What a year it has been for our lifesaving operations and our Club as a whole. It's both an honour and a privilege to present this report as Vice President and Director of Lifesaving. Looking back, it's remarkable to see just how much we've achieved together.

Our patrol teams have demonstrated an incredible commitment to beach safety. This season saw an increased number of patrols and more qualified, active members than in recent years, resulting in a stronger, more visible lifesaving presence across the season.

The dedication and professionalism displayed by our volunteers is something every member of this Club should be proud of.

This season:

- We recorded 98,804 beach visitations on volunteer patrol days—an increase of 26,774 from last season.
- Our members undertook 5,549 preventative actions, showcasing a proactive and safety-first approach.
- We responded to 20 minor and 4 major first aid incidents.
- Most importantly, we conducted 15 major rescues—each one a testament to the skill, training, and courage of our members.

These numbers reflect more than just statistics—they represent lives protected and a community kept safe through the hard work and passion of our lifesaving team. To every Patrol Captain, Bronze Medallion holder, SRC graduate, and behind-the-scenes supporter—thank you.

Beyond the flags, our Surf Sports program continues to thrive and inspire. Our Youth and Senior State Team brought home back-to-back State Championships, a phenomenal achievement that speaks volumes about the talent, dedication and culture within our ranks.

Meanwhile, our Aussies team had its most successful campaign in years, proudly flying the Anglesea colours on the national stage. A heartfelt thanks to our athletes, and the coaches who support them, through early mornings, tough sessions, and relentless preparation—your efforts do not go unnoticed.

Our Nipper program continues to be a cornerstone of our Club and community, growing future lifesavers with enthusiasm, energy and a whole lot of sand. A special highlight this season was the inaugural 3230 Seahorse Nipper Program. Held every Thursday from November to March during the school term. It attracted over 30 children each week and was a huge success. It's initiatives like this that extend our reach and open new doors for community involvement.

I'd also like to express my sincere gratitude to our Board of Directors for their ongoing support and leadership, and especially to our Administration Team, who are always available to answer my questions, provide guidance and help keep everything running smoothly. Your behind-the-scenes work is deeply appreciated and makes a world of difference.

This Club is more than just surf lifesaving—it's about people, belonging and making a positive impact. I'm incredibly proud to be part of Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club and everything we represent.

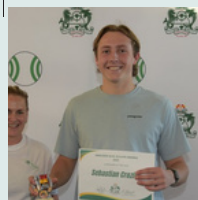

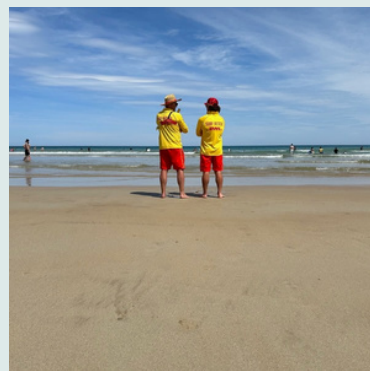

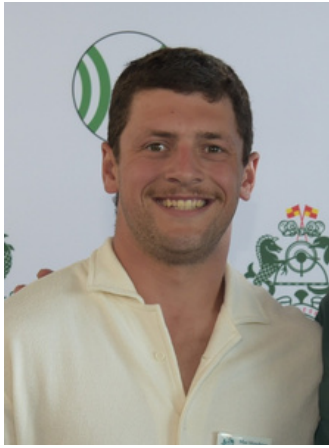

The five-day live-in camp was a significant success, resulting in the awarding of 40 Bronze Medallions and 6 IRB Driver qualifications. We also welcomed a large number of new TAF's (Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators). The camp provided an invaluable opportunity for these new TAF's to gain hands-on experience and begin training new awards, while also enabling existing TAF's to upskill and progress in their training and assessing journeys.

A huge congratulations goes to all of our new trainers – your commitment, professionalism and enthusiasm made a real impact. I'm incredibly proud of your efforts and the positive learning environment you helped to create. The camp was a true highlight of the season and its success was due in no small part to the dedication of so many. A special thanks must go to Matt Anghie, Anna Hume, Will Pereira, Jacob Bisogni and Kristin Reither – Senior members whose leadership and support were instrumental throughout the week.

Following the camp, we ran an IRB Crew course for our newly qualified Bronze members, which resulted in 16 additional IRB Crew awards. It was fantastic to see many of our new TAF's return to assist with this training, once again showing dedication and initiative in developing the next generation of lifesavers.

