# President's Report

Deep breaths everyone..... Another life saving year has come to an end but fear not, another is just on the horizon.

I'd like to begin my brief report by thanking all our volunteers and staff for the work they have done for an amazing year. Yes, we've had some challenges, some more significant than others, but for the most part we've managed to maintain our drive and focus in delivering exceptional surf lifesaving services – protecting & strengthening our community.

There is no doubt that our challenges this year have centred on our sense of volunteering and community. Flowing from that, and with lethargy resulting from a couple of years of COVID, the impacts have been felt across the Club. We are, however, resilient and we are strong and we've not let the challenges weigh us down too much for too long.

This season has seen some terrific results for our major fundraisers. We were all blown away by the generosity of the community at the Annual DoorKnock and for those of you who made it down for the Rock2Ramp, I'm sure you'll agree that was, once again a great success. Moving forward we are going to be placing a greater emphasis on marketing the Club more broadly, to attract more donors and sponsors and I'm excited by and cannot wait to see the fruits of this work – to those who have offered to help out – thanks!

## Surfcam live at Anglesea

ANGLESEA has joined the list of popular beaches in the region with live surf cameras that can be accessed online.

Installed on the Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club watchtower, the cameras automatically pan from left to right on a loop taking in the surf conditions at Anglesea main beach and Point Roadnight and went live last week.

The cameras are the first step in a series of planned technological upgrades for the tower that has sat dormant for years.

Club president David Marsh said power has recently been restored and the next step is to purchase new radios to assist with the return of life guards.

"We are going to be using the lookout tower again next season and we're in talks with Alcoa to help us support that," he said. "They built it for us, we want to continue to partner with them."

Mr Marsh said it will be a valuable asset to the community when it is again patrolled, given its vantage point atop the cliffs.

"On my first watch here as a 13-year-old I saw a shark," Mr Marsh said while standing on the tower deck.

"There was a camera there in the past, but that was years ago, this is much newer technology."

Mr Marsh noted that while the cameras don't zoom, and are primarily for reviewing surf conditions, in the event of an emergency authorities will be able to log in remotely and use them.

"For our club, it allows us to assess surf conditions prior to setting up for patrols," he said.

"We would really encourage people to log in and look at conditions before they come down."

The cameras can be freely accessed three times a week, or more regularly via a paid subscription at [www.surfcams.com.au](http://www.surfcams.com.au)





which is an astounding effort and one that will surely go down as one of Anglesea SLSC's greatest efforts!

# Vice President - Operations

- Joining various Board sub-committees; and
- Providing other forms of voluntary service across the Club's Operations portfolio.

The efforts of our volunteers, employees, donors and service providers placed us in a sound position at 30 April, 2022.

Volunteering is the life blood of our surf club and I thank all of you who were able to step up during the year. For those of you who were unable to assist during the year, I implore you to come forward and help out in the years ahead. Your contributions, no matter how large or small, will benefit all our members, whilst also strengthen Anglesea's Club culture.

## Administration

The administration team plays a key role in the Club's Operations. They provide us with a wide range of services and have worked diligently during testing times. Rob Murray, the Director of Administration, provides a detailed review of the year in the Administration Report however, I would like to take this opportunity to thank Jen McIntyre (who departed in November 2021), Raylene Fordham, Jaci Chin-Jewson and Jennie Mauderer for their hard work and commitment. Their efforts ensured that Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club met its fiduciary obligations and continued to provide a wide range of member and community services.

This year the Club introduced 'A Line In The Sand' as a means to engage its members and disseminate relevant information in a timely manner. The Club also attempted to increase its social media presence.

I am pleased to say that both these initiatives, which have been headed up by Jaci Chin-Jewson, have been well received by our members.

I expect that many of you have met Raylene Fordham. She joined ASLSC in November 2021, as Club Manager, and hit the ground running. Raylene is readily accessible to assist our members on a wide range of Club issues and has worked tirelessly in support of the Rock2Ramp, demonstrated leadership in the Club's wider community engagement, is actively working with all Directors across the Operations portfolio, and has been the focal point for our hospitality and events space offerings.

My thanks also go out to Jennie Mauderer. Jennie possesses a 'user friendly' demeanour and assists us during the peak season in areas such as Nipper and Silver Salties administration, support of our volunteers in the Club Shop and ensuring that Patrol hours are correctly recorded in Surf Guard.

## Finance

I am sad to advise you that Richard Carr will be standing down as ASLSC's Finance Director at the Club's 2022 Annual General Meeting. Richard is a long-standing Club member who has provided us with prudent guidance and immeasurable pro-bono service over the last decade. The following points are not exhaustive but do note some of Richard's contribution to the Club:

- Completing the Club's financial statements for the last 10 years;
- Serving as an ASLSC Board member for eight years;
- Preparing Annual Reports for the Club's auditor;
- Setting up the Club's financial reporting on the Xero accounting software;
- Setting up financial reporting for individual departments within the Club;
- Overseeing the budget for the new building
- Managing the Club's cash flow during the construction of the new Clubhouse; and
- Negotiating favourable key terms for the Club's \$1.3 million building loan with the Bendigo Bank.

