drastically reduced. This point is furthered by the fact that quite a few of these - therefore demonstrating not only the

amazing job our patrols are doing, but also the readiness of our teams to stand up even when not rostered on.

Once again, I wish to thank the Polar Bears and Supporters Group for their assistance in making patrols run smoothly and comfortably this year. They have, for years now, generously contributed funds to allow patrols to be well-fed during and responses occurred outside of patrol hours after patrols, through the Jimpy's Bar and the Fish & Chip Shop.

This year we gained 2 new ASRs - ASR 2 and ASR 4. These teams came in effortlessly to help alleviate some of the load that the 5 ASRs from last season had been carrying. Thank you to these teams for stepping up. Thank you also to those 5 ASRs from last season for very capably handling that previous season without complaint.

These are immense efforts, for which I'm extremely grateful.



huge thank you to both who humour my busy style of working.



FACILITIES REPORT

DIRECTOR OF FACILITIES

This past year has been relatively unexciting in the facilities space with the only new works being additional board racking in the Main Store.

We have, however, identified several relatively sizeable works that require attention, the most significant being the replacement of the power distribution board located in the lower carpark. This is the main supply to the club and although it was only installed in 2015 the supply housing has fallen apart! It is necessary to replace the housing and contents and it is anticipated this will cost between \$35 and \$40K. We are also looking to replace the gravel area

outside the Main

to better control how

As older members

would know there was a mural painted by noted illustrator Robert Ingpen in the old clubhouse. Unfortunately, this did not survive the redevelopment but fortunately a photographic record was kept. Thanks to Andrew Mauderer a wall art print was created by having dyes infused into aluminium. This now hangs outside the John Worrell Room.

Thanks to Matt Taylor and James
Pollard, the club has embraced the
Container Deposit Scheme with a number
of bins spread around the club. To date we
have raised several hundred dollars.

An area of real concern is the rate of increase of the electricity charges which

are some 41% greater than 12 months ago, although usage has not increased. Members should note that the restaurant area is separately metered thus ensuring Love House pay in full for their usage. The gas supply has also been separated so that the club and Love House each pay for their usage rather than us having to estimate the split.

It's gratifying to note that this year we had only one False Alarm, this time due to insects getting into one of the sensors. If only we could figure a way to get them to pay the \$1850 CFA false alarm charge.

On a more serious note the continued lack of support from members in helping maintain our facility is concerning.

Time and again it is left to one or two to clean up the Youth Room or gym or put equipment back from where it was taken. This is YOUR club so please help to keep it clean and tidy rather, than leaving it to two or three volunteer members to do it for you. If you think you can contribute in this way please reach out to us via the office.

Again, my thanks to Matt Taylor, James Betson, Graeme Weber, Mike Martin, Geoff Elliot, Adrian McNaughton and Mick McConnell who all give freely of their time and expertise to keep both the building and the grounds in great shape. My role in overseeing our facility has been made that much easier by the wonderful support I get from Raylene, Jennie and Lyn in the office.

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

Our U11 girls, with enough members to make up two teams, won medals in Agua Cam, beach relay, flags, long run, sprint, board relay, surf teams, iron and wade relay. McConnell, Amelia Charles and Amelia Hamilton. Byron Morgan came 2nd in the U12 surf race, while in the U12 girls, Kate Taylor took home two silver and one bronze individual medal, and combined with her teammates Zoe Hume, Maddie Crozier and Bonnie McCarroll to come third in the Aqua Cam. Our U13 girls won gold in the beach relay (Eliza Parr, Eloise Spinks, Ruby Macgowan, Mary-Jane Gilbert). Eliza Parr also won gold in the beach sprint and flags. We also came a gallant 6th place in the March Past with a fairly modest preparation!

At the Youth/Senior Victorian
Championships held at Ocean Grove on 2224 March, Anglesea youth had some fantastic results over three long and trying days and were a large part of Anglesea winning the overall point score for the first time in many decades. At the Australian Championships on the Sunshine Coast in Queensland, Summer Morgan and Jas Hume won silver medals in the U14 surf race and U15 2km run respectively. They made numerous other finals as did their teams in the board relay,

Cameron relay and surf teams events.

Mahli McCarroll came 5th in the U14 flags which was a fantastic effort and Evie Theodore, Caitlin Haseler and Ed Pollard all performed at a high level in their first Australian Championships. The Aussies was a great experience for our youth girls who represented the club with immense effort and pride.

Ed Pollard attended the Life Saving Victoria U13 Development Camp, and Jas Hume attended the U15 Camp where they both developed leadership, interpersonal and teamwork skills while also broadening their understanding of lifesaving pathways.