Another key success was the training of 15 members in First Aid and Advanced Resuscitation. Most of these members are also active with our local CFA, demonstrating an inspiring commitment to community service. Thank you to Mike Martin and Tim Mason for leading this initiative – your efforts have been recognised, with our Club becoming a finalist for Life Saving Victoria's Community Education Award for our partnership project with the CFA.

FACILITIES REPORT

Over the past 12 months several major and minor works have been conducted:

The most significant is the replacement of the Electricity Distribution Board in the lower carpark. The existing board and cabinet were only installed in 2015 but the salt air had rendered the cabinet dangerous. The cost of this work was around \$36,000 but fortunately we received a State Government Grant of \$30,000 towards the cost, with the balance coming from the Club's Resilience Fund.

We had planned to upgrade the gravelled area in front of the Main Store by concreting that area but bureaucracy won out. We had to apply for a permit under the Marine and Coastal Act but after some 8 months the Club decided to withdraw our application.

The steps up to the Ray Marsh Room deck have been in place since the early 1990's and these were strengthened by fitting steel brackets under each of the steps.

The hot water system again presented a few challenges but replacing the circulation pumps that push water through the solar heating tubes seems to have resolved that, or so we thought!!!

One of the air-conditioning units in the Ray Marsh Room was replaced. The last of the very old air-conditioners in the restaurant is still pending replacement.

Brackets were installed in the ergo room so that the R&R reels could be mounted on the wall.

One area of concern is the ongoing lack of support from members in helping to maintain our facility. Time and again it is left to one or two to help to keep it clean and tidy and to clean up or put equipment back where it came from. This is YOUR Club so please help keep it clean and tidy.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT REPORT

This season, Starfish coordinator Matilda Cameron, together with our dedicated trainers and supportive families, delivered another successful program, engaging over 20 participants in a wide range of beach and water activities.

At the End-of-Season Awards, James Keenan was named Starfish Trainer of the Year. Congratulations also to Jez Dalli and Bonnie McCarroll, who showed exceptional determination and spirit at the Adaptive Aussies, earning multiple medals.

Our Summer Program was once again led by the Big Nipper Patrick Haseler, with excellent support from James Pollard and his team managing set-up and BBQs. Club Championships were run in terrific conditions for the first time in years, with strong participation across all age groups. A spirited group also attended the Cosy Corner Carnival, enhancing team cohesion through friendly competition. Family Night at the football club was a highlight, bringing members together for great food, company and well-deserved awards.

Now in its fifth year, our Shoulder-Season Nipper Program welcomed over 30 local participants. This initiative continues to build confidence, improve water skills and strengthen community connections. Many thanks to Rob Tennant for leading the program, with excellent support from parents Stuart Charles, Tara Flynn, Simon Jones and Heidi Littleford.

Many of our competitive nippers participated in Club Training Days over winter and each weekend from October to March. At the Victorian Nipper Titles in Pt Leo (21–23 Feb), our team of 40+ competitors placed 9th overall – a remarkable achievement. Coaches Ivor Morgan, Naantali Marshall, Matt Taylor and I were proud of both the athletes and their supportive families.

At the Senior Victorian Championships in Warrnambool (7–9 March), our youth competitors in the U14, U15, and U17 age groups played a crucial role in Anglesea winning the overall pointscore for the second consecutive year.

In the U15 events, Summer Morgan had a standout carnival, claiming four individual gold medals in the surf race, board, tube and iron. Noah Chapple also impressed, securing three individual golds in the surf race, iron and tube. Mahli McCarroll took silver in the board race and teamed up with Caitlin Haseler and Summer Morgan to win gold in the youth board relay. Mary-Jane Gilbert joined these girls to win both the Cameron relay and surf teams events and placed 4th in the beach relay.

Other strong U15 results included:

- Caitlin Haseler – silver in the tube rescue
- Noah Chapple – bronze in the board race
- Morgan Taylor – 4th in both the surf race and iron

It was a strong competing season for the Club! Youth taking on Aussies.



In the U14s, Ed Pollard won silver in the tube and placed 5th in the board race. Ed combined with Noah Chapple, Morgan Taylor and Fletcher Schultz to win gold in the youth Cameron relay and take silver in the board relay. That same group also claimed bronze in the surf teams.

In the youth beach relay, Ed Pollard, Seb Tannahill, Fletcher Schultz and Noah Chapple finished 3rd. In board rescue, Noah and Morgan took silver in the male event, while Mahli and Summer matched that result in the female event.