Richard's contribution to the Club also extends to pro-bono





services that have been provided for many years by his accounting and advisory firm, WestCarr & Harvey. These pro-bono services have saved the Club many tens of thousands of dollars. I would also like to acknowledge and thank Mark Griffin, one of the WestCarr & Harvey team, for his ongoing assistance to our administration staff. Mark has always been available to advise us on book-keeping and accounting matters, various business issues such as wages and GST, and queries relating to Xero accounting software.

On behalf of the Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club, I wholeheartedly thank Richard, Mark, and WestCarr & Harvey for their very significant contribution to Club over many years.

### **Facilities**

My thanks go out to Tim Bone, who resigned from the Board during November 2021. Tim was the Facilities Director during the construction and onboarding of the new Clubhouse, and was also an active member of the House Committee.

We are fortunate that Peter Williams agreed to take on the role of Facilities Director following Tim's departure. Peter's knowledge of the Club and its members, the inner workings of the new and old Clubhouses and his ability to gather a team of eager workers has placed him well to deal with the ongoing management and maintenance of our facilities.

Peter's Facilities report identifies several people that have assisted him over the year, namely Matt Taylor, Graeme Weber, Mike Martin, Geoff Elliott and Mick McConnell, and I echo his thanks to all of them. Going forward, I am hoping that we can draw even more volunteers from the Club's membership to help with the upkeep of the facilities that we are so lucky to possess.

### **Marketing**

Jonathan (Jono) Clark advised the Board that he will not be seeking a further term and will step down as Director of Marketing at the 2022 Annual General Meeting. Jono has been instrumental in setting up the Club Shop and the selection of merchandise that it offers. We are appreciative of Jono's efforts and acknowledge that we will sadly miss his retail and brand experience. Nevertheless, we are grateful that Jono leaves the Club in a strong position to move forward in the merchandise space.

A big thank you also goes out to Helen Lee-Williams, Wendy Fox, Jan Simpson and Lyn Elliott. Their voluntary support in the Club Shop underpinned a profit of approximately [\$27,000].

As we look to the future, the Board recognises the need to identify additional sources of funding, which builds on the Rock2Ramp, Annual DoorKnock, Golf Day, Hospitality and Event offerings, and the Club Shop. In light of this, we are keen to draw on the expertise of Club members who have marketing experience to assist us in attracting additional donors and sponsors in the coming years.

### **Food and Beverage**

Wyuna commenced service on 10 September 2021. However, the ensuing spring and summer trading period was extremely difficult due to COVID-19 lock downs, restricted trading space, vaccination requirements and severe staff shortages. The Club acknowledges and thanks Wyuna, particularly Tom McGrath, Tom Lapenas and Simon Paramonov, as they all made personal sacrifices to make sure the Club hospitality remained open and was kept running throughout the season. That also included the introduction of a new summer menu at short notice when significant skilled staff shortages arose across the Victorian hospitality industry.

We are fortunate that the ASLSC House Committee continued to operate throughout the year. The House Committee

During the year the House Committee commenced a formal public tender process for the future running of hospitality at the ASLSC. Tender documents were sent out to a list of interested operators on 25 October 2021 and subsequently publicly advertised in local newspapers during November.

A Selection Committee, which included Rowena Coutts (chair), Peter Yates, Raylene Fordham and Noel Langford, was formed after the tender closed on 17 December 2021. That group met in January 2022 and, having identified the preferred tenderer, commenced negotiations.

A new Sub-Lease has been finalised with the operator and includes a commencement date of 1st September 2022. We are still awaiting the Great Ocean Road Coast & Parks Authority to sign the Sublease.

Please join me in thanking the Club members who have contributed their time and expertise on the House Committee. In particular, I would like to thank Rowena Coutts, who has concluded her involvement with the House Committee, for her support and outstanding leadership.

### **Governance Committee**

The Governance Committee was reformed at the start of the year, and I am pleased that it includes the following Club members:

During the year the Governance Committee reviewed the Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Constitution and proposed a set of draft amendments. The proposed amendments to the Constitution have been shared with external legal counsel and Life Saving Victoria. The Governance Committee will consider the feedback that it receives from these parties before a revised draft is taken to the Board.

We intend to engage broadly with ASLSC members to ensure that they are aware of what amendments are being proposed and the reasoning supporting the changes. This engagement will also provide an opportunity for us to obtain direct feedback from our members.

Ultimately, the Board will need to decide what amendments it supports being brought forward for members to vote on.

# Vice President - Lifesaving

The season was again subjected to interruptions arising from the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. This severely affected patrol attendance and competition but the Club managed to meet its obligations to provide a safe beach environment for the public.

## Nippers & Starfish

Despite an uncertain start, the Club managed to complete a successful Nippers program with almost 500 participants involved. Particular thanks to Matt Keenan as Big Nipper and Matilda Cameron as Starfish Nipper Coordinator for their organisation and supervision of these programs.