In 2024, 10 members between their SRC and Bronze years attended a 3-day Gap Year program in mid-January. This program provided the opportunity to refresh first aid, resuscitation and surf skills through fun and immersive experiences and social events. 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

YOUTH TEAM



We welcomed a number of new competitors, and their families to Anglesea this year and they all contributed immensely to both the culture and success of Anglesea SLSC over this summer surf season. It was great to see Mia Spencer back competing on the beach after a few years away and we welcomed Madeline Marcus, Abi Morgan and Lily Shipham who really strengthened our junior women's team. The local 2023/24 LSV competition program started in early October with a beach event carnival at Williamstown; from here on there

were a number of 'full' and 'beach' carnivals held around various Melbourne and Surf Coast beaches this season. Despite some imbalances in the timing of carnivals, it was fantastic to see the club represented at all carnivals across the season. Anglesea won the club point-score on multiple occasions throughout the season, demonstrating our athletes made the most of every competition opportunity and were always ready to

perform at their best; especially come State and National Championship events.

In early January, Julia Phillips and Saxon Beale were both selected to represent Victoria in the 2024 Australian Interstate Surf Life Saving Championships at Maroubra with Julia being given the coveted honour of being named Captain of the Victorian State Team. Both Julia & Saxon had excellent results with Julia winning the Open Female Beach Sprint event and placing 4th in the Beach Flags while Saxon, in his first major competition since having the complete 2023 season off due to injury, came 2nd in his pet event the Open Men's Beach Flags. These great results helped Victoria place 2nd overall in the Opens Teams Event, which is their highest placing for many, many years. Mahli McCarroll was also selected in the Victorian U14 Pathway team that also competed at Maroubra, achieving 5th place in both the flags & sprint events.

Julia & Saxon were joined in Maroubra by fellow Anglesea beachies Patrick Kenny, Sam Johnson and Kate Walker with all five being selected to represent Victoria in the Super Surf Teams League competition, competing against the top athletes from across Australia over three days of backto-back intense competition. This was a fantastic experience for everyone that provided a very high level of competition that we don't get in Victoria. All Anglesea athletes competed very well with some fantastic results but unfortunately, it was a bit of 'lightning striking twice' for Saxon who severely injured his shoulder in the final





of the men's beach flags that saw him out of competing for the following two months. We really congratulate all our Anglesea beachies on their amazing achievements during this time.

As everyone is aware, the club achieved the most incredible result at this year's Victorian Surf Life Saving Championships by winning the overall club points-score; the first time since 2016. The Anglesea beach team contributed significantly to the club's result by obtaining over 280 points over the weekend as well as being the number 1 beach club!! This was not only due to our elite individual performances over the weekend but to all those competitors who were part of relay teams or competed out of their age groups or in unfamiliar events just to make teams, so that the club continued to tally up those points -it all made a difference. By the end of the weekend the team had won an impressive 13 Gold, 10 Silver & 14 Bronze medals along with many other finalists and placegetters.

Some notable performances include:

- Fielding four Open Mixed Beach Relay teams in the final, finishing 1st (Kate Walker, Julia Phillips, Sam Johnson, Saxon Beale), third, fourth and sixth;
- · Winning the Open Male Beach Relay

- Julia Phillips winning her first ever Open Female Beach Flags; Julia winning 4 Gold medals from 4 events and was subsequently awarded Champion Female Beach Competitor;
- Our group of very talented junior boys & girls consisting of Cooper Stanley, Sam Johnson, Connor Hulme, Abi Morgan, Madeline Marcus, Lily Shipham, Rory Theodore and Josh Scanlon winning many medals between them across both age (U17, U19) & Open events;
- · Sam Johnson and our beach team Co-Captain Saxon Beale, having recovered from his earlier shoulder injury, being awarded joint winners of the Champion Male Beach Competitor;
- Numerous finals where Anglesea had 3 or 4 or even 5 of the top 6 place getters; and
- · We achieved many medallists and top-6 places in the 2km run and 2 x 1km relay events which went on to contribute significantly to Anglesea's club point-score







THE PASSING OF A CLUB LEGEND

In February of this year Anglesea SLSC lost one of its finest sons.

The sudden passing of Doug Solly (or 'Sol' as he was known to many) was a shock to everyone who knew him at our Club since becoming a qualified lifesaver in 1961. Originally nicknamed 'Ant', (as older members remembered him as a 'speck' on his board surfing the big sets


during the early days at Anglesea), Doug developed into one of the most competent 'surf savvy' members that our Club has of the surf was unprecedented as

was subsequently demonstrated by his ability to compete at the highest levels in a wide range of surf sports. Whether as a surf swimmer, a board paddler or a surfboat sweep, he was one of the best around. Many were able to benefit from

his advice and skills during his 60-year association with our Club, and more generally throughout his involvement in lifesaving at State and National levels.

His list of awards and achievements is too long to list in this testimonial. However, some of the more notable included numerous Club and State junior and senior championships in Surf and Belt Races, Long Board and Malibu Board, Taplin, and R&R. He was a member of the 1966 Junior R&R team which won the Australian SLSA Championship. In the early 1970s he shifted his focus to sweeping surfboats. He then became one of the Club's, and the State's, greatest $the\ best\ around.$ seen. His knowledge sweeps. Anyone who rowed with him developed respect for his surf knowledge and wave sense. He was masterful in managing the surf under any conditions and crews were in good hands when Doug was holding the sweep oar.