In the U17s, Jasmine (Jas) Hume won four individual gold medals in the long run, iron, belt, and swim. Jas also earned team golds in both the U17 and open board rescue with Ellie Morgan, and silver in the 2x1km with Amelia Parr. Ellie Morgan collected bronze in the surf race and belt, and came 6th in the board and iron. Ellie and Jas also teamed up with Evie Theodore to place 4th in the board relay, and Evie herself achieved 4th in the beach sprint and 6th in the flags.

In the U17 2km run, Fitzy Gilbert won gold and Tom Douglas took silver; the pair then placed 2nd in the 2x1km. Mitchell Reither and Tom also secured bronze in the U19 2x1km run.

At the Youth Australian Surf Life Saving Championships, challenging conditions caused many events to be cancelled. Nonetheless, Mahli McCarroll earned bronze in the U15 flags, making a strong start for the beach team. Both U15 Cameron relay teams—female (Mary-Jane Gilbert, Summer Morgan, Caitlin Haseler, Mahli McCarroll) and male (Noah Chapple, Byron Morgan, Morgan Taylor, Ed Pollard)—placed 8th overall, reflecting the strength and depth of our youth squad.

In individual surf race finals:

- Summer Morgan finished 7th
- Noah Chapple finished 9th
- Ed Pollard finished 30th

Morgan Taylor, Kate Taylor, Zoe Hume and Byron Morgan all reached the semi-finals of their surf races. In the board race, Caitlin Haseler, Summer Morgan, Mahli McCarroll, Noah Chapple and Byron Morgan made the quarter-finals, while Zoe Hume advanced to the second round.

At the U17 Australian Championships, Jas Hume and Ellie Morgan had an excellent board rescue event, finishing 6th in the final and were unlucky not to catch the winning wave. Jas also placed 11th in the iron final and reached the semi-finals in both the surf and board races. Ellie reached the quarter-finals in both the iron and surf races, while Evie Theodore progressed to the quarter-finals of the surf race and beach sprint.

Fletcher Schultz and Sierra Long attended the LSV U15 Development Camp and later took part in the Champion Junior Lifesaver Development Day, gaining valuable leadership and teamwork skills.

In January, twelve members participated in our 3-day Gap Year Program, bridging their time between SRC and Bronze. This program focused on first aid, surf skills and maintaining club connection. Special thanks to Jacqui Cook, Matilda McIntyre and Xavier Butler for their expert insights into lifesaving and first responder care.

Our thanks go to the Supporters Group for their ongoing funding and involvement. Through the Hilton White and Gladys Stott Estates, as well as local fundraising, they supported our youth programs and equipment needs. We are also grateful to Trevor and

Jacinta Chetcuti for their tireless work on team logistics and to Yvette Morgan, who again excelled as Youth Team Manager.