## Patrolling

Our primary responsibility is patrolling, and it was pleasing to see that despite the impact of COVID-19 on active member availability, our obligations were largely met. As was the case with many Clubs during this period, there were periods when we could not fulfil our commitments to providing support for LSV requirements and events and this remains an ongoing challenge. While we attracted a significant number of new members into this season's Bronze qualification program (a key prerequisite for patrolling) greater attention will be directed to exploring processes to improve transition of new bronze holders into Anglesea's patrolling structure and also into competition. Consequently, a complete review of the Club's pathways into patrolling and competition will be conducted prior to the new season to determine where improvements might be made.



## Membership Development

Member retention as well as member attraction will require greater attention if we are to maintain active membership and patrol numbers. While total membership has increased significantly this has been primarily in the Associate Member category while Active Members have remained static for several years. On the positive side, Junior Member numbers have been positive, but the challenge is to keep them involved in the Club. The above-mentioned 'Pathways from Bronze to Patrolling and Competition' review will play a vital role in this process.

## Involvement in Surf Sports and Competition

We strive to encourage new members to become 'active' members. This of course, seeks commitment from them to patrol our beach. However, a major pillar of the Club is its involvement in competition. New patrolling members can participate in all areas of surf sports, from running, swimming, board and ski disciplines, Rescue & Resuscitation (R&R), surfboats and IRBs. These activities should be seen as an integral part of the lifesaving experience. Members who pursue surf competition develop surf awareness and skills which contribute directly to their effectiveness as surf lifesavers and to their value to the Club and the community in surf rescue.

It is pleasing to report on the Club's renewed success in local and national competition. After a disrupted commencement to the competition season including cancellation of Anglesea's local Carnival, we were able to hold a successful surfboat-only carnival at Anglesea where our crews all performed very well.

Anglesea subsequently performed well across all competition disciplines at the LSV Victorian Championships.

Details of individual Surf Sports performances throughout the season will be included in other sections of the Annual Report.

## SLSA Australian Championships Gold Coast April 2022

Special mention should be made of Anglesea's performance



at the Australian SLSC Championships held on the Gold Coast in April. More than 300 Clubs and 7,500 competitors attended the Championships. This was arguably our Club's best results for many years.

Congratulations to our R&R teams who won an unprecedented 3 gold medals, our beach team with many finals' performances, and particularly by our younger members, as well as our three surfboat crews which competed in finals. A fantastic result for Anglesea.

Mention must be made of the contribution by our coaches and support staff, and singling Scott Hastie's contribution providing Anglesea's IRB support during the week. Given the hazardous conditions and dangerous surf, his role was particularly important.

Our campaign was capped off with a team dinner which enabled all 47 competition team members to get together for a great social event to celebrate an exceptional Aussies performance.

I would like to emphasise that while we all like to be winners, our main objective is to encourage participation. We invite all members who would like to come and try our various surf sports to do so and get involved. Not only is there development of fitness and surf skills, but involvement in competition fosters camaraderie, enjoyment, and building of personal friendships among members.

Finally, I want to make special mention of those unsung heroes, the coaches and support staff who work tirelessly as volunteers to develop skills and fitness to ensure our members are 'match fit'. We also need to acknowledge the parents who play a vital role in transporting our competitors to events.

I'd like to acknowledge several of these - Christine Cardwell deserves special recognition as coach of the R&R section together with Sai Dale as team manager; Adam Martin who managed the beach section supported by coaches Peter Van Miltenburg and John Baldock; and Scott Tannahill in managing, mentoring, coaching and sweeping our three boat crews. The Club is fortunate to have such a dedicated and highly skilled coaching and support team.

# Facilities Report

As the former chair of the Building Redevelopment Committee I suppose it was almost inevitable that, after the resignation of Tim Bone due to work commitments, I ended up as Facilities Director for a year or two!

With the advent of the new facility much of the past year has been focussed on understanding what we have and how best to maintain it. We have made significant progress in developing a more systematic approach to facility management and maintenance and now have in place a range of service contracts that ensure that equipment such as the lift, air-con units and fire monitoring system are regularly checked and serviced. This ensures that we meet our legal obligations in respect to management of our essential safety measures.

There is also a range of work required in the Ray Marsh Room building over the next few years to bring it to contemporary standards. In August and September 2021 we took advantage of the restaurant's winter closure to insulate the RMR ceiling and extensive works to replace all the windows and fire rate the columns in the external walls which took place straight after Easter 2022.

One small bonus this year was the replacement of the non-

functioning surf cameras, with two new surf cams on the old patrol tower by Surfline so we now have power to that facility again. It is intended to slowly bring the tower back into a safe and usable state.

We are lucky to have the facility we do and I would like to thank Matt Taylor, Graeme Weber, Mike Martin, Geoff Elliott and Mick McConnell who all give of their time and expertise to keep both the building and the grounds in great shape. The appointment of Raylene Fordham as the Club Manager has also assisted in ensuring we remain on top of issues as they arise and the support I get from Jaci and Jenni in the office makes my role that much easier.