> Particular mention should also be made of his commitment to supporting females in surfboat rowing. He had great





success with his Master's ladies' crews culminating in winning a gold medal at the World Life Saving Championships held other dogs, and owners, for some light in Lorne in 2006.

Apart from his involvement in patrolling and competition Doug also served the Club in many Club roles including as Junior Captain, Senior Vice Captain, Gear Steward, Boat Captain, and Vice President. Doug was Manager of the ASLSC's Team to California in 1986.

Among his many achievements he was awarded ASLSC Life membership in 1986 followed by his induction into the Club's Hall of Fame in 2021. In 2005 he was also awarded Life Membership of the Victorian Surf Rowers League.

Doug's influence extended well beyond his involvement in our Club. He helped other Clubs as a mentor to young boat rowers and involved himself in a diverse range of other community activities. These included establishing a local swimming group and participated in the local dog walker's group (with his

constant canine mate, his Foxy 'Pete', occasionally terrorising some of the entertainment).

His popularity and the respect for him was demonstrated on March 14, the day of his memorial, which was attended by hundreds of people for the spreading of his ashes at Point Roadknight followed by a service and reception at the Surf Club later that day.

Doug was, indeed, a legend in the true sense of the word. In fact, an institution. His passing has left a large hole in Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club, the surf lifesaving movement, the Anglesea community, and the many friends who will miss his wisdom, and his dry sense of


CARL WARREN FIDLER 4/1/1936- 4/11/2023

Carl joined ASLSC with his twin brother Bruce and older brother John in 1952

Carl obtained his BM in 17/1/1953, number 43198, and then with Bruce travelled overseas. They answered a call at Australia House London, from Alan Kennedy of SLSA to be part of a team to go to Bude in Cornwall to give demonstrations and instruct people to become Life Savers.

Bude SLSC was soon formed and so Great Britain had their first Life Saving Club using Australian Surf Life Saving regulations and so would be able to attend the first International Carnival to be held at Torquay during the 1956 Olympics in Melbourne. On returning to Australia Carl & Bruce became very active Members at Anglesea SLSC competing in R&R and other events. In 1954/55 Carl was ASLSC Gear Steward, 1955/56 on gaining his Instructor's Certificate 1955/56 became Assistant Instructor, later Chief Instructor in 1961/62, 1962/63. Carl maintained his membership even though he later moved to Queensland. In 2003 he gained a 50 Year SLSA Service Award making him an Honorary Member, 2013 a 60 Year SLSA Service Award and at the recent AGM in 2023 was granted a 70 Year SLSA Service Award, our first member to do so.

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Notes to the Financial Statements

ANGLESEA SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC For the year ended 30 April 2024

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

In the trustee's opinion, the Incorporated Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist uses of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. This special purpose financial report has been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012.*

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

Inventories acquired at no cost or for nominal consideration are measured at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is initially recorded at the cost of acquisition less, if applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure that the carrying amount is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the utilisation of the assets and the subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in estimating recoverable amounts.

Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful debt has been created

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the association that remain unpaid at 30 April 2024. Trade payables are recognised at their transaction price. They are subject to normal credit terms and do not bear interest.

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FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

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Notes to the Financial Statements

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Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Revenue from the rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the services to customers.

Revenue from commissions is recognised upon delivery of services to customers.

Revenue from interest is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Revenue from dividends is recognised when the entity has a right to receive the dividend.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax

Transactions are recognised net of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST receivable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

Employee Provisions

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the association's obligation for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Current employee provisions are those which employees are currently entitled to and are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Non-current employee provisions are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. The expected future payments incorporate anticipated future wage and salary levels, experience or employee departures and periods of service, and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on high quality corporate bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the timing of the estimated future cash outflows.

Contributions are made by the entity to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred

Grants

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when the entity receives the grant, when it is probable that the entity will receive the economic benefits of the grant and the amount can be reliably measured.

If the grant has conditions attached which must be satisfied before the entity is eligible to receive the grant, the recognition of the revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

Where the entity incurs an obligation to deliver economic value back to the grant contributor, the transaction is considered a reciprocal transaction and the revenue is recognised as a liability in the balance sheet until the required service has been completed, otherwise the income is recognised on receipt.

Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for a nominal or zero value. These assets are recognised at their fair value on the date of acquisition in the balance sheet, with an equivalent amount of income recognised in the income statement.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Government Grants

Government grants received are recognised in the income statement when the entity receives the grant, when it is probable that the entity will receive the economic benefits of the grant and the amount can be reliably measured.

2. Resilience Fund

During the current financial year the club launched the 'Resilience Fund' with the ambition of raising a total of \$1,000,000 over 10 years.

The fund has been established to ensure the Club has the appropriate resources, infrastructure and equipment to keep our beaches safe. Additionally, the fund will support the Club to continue be a great community leader and to provide safe avenues for our membership to learn beach and life skills, compete and/or participate in the running of our Club.

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

In the trustee's opinion, the Foundation is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist uses of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. 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
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