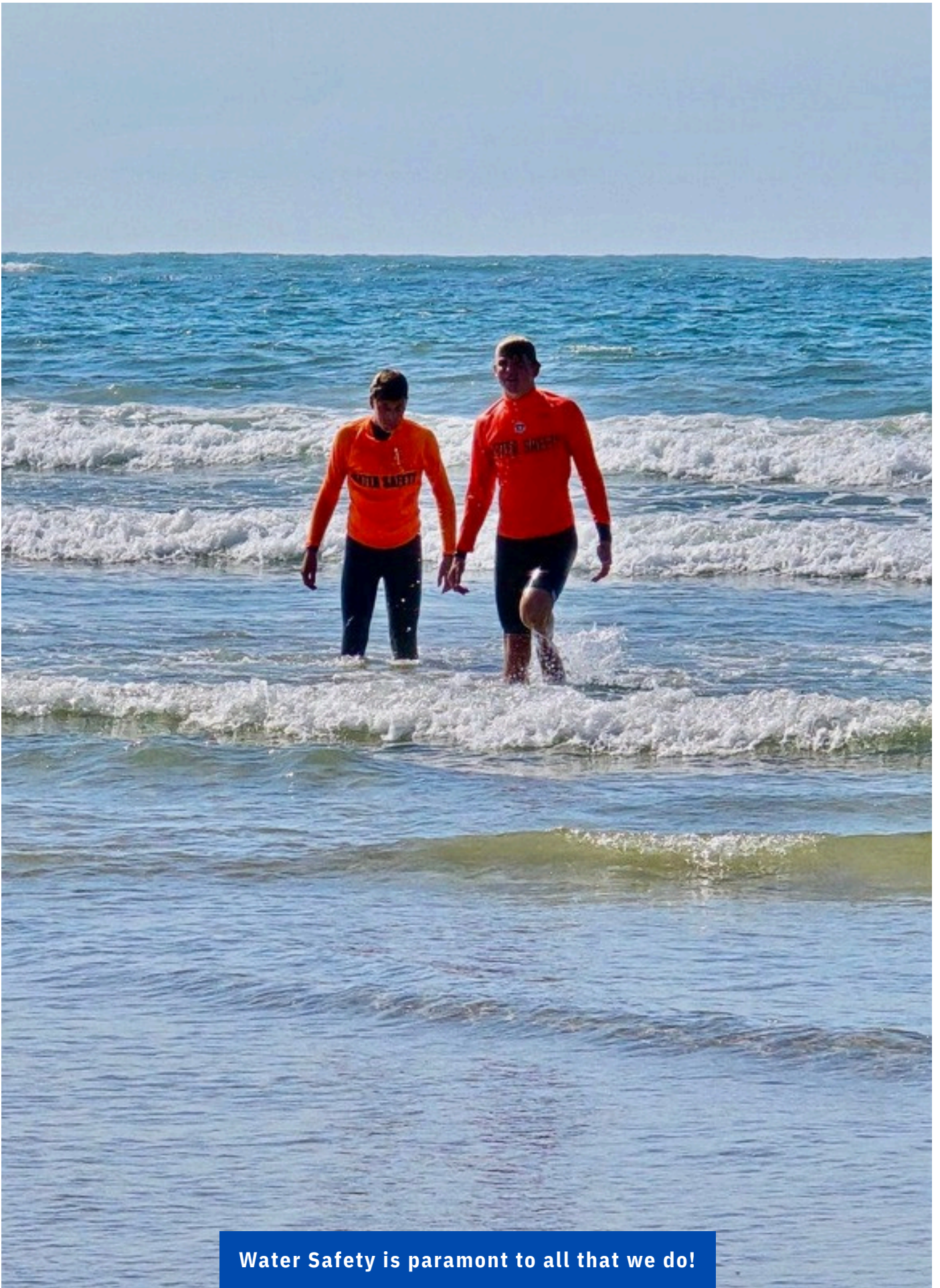

This year we had another amazing season of Nippers, where the new generation of Anglesea Surf Club Nippers, undertook the program.

This year, we had 413 Nippers partake in the program which again is an excellent result. I'm honored and proud to lead such a group. They are a wonderful bunch of young kids who are developing their surf skills, their surf awareness, their mateship, their fitness and their memories.

The 2024/2025 Season will go down in history as perhaps one of the best seasons for weather in living memory. Our beloved Anglesea summer "sou-wester" didn't really shine this year and we just had day after day of perfect weather. One facet of the Anglesea Nippers is their resilience to big surf, cold weather and strong winds, which only builds their character. I can't lie, having some nice weather was a pleasant addition to the program.

The Club is building from strength to strength and again, I stress that the Nippers cohort is the future of the Club. Not only from a lifesaving community perspective but also, the competition side, the parent leader cohort and the general community as a whole. We need to continue to develop, encourage and foster this group of ~450 kids and their parents, as they will only build on the strong foundations, we have already at the Club.

I do feel that there is a strong wave of Nippers who are continuing their surf lifesaving, as a dedicated sport post Nippers. Per capita, we are the strongest Youth club in Victoria, which is an incredible result when you consider the bay clubs and other residential clubs, with masses of population.

Here is a chart of Nippers per age group compared to the previous year. Not only are the numbers remaining steady, the attrition is extremely low. This is a true testament to the strength of a program, the number of individuals who return. Not only are the kids happy with the program, however clearly the parents are also.

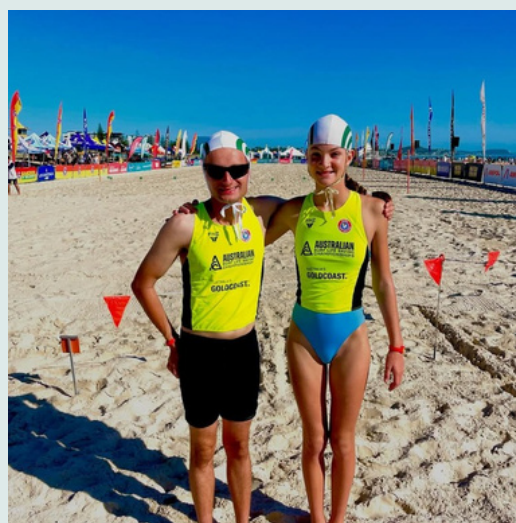
22 Starfish Nippers were ready to go for another action-packed Starfish Nippers Season.