It would also be remiss not to thank Tom Lapenas and his team at Wyuna as they have worked closely with us to ensure the facility is maintained and available as required to service both members and the wider community.

# Rescue Services Report

Following two years of a pandemic, Anglesea saw a surge in activity on our beach and within our community. What a relief to be able to enjoy ourselves again on the beach!

With the return of holidaymakers, Club programs and an uninterrupted season our members continue to volunteer and support our Life Saving Victoria requirements of patrolling our beach. This season we collectively completed 4,802 hours of patrol service ensuring that everyone was safe while in the water at Anglesea. Below statistics also demonstrate the incredible work our community does each season to ensure all visitors are safe and return home at the end of each visit to Anglesea:

Without the ongoing support of key ASLSC members our equipment and behind the scenes planning would not be possible. It takes a team to ensure the Club are prepared each for a season and on call 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Thank you to our key Rescue Services members including:

- James Betson (IRB Manager) who puts in many unseen hours looking after our IRB's and motors. He ensured all our equipment is repaired and serviced prior to the start of the season and tries to stay on top of these as the season progresses. Without James, we would not be able to put IRBs in the water each weekend. We would not be running so many programs or offering water safety at Nippers, carnivals or the Rock2Ramp. His work is understated by many but so important for the Club. Thank you, James.
- Matt Anghie (First Aid Officer) personally checks, maintains, and restocks all the first aid gear prior to the annual gear inspector and regularly re-orders consumables as they are used. This role is such a significant one within the Club as Matt is required to have all our first aid equipment tested, maintained and in working condition to ensure when it is needed it is ready to go, whether it's for Nippers, Training, Patrols, Rock2Ramp or our call out service. Staying on top of such a large amount of gear is not easy and takes many unseen hours to maintain. Thank you for your time and commitment Matt.

# Youth Development Report

It was a season to reflect on the journey that the Starfish Nipper Program has made under the influence of co-founder Janet Jones OAM who unfortunately passed away in 2021. She, along with Naomi Symington, launched the Starfish Nipper Program at Anglesea in 2011 so that children of all abilities would have an opportunity to participate in nippers. The program has since expanded to 41 clubs around Australia and one in France and has been a pioneer for inclusion in surf lifesaving. Starfish coordinator Matilda Cameron along with all of the trainers and families provided a fantastic program for almost 20 Starfish this season, and the ongoing success of the program and the impact it has had on past, current and future individuals and families is a fitting legacy to Janet.

A highly successful nipper Summer Program was completed due to the efforts of our volunteer age-group managers and water safety personnel, Big Nipper Matt Keenan, set-up/pack down leader Patrick Haseler, water safety coordinator Ben Gilbert and COVID officer James Pollard. This season is the last for Big Nipper Matt Keenan and I would personally like to congratulate and thank him for the fantastic job he has done guiding the program through some challenging years with the clubhouse re-build and the effects of COVID restrictions. Many of the changes implemented in the past 3 years have resulted in improved efficiency and enhancements which we will carry forward into future seasons. Patrick Haseler will graduate to become the new Big Nipper for the upcoming season, and I am sure his enthusiasm, knowledge of the role, and great relationships with many club members will ensure that the Summer Program continues to be a true highlight for the both the club and nipper season.

This year, in a first for the Summer Program, Matt Montemurro from the Marine Mammal Foundation attended one of our sessions and talked with a number of age groups on the

variety of marine mammals encountered locally, and the consequences of litter entering our aquatic environments. In a very interactive and engaging format, the nippers also learned about the Burrunan dolphin, a new and separate species of dolphin native only to Port Philip Bay and the Gippsland Lakes that was first recognised as being unique in 2011. The visit prompted lots of questions and follow up opportunities and we look forward to expanding Matt's contribution in the upcoming season.

Now into its second year, our local Nipper program was conducted over the shoulder season in December, February and March. Attended by 30+ children, the program provides additional ways for local children and their parents to engage with the club, improve their confidence and skills in the water, and strengthen the club community. Laura Boyer, Adam Saw, Sam Edwards, Andy Gooday, Stuart Charles and Michelle Rooney coordinated the program with assistance from Trina Porter, Peter Williams and a host of parents and siblings who assisted with water safety, first aid and set up. A very special mention must be made of new SRC recipients Ava Saw and Georgie Cole who provided water safety at each session. Well done and thank you Ava and Georgie!

At the Victorian Nipper Titles at Lorne on 25-27 February, coaches Ivor Morgan, Naantali Marshall, Matt Taylor and I were really proud of the way our nippers competed in the challenging conditions. With a team of just 40 competitors, Anglesea managed to come second overall in the point score. This was a fantastic result and something that every competitor, parent and coach of the team can be exceptionally proud of. To put this into context, the clubs that finished first and third had 5- and 3-fold as many competitors as Anglesea.

