It has been great to see how well the new building has stood up to intensive use over its first summer season. As to be expected there are a few issues we will need to address over the next few months but other than a couple of water leaks none are significant.

Members may also be aware that there are a number of upgrades required to the older building that have been identified by the building surveyors. These include replacing the windows and reinsulating the ceiling to improve energy efficiency and improving the fire rating of support columns. The club has received a \$300K state government grant towards these works but it appears that, as a result of expected delays in getting the necessary permits, these works will not take place until 2022. Once completed these works will go some way in better integrating the look and feel of the two buildings.