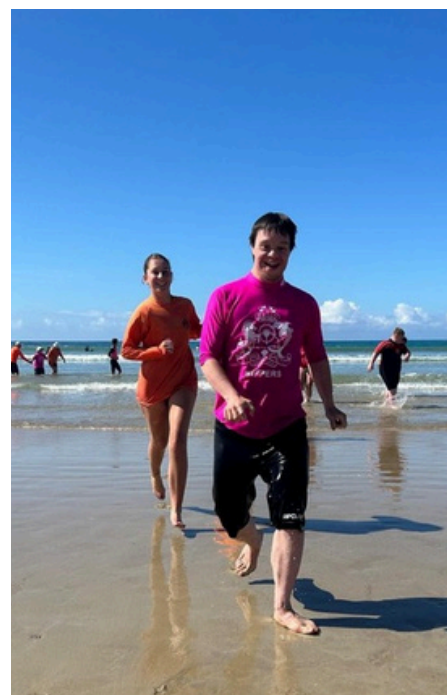

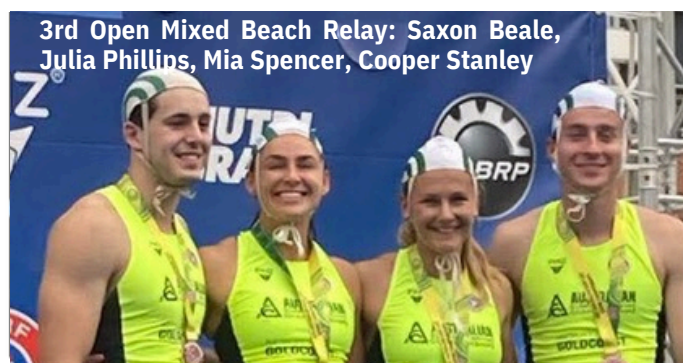

The **2024 Burson Rock2Ramp Ocean Swim** was conducted on Saturday 28th December 2024 in great swimming conditions. 1169 swimmers hit the water which was the largest number of swimmers in the events 29-year history.



The inaugural A-Z Plumbing Dash for Cash Open 1.2km Swim was a highlight of the day with Olympian Nick Sloman (00:14:22) taking out first place in the men's, ahead of Matt Gilling (00:14:57) and Rhys Mainstone (00:15:12) in third place.

Ironwomen Naomi Scott (00:16:00) narrowly took out first by two seconds ahead of Madison Cooper (00:16:02) in second, with Anglesea SLSC's Naantali Marshall (00:17:11) in third.

Another close finish saw Conor Hayes (00:30:32) sneak over the finish line by one second to finish first ahead of Matt Gilling (00:30:33) and Sam Sheppard (00:30:41) in the male 2.5km swim.

Madi Brand (00:33:22) also won in an even tighter finish by less than a second ahead of Dakota Mathers (00:33:22) and Sofia Piaia (00:35:34) in third.

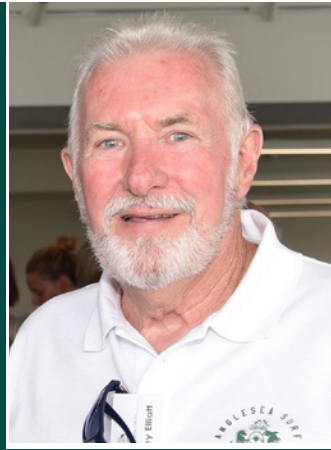

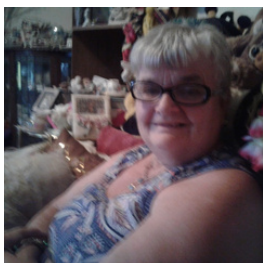

Notes to the Financial Statements

Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Inc
For the year ended 30 April 2025

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

In the trustee's opinion, the Incorporated Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist uses of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. This special purpose financial report has been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 *Presentation of Financial Statements*, AASB 107 *Statement of Cash Flows*, AASB 108 *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors* and AASB1054 *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

Inventories acquired at no cost or for nominal consideration are measured at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is initially recorded at the cost of acquisition less, if applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure that the carrying amount is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the utilisation of the assets and the subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in estimating recoverable amounts.

Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful debt has been created.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the association that remain unpaid at 30 April 2025. Trade payables are recognised at their transaction price. They are subject to normal credit terms and do not bear interest.

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Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.
Revenue from the rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the services to customers.
Revenue from commissions is recognised upon delivery of services to customers.
Revenue from interest is recognised using the effective interest rate method.
Revenue from dividends is recognised when the entity has a right to receive the dividend.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax

Transactions are recognised net of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

Employee Provisions

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the association's obligation for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Current employee provisions are those which employees are currently entitled to and are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Non-current employee provisions are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. The expected future payments incorporate anticipated future wage and salary levels, experience or employee departures and periods of service, and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on high quality corporate bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the timing of the estimated future cash outflows.

The association's obligations for current employee benefits such as wages, salaries and sick leave are recognised as part of accounts payable and other payables in the statement of financial position.

Contributions are made by the entity to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

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Grants

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when the entity receives the grant, when it is probable that the entity will receive the economic benefits of the grant and the amount can be reliably measured.

If the grant has conditions attached which must be satisfied before the entity is eligible to receive the grant, the recognition of the revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

Where the entity incurs an obligation to deliver economic value back to the grant contributor, the transaction is considered a reciprocal transaction and the revenue is recognised as a liability in the balance sheet until the required service has been completed, otherwise the income is recognised on receipt.

Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for a nominal or zero value. These assets are recognised at their fair value on the date of acquisition in the balance sheet, with an equivalent amount of income recognised in the income statement.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Government Grants

Government grants received are recognised in the income statement when the entity receives the grant, when it is probable that the entity will receive the economic benefits of the grant and the amount can be reliably measured.

2. Resilience Fund

The fund has been established to ensure the Club has the appropriate resources, infrastructure and equipment to keep our beaches safe. Additionally, the fund will support the Club to continue be a great community leader and to provide safe avenues for our membership to learn beach and life skills, compete and/or participate in the running of our Club.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Qualified Opinion

I have audited the financial report of Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Inc. ('the Association') which comprises the Statement of Financial Position as at 30th April 2025, Trading Statement, Statement of Profit and Loss, Statement of Cash Flows and Statement of Changes in Equity for the year ended 30th April 2025, Notes to the Financial Statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the Financial Declaration of the Committee.

In my opinion, except for the matters described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of this report, the accompanying financial report presents fairly, in all material aspects, the financial position of the Association as at 30th April 2025, and its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements and the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Victoria)*.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Revenue

As is common in organisations of this type, it is not practical for the Association to maintain an effective system of internal control over cash receipts until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, my audit in relation to cash receipts was limited to amounts recorded.

Inventory

I did not attend the year-end stock take and was unable to perform alternative procedures to gain reasonable assurance over the balance of inventory held at 30th April 2025.

I conducted my audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. My responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report* section of my report. I am independent of the Association in accordance with the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 *Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants* (the Code) that are relevant to my audit of the financial report in Australia. I have also fulfilled my other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

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Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

I draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Committee Member's financial reporting responsibilities under the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Victoria)*. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. My opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Responsibilities of the Members of the Committee

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

In the trustee's opinion, the Foundation is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. This special purpose financial report has been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of *AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements*, *AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows*, *AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors* and *AASB1054 Australian Additional Disclosures*.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

Material Uncertainty Related to Going Concern

The directors have considered going concern and believe the company can continue as a going concern. However, attention should be drawn to the directors consideration of ceasing operations in the next 12 months. This consideration is not as a result of the foundation being unable to realise its assets, or discharge its liabilities, in the normal course of business. The consideration is given simply as a means of simplifying the financial affairs of the Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club.

Discussions around ceasing operations are ongoing and a decision will be made in the near future.

Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful debt has been created.

Financial Assets

Investments held are originally recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company that remain unpaid at 30 April 2025. Trade payables are recognised at their transaction price. They are subject to normal credit terms and do not bear interest.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the entity has a legal or constructive obligation resulting from past events, for which it is probable that there will be an outflow of economic benefits and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured using the best estimate available of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

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Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue from interest is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Revenue from dividends is recognised when the entity has a right to receive the dividend.