Central to this success was a core group of 20-30 competitors who regularly attended our Club Training Days (CTDs) throughout the year and over summer. In these sessions



the focus is on having fun, developing essential surf and beach skills, building fitness and strengthening friendships. Additional nippers were identified through the results at our club championships and were critical in making up teams and contributing to the point score. There are some great junior competitors coming through who now seem to be immersed in the green and white and will be more fully involved over the next season. You will find the results later in the Annual Report, which demonstrates great depth across the age groups and genders. I would especially like to point out Tessa Parr, Ella Robertson, Kate Taylor, Eliza Parr and Summer Morgan for their excellent results in team and individual events, as well as Jasmine Hume for winning the Life Saving Victoria Fred Westfield Medal for highest overall individual point score for U13 competitors.

At the Youth/Senior Victorian championships held in Warrnambool on 11-13 March, Chloe Fitzgerald won gold in the U14 Tube Rescue and silver in the Surf Race. Ellie Morgan came third in the U14 Beach Flags and 7th in the Board Race. Chloe came 5th in the iron and Ellie 7th. Both Chloe and Ellie are products of our nipper program and regularly attend the CTDs with the rest of their teammates. At the Australian Titles in North Kirra in early April, they were joined by U13 competitors Emily Thomas and Jasmine Hume in a combined U13/U14 age group for the first time. The girls made a number of semi-finals in both individual and team water events including the surf teams and board teams. Ellie and Jasmine came fifth in the 2x1km run, Chloe came seventh in the 2km swim and Jas came eighth in the U13 2km beach run. We hope that the Australian Titles experience and team camaraderie will continue to bond this group together.

Ellie Morgan and Chloe Fitzgerald attended the Champion Lifesaver Day at Life Saving Victoria. Here, youth from different clubs come together to establish friendships and expand their perspective by exposing them to different areas of surf lifesaving. The day included a competition named after former Anglesea and LSV President Mike Martin, testing each participants lifesaving skills, knowledge and fitness. A huge congratulations to Ellie for winning the competition which is well deserved given the effort Ellie consistently applies in training and the SRC course this year.

Anglesea had Fitzwilliam Gilbert, Isabella Khalil and Jasmine Hume attend the U13 Development Camp, and Freya Byrne

attended the U15 Camp. Very positive feedback was received from each of them. These camps are a great opportunity to develop leadership, interpersonal and teamwork skills while also broadening their understanding of lifesaving. They are open to all members, and I would encourage a wide range of club members to nominate for the 2023 camps as the experience on each camp is consistently rated as excellent.

The amazing Supporters Group once again provided funding for the Youth area of the club in a number of ways this season, supporting the Starfish Nipper Program through the Hilton White Estate, the competition team and Summer Program through the Gladys Stott Estate, and the local nipper program with training and operation expenses. This group continues to provide valuable and much appreciated financial, hands-on and advisory support including through the organisation of the Family Night, setting up/packing up at events, and running some much-loved BBQs. They are keen to broaden their membership and want to hear from others who may be interested in assisting. I would also like to thank parents Fioran Bourke and Susan Ruddock for helping the club meet its nipper competition water safety obligations by completing their Bronze Medallions and for Fioran for also completing her officials qualification to assist with carnival duties across the season. Similarly, we have a small but dedicated group of IRB drivers and crew assist us during the Summer Program and at competitions and I would like to thank Bengt Carlson, Scott Hastie and Stephen Christofi for their help in this regard.

The 2022/23 season will be upon us shortly and we have much to look forward to – Club Training Days, the biennial Rip Swim, a Gap year program for U14s between SRC and Bronze, and a host of competition opportunities as well as the usual Summer, Shoulder and Starfish Nipper programs. # Dolphins Report

The competition nippers aged 8-13 (Dolphins) had an outstanding season which was capped off with placing 2nd overall at the Victorian Junior Lifesaving Championships held in Lorne. This was a remarkable achievement considering that we only had 40 competitors compared to the winning club Ocean Grove with almost 200 competitors and Torquay with around 100 competitors who placed third.

We have a core group of nippers who attend regular training and have developed amazing skills and resilience in a variety of conditions. The State Championships presented competitors with challenging conditions and that core group who attended regular training sessions and worked hard were rewarded for their efforts.

This core group is slowly growing and going into next season we have another age group of nippers transitioning into the youth area. The challenge for us is that we have a predominantly Melbourne/holiday-based membership unlike other clubs like Torquay and Jan Juc who have a large local membership enabling them to enjoy a larger competition team.

In addition to the Junior success, we had a small team of this core training group attend their first Australian Titles, our two youth competitors plus two of our U13 nippers (this is the first year U13's have been included in the Australian Titles). These four competitors had some great results and experiences coming home with wonderful memories eager to continue on. We look forward to growing this team further over the coming years from our graduating nippers.

Off the back of this success, we need to work hard at retaining these competitors through youth to senior pathways. This is not only a challenge for our Club but a national issue with the drop off from nippers through to youth.

Sam Hume has worked hard in this space as the Youth Development Director to offer opportunities for our youth competitors to keep them engaged for example providing events like the Rip Swim.

In an effort to further extend the training we offer we have rebranded 'Dolphin' training sessions to 'Club Training Day's' (CTD) to encourage a whole club approach to training and mentoring but to date this hasn't been embraced as much as we would like, with only two youth members consistently attending with Ross Peasnell assisting, this has been much appreciated.

Coaches Sam Hume, Naantali Marshall, Matt Taylor and myself have really enjoyed giving the nippers the opportunities that we were given in our earlier days and would love for more of the past senior competitors to come, join in and build on the foundation we have in place. Our focus is creating a program where kids have the opportunity to create friendships as well as develop the skills to both compete and provide valuable lifesaving skills to assist in protecting our community in the future and become a part of Anglesea SLSC for life.

We would like to thank the Supporters Group for assisting with much needed equipment purchases for this young group of kids and future lifesavers of Anglesea.

# R&R Section Report

Next up was Georgie Gore, who put in an amazing first swim at a competitive level and showed how much determination she was bringing to the fold. Right from

the start, we knew we were in for a strong showing at Aussies against the stronger NSW clubs, but there was work to be done.

Local carnivals saw 'regular' numbers down as well, so we did not see a lot of direct competition from other Victorian clubs, but this did not deter our group who did their very best at these carnivals as well as at State Championships held at Warrnambool.

When Aussies 2022 was confirmed as being relocated from Scarborough, Perth to Gold Coast we laid down plans to take our (3) teams and put up a strong showing. History now shows that we had an amazing championship (held at Kirra Beach in what was considered 'challenging' conditions). Our competitors were honestly disappointed at this decision, but as true professionals, they took this on the chin and went on to win all (3) gold medals that our teams were contesting.

The QR code also enabled us to continue to raise funds after the DoorKnock by placing donation request signage around the Club, on the ramp and at the Rock2Ramp swim event. The total raised from this year's event was just over \$38,000, a record amount for this event.

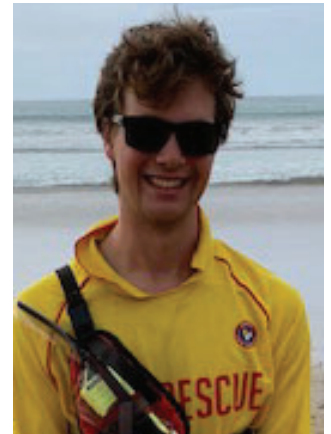
Some highlights for the season include:

# Marketing Report

The 2021/22 season was the first time in many years that the Club shop was staffed entirely by volunteers. I would like to acknowledge the engagement & contribution of everyone who assisted, notably Helen Lee-Williams, Wendy Fox, Jan Simpson & Lyn Elliott. It was a great effort from the Shop team & the storeroom has never looked so good! The shop traded well in a COVID affected season delivering sales of \$58k. Whilst this was 15% down on last year, the season ended prematurely on 10 January due to the OMICRON surge. It was however a far more profitable season, driven partly by the wage savings but largely by the improved assortment. A focus on core product supported by seasonal newness saw gross margin lift significantly to 46%. The prior year margin was 26%. We managed supply chain disruption effectively to deliver all merchandise on time. We expect the shop to continue to grow. One of the learnings from this season is that we need to be open for Christmas trade, so expect to hear from us prior to Santa's arrival!

We have had numerous articles in the local media with topics covering Rock2Ramp, Patrols, Competitors, Member Activities & Achievements, Carnivals & so many more...

Thanks to community liaising via Raylene Fordham we have been able to become a more visible entity within the local community. We were invited to attend the opening of the War Memorial with ASLSC President, David Marsh being a Flag raiser. We also supplied vehicle support for the ANZAC Day parade.

We made the front page of Anglesea's NewsAngle Autumn Edition 2022, the local quarterly magazine, with a story about

our local Shoulder Season Nipper Program. We also had a lot of community support for the Club fundraising event, 60's Night. Thanks to Dennis Couch and Jen McIntyre for the inception of this fundraiser and Raylene Fordham who advertised our event in the Anglesea Community E-Newsletter and displayed posters in Anglesea store windows and around the Club.

A Line in the Sand – Our weekly E-Newsletter is produced by Jaci Chin-Jewson and distributed to all Club members. More than half of our members read the newsletter each week.

Jaci also heads our social media team. Social media is an excellent communication tool for real time news such as competition results, member activities and achievements and advertising our Club events and fundraisers. Social media is about connecting with our members and the community and allows us to hear what people have to say and helps us support our sponsors. We always try to be relevant and engaging.

The Clubs Facebook page has 2,690 followers with our highest post engagement reaching 1.3k people.

The Clubs Instagram account has 1,890 followers with its highest single post engagement being 212 'likes'.

Our estimated audience reach on social media is 17 – 21 million.

# Hall of Fame

The Anglesea SLSC Surf Sports Hall of Fame was developed in 2012 in conjunction with the 60th Year celebrations. I would just like to acknowledge the current cohort; Bobby King, Stuart Fox, Shane Edmonds, Abby Lewtas, the 1960's Senior R&R Team and our Legends John Worrell, Peter Van Miltenburg, Warren Clarke, Peter White, Bruce 'Smoothy' Thompson, Vanessa Jacobs, John Baldock and the 1960's Junior R&R Team.

Early 2021 we called for nominations from the members for a new class of inductees.

The following criteria was observed when being assessed by the Hall of Fame advisory committee.

- Recognising, preserving, and honouring:
- athletes/teams
- coaches and
- contributors to the Surf Sports program at Anglesea SLSC
- Sustained excellence and significant accomplishments at Club, State, National and international level
- Sportsmanship – Integrity – Character
- Financial member for at least 7 years
- Maximum 5 inductees per year + 1 Legend

I would like to thank those who nominated and the members of the advisory committee.

I would also like to thank our resident historian Prue Weber for her dossier of statistics on each inductee. Always very thorough with the detail.

This year we inducted four members and elevated one of the existing cohort to Legend status at the Club Presentation evening in April and they included:

**Naantali Marshall** joined Anglesea SLSC in 2003/2004. Prior to re-joining Anglesea (did Nippers at Anglesea), Naantali had already had a very successful career in the Sport. However, the HoF committee have purely assessed her achievements as an Anglesea member.

Naantali re-defined professionalism in what was still a semi-professional sport and was a pioneer for future Victorian athletes wanting to compete at the highest level in Surf Life Saving. As a gifted swimmer Naantali worked on her craft (literally) to become an elite Ironwoman.

Whilst a newly eligible master's competitor in the 2004/2005 season, Naantali was selected to represent her State at the Interstate Open Competition and led that team with class. This was followed up with a Silver at the Open Australian Titles in the Board Rescue with her long-time partner Julia Cullity. A massive result for the two, with ever changing conditions playing havoc during the event.

Not to be outdone the following year Naantali steps up again and takes home 9 Gold in her age group at the World Masters Titles in Lorne, enroute to an individual Silver Medal in the Open Women's Board Race at the 2006 Aussie's. Some may say her finest individual result at an Australian Titles.

**Tim Williams** joined Anglesea in the 1995/96 season, as part of Peter Van Miltenburg's beach recruiting system. Whilst a talented sprinter on the track, in the early days Tim was hampered by injury and found Beach Sprinting as an outlet to build his body into what would be an outstanding career both

on and off the sand. Tim's Junior Beach Sprinting career for Anglesea was dominant, 2 Junior Australian Beach Sprint Titles in consecutive years, was supplemented by 2 Junior Australian Beach Relay Titles at a time when Anglesea regularly made finals with multiple teams. As a U/16 athlete in the 1997/98 season Tim won both the Cadet and Open Beach Sprint at the Victorian State Titles, competing against seasoned veterans and men twice his age. A feat rarely seen in Surf Lifesaving.

However, the crowning glory in his Anglesea Beach Sprinting career was his Open Men's Beach Sprint Title at the 2005 Australian Titles. Running out of the top lanes at Kurrawa, Tim powered home in a masterful performance to secure the win. He joins a select few from Anglesea and fellow inductees as an individual Open Australian Titles Gold Medallist.

**Julia Cullity** joined Anglesea SLSC in the 2003/2004 season. Coming across from Torquay to become a Slimer was a tough decision, as Jules had been an integral part of that club for many years. However, at Anglesea Jules was keen to carve out another impressive list of achievements, starting with her partner in crime and Board Rescue teammate Naantali. Winning a Silver Medal in the Open Women's Board Rescue at the Australian Titles was a fair start. There was no doubting Jules' ability to have a crack at things and when she did, she inevitably excelled at it. Having won State, Australian and World Title medals across Water, Beach, IRB, and Lifesaving categories. She is the epitome of a lifesaver and a multi-dimensional one at that. We are lucky to have Jules as a member.

**Claire Penney** (nee Lewtas) As a local Anglesea member Claire was a driving force of the Anglesea Beach Team in the early 2000's. Coming up through the Nipper ranks Claire broke onto the Senior competition scene as a very young U/16 competitor by winning the State Beach Sprint Title in 2000, within 2-years she would be an U/16 Australian Beach Sprint Champion. Claire would then repeat that effort the following year by becoming the U19 Australian Beach Sprint Champion. In the period between 2002 to 2005 Claire would win 7 Australian Titles medals across Beach Sprint, Relays and Flags. Claire dominated Victorian carnivals and State Titles, twice doubling up to win the Junior and Senior Sprint Titles in consecutive years. Taking a break from Surf Sports in the late 2000's, Claire came back with a vengeance in the 2011 and 2012 seasons winning two more Australian Titles medals, including a Bronze in the Open Women's Beach Flags and a clean sweep of the Open Women's beach events at the State Titles. Affectionately referred to as the smiling assassin, Claire was a fierce, big-time competitor and a great example of an athlete determined to succeed no matter the obstacles.

Well done to all inductees. Thank you to the Board for the support around the Hall of Fame concept since 2012.

**Ronald George White 23 January 1929 – 8 September 2021**

Ron and Mardi joined the Anglesea SLSC as a family in January 1980 with their children Katie, Andrew and Sarah-Jo. They found lifesaving similar to Ron's long-time passions of the scouting movement and Freemasons.

Ron often promoted Surf Life Saving as an organisation that serves the community with its strong social and skill development, as well as embracing the organisation's family environment.

With Katie (Bronze January. 1984) joining R&R and Andrew (Bronze 1981) a board and beach competitor and Sarah-Jo (Nipperette, Bronze 1996), Ron searched for a role in the club that was more in the background, bingo..... 'fundraising'.

Ron had the gift of the gab. He could talk the most resistant donor around in his fundraising drives with his speeches on supporting surf lifesaving and the great work of the Anglesea SLSC.

The more resistant a potential sponsor, the more Ron would step up to the challenge. Not many got away from the 'Great White Bite'. Over the years Ron achieved thousands of dollars for the Club in his fundraising drives.

Around the time the White family joined the club, the SLSC introduced a female under 15 R&R competition. Katie White, with Caitlin Lund, Sue-Ellen McIntosh, Robena Howe, and Jane Manning were keen to enter competition and formed a club team. It was a period when the club was coming to grips with embracing women's competition and they were struggling - so Paul Lacey took the team under his wing as coach. The team, once established, would compete in mixed and open events at Vic's and Aussies. Ron was so proud of the team's participation and achievements for Anglesea SLSC, he put the 'bite' on The Body Shop for a new club reel. Ron was off on another mission chasing a Sportsgirl uniform.

Ron was acknowledged by the club for his dedication to fundraising, particularly golf day prizes, and was awarded club honorary membership. He received his SLSC 25 years Long Service Award in 2009.

One of Ron's greatest joys was having a beer at the club. He would work the room and ask how members and their families were going, always with a congratulations on achievements and milestones.

Ron was such a strong advocate of surf lifesaving being a great environment for youth and the development of exemplary Australians.

There was never an idle moment in Janet's life and she was involved in many aspects of Club activities, even participating in Women's Surf Boat rowing for several years. When Syd was on duty he was absolutely reliable, observant, cool and calm and always ended with a quip that either added a smile to my face or made me contemplate Syd's comment.

I worked on many rescues and situations with Syd on duty in the tower. Syd had a great understanding of the risks we faced, and I suspect his teaching skills and innate skill in understanding people contributed to his insight into the required action.

When he was in the tower it was as good as having an additional 2 or 3 experience life savers on the beach. He was not just controlling the radio or observing the beach he was our eye in the sky helping manage the beach with instructions and suggestions and always pre-emptive.

For the 1984, 1985 and 1986 seasons our patrol secured the best patrol competition for the club. Syds contribution was paramount in delivering positive outcomes on the beach which led to our team's recognition over these 3 years.

### Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Inc For the year ended 30 April 2022

#### 1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

In the trustee's opinion, the Incorporated Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. This special purpose financial report has been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of *AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements*, *AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows*, *AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors* and *AASB1054 Australian Additional Disclosures*.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

#### Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

#### Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

Inventories acquired at no cost or for nominal consideration are measured at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition.

#### Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is initially recorded at the cost of acquisition less, if applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure that the carrying amount is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the utilisation of the assets and the subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in estimating recoverable amounts.

#### Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful debt has been created.

#### Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the association that remain unpaid at 30 April 2022. Trade payables are recognised at their transaction price. They are subject to normal credit terms and do not bear interest.

#### Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

#### Revenue Recognition

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Revenue from the rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the services to customers.

Revenue from commissions is recognised upon delivery of services to customers.  
Revenue from interest is recognised using the effective interest rate method.  
Revenue from dividends is recognised when the entity has a right to receive the dividend.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

## Goods and Services Tax

Transactions are recognised net of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

## Employee Provisions

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the association's obligation for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Current employee provisions are those which employees are currently entitled to and are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Non-current employee provisions are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. The expected future payments incorporate anticipated future wage and salary levels, experience or employee departures and periods of service, and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on high quality corporate bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the timing of the estimated future cash outflows.

The association's obligations for current employee benefits such as wages, salaries and sick leave are recognised as part of accounts payable and other payables in the statement of financial position.

Contributions are made by the entity to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

## Grants

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when the entity receives the grant, when it is probable that the entity will receive the economic benefits of the grant and the amount can be reliably measured.

If the grant has conditions attached which must be satisfied before the entity is eligible to receive the grant, the recognition of the revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

Where the entity incurs an obligation to deliver economic value back to the grant contributor, the transaction is considered a reciprocal transaction and the revenue is recognised as a liability in the balance sheet until the required service has been completed, otherwise the income is recognised on receipt.

Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for a nominal or zero value. These assets are recognised at their fair value on the date of acquisition in the balance sheet, with an equivalent amount of income recognised in the income statement.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

## Government Grants

Government grants received are recognised in the income statement when the entity receives the grant, when it is probable that the entity will receive the economic benefits of the grant and the amount can be reliably measured.

#### **Qualified Opinion**

### **Report on the Audit of the Financial Report**

#### **Unmodified Opinion**

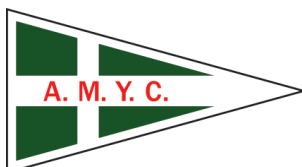
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
