The 2016/17 season brought with it several changes but also a new focus. The focus for the season was on governance, risk management, improving communication and member recognition. In my first year of Presidency we have achieved a lot as a Club.

I would like to acknowledge Warren Clarke who assisted me to transition into the role of President. Warren has been an outstanding leader of the Club and his guidance has been invaluable. Thank you also to Peter Williams and Chris Porter for your guidance and to my wife Romany for your support.

The 2016/17 season saw several changes to the Board. Jim Geary and Tim Mason, after many years of tireless work and leadership of their respective portfolios, moved on just prior to the start of the season. Thank you to both for the significant contribution you have made to the Club.

We welcomed Chris Foley (Vice President Operations), Matthew Symington (Vice President Lifesaving) and Mike Martin (Secretary) onto the Board. Their support and guidance to me has been outstanding and I look forward to working with them further in seasons to come.

One of the most exciting projects for the Club is the Building Redevelopment. This season saw the formation of the Building Redevelopment Committee to provide strong management of the project. The committee will be led by Peter Williams as Chair. Peter is supported by Andrew Suttle (Construction Chair), Ingilby Dickson (Fundraising Chair), Chris Porter (Transition Chair) and Noel Langford (Project Office Chair). Graeme Weber will also assist as secretary for the team. Thank you to all for your contribution, experience and expertise to this once in 50-year project. Thank you also to PDS Group for supporting this project as the Project Managers.

The inaugural Anglesea SLSC Opening Night Cocktail Party was held in late December last year. This was an opportunity for the Club to recognise all Club Office bearers/leaders, sponsors, Patrons and community leaders who have contributed to the club over a number of years. We recognised the Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) group for their dedication to patrolling on the Anglesea beach, in particular Elise Langford and Lloyd Simpson. Tina Kay was recognised for her tireless

efforts running the Merchandise Shop. Shane Edmonds and Mark Gowans who coordinate the Golf Day Club fundraiser were acknowledged, as was Kevin Rigg for his long-term commitment to Senior Competition as Team Manager. We also acknowledged all of our sponsors, major donors and Patrons, they all play a vital role supporting the club. We look forward to continuing to work with them for many years to come.

The night also welcomed back to the Club, Rowena Webster as the guest speaker. Rowena started out as a nipper at Anglesea, then completing her Bronze Medallion, before Water Polo took over. She has since represented Australia including participating in two Olympic Games and is now Captain of the Australian Women's Water Polo Team. Rowena spoke about her journey and her love of Anglesea and the Club.

A big thank you also to Mike Martin AM for leading Development Week and overseeing award processing/assessment for the Club. This was a huge undertaking for Mike and his leadership and commitment to these important programs was outstanding. Thank you also to Mason Schwabe and Sean McVernon for your leadership and innovation of the IRB Training Program. This season they led several changes to this area to improve the standards of crewpersons and drivers within the club.

We had another successful season on the beach serving the Anglesea Community. The patrolling members, under the leadership of David Simpson and Jack Fry, did another outstanding job which saw an increase in on-patrol training. Thank you to all Patrol Captains, Vice Captains, Anglesea Surf Rescue and patrolling members for the many hours you contributed on the beach.

From a leadership development perspective, I was very fortunate to be invited to attend the Surf Life Saving Australia Leaders Masterclass in Sydney. This was a fantastic opportunity to further develop my leadership skills whilst networking with other national, state and club leaders.

Congratulations to Max Mauderer who was awarded the Fred Westfield medal at the Victorian Junior Lifesaving







Championships in Warrnambool. The medal is awarded to the best all round U14 athlete across the 2016/17 season.

Congratulations to Naantali Marshall who scored three gold medals in the 40-44 Board Race, Ironwoman and Surf Race at the Surf Life Saving Australia Championships held on the Gold Coast, in the Master's competition. Well done also to the Open Mixed 5 Person R&R team of Melissa Bird, Emma Moore, Ryan Nolan, Georgina Brown and Callum Brennan, winning gold in the Open competition.

In 2009, Mentone Life Saving Club and Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club formed a Senior Competition alliance. In April, this year, Mentone LSC's executive decided to dissolve the alliance, effective immediately. Both clubs have valued the alliance and there is no malice or bad blood. We wish each other the best for the future.

The Nipper Program was again conducted seamlessly (from my perspective) under the leadership of Naomi Symington and Fiona Fitzgerald and their team. Thank you also to Janet Jones and her team for another successful year of the Starfish Nippers Program.

The Annual Doorknock was again a significant fundraiser for the club raising over \$30,000 on the night for the Club. Thank you to Rachael Keeble for her coordination of this event. The Rock2Ramp had a few challenges this season with the threat of sharks in the area and poor weather. However, the event was conducted successfully with numbers only slightly down on previous years. Thank you to the Organising Committee for their efforts.

Captain Moonlite has been a success for the Club this season with significant local, state and national recognition as a top eatery along the coast, which is great for the Club. Whilst we had some teething problems, partly due to this success at the beginning of the peak season, the Club is working with them to resolve this ahead of next season. Thank you to Matt & Gemma.

Congratulations to John Worrell, recipient of an Order of Australia for service to surf lifesaving in this year's Queens Birthday Honours list. John has dedicated over 65 years of his life to surf lifesaving holding countless roles including: Foundation member (1952), Club Captain (1961-65), President (1978-81), Patron (since 2005), ASLSC Life Member, LSV Life Member and SLSA Life Member. Well done John, and thank you for your service.

I would like to acknowledge Ingilby Dickson, as he steps away from the Board as Director of Administration, into the Fundraising Chair position for the Building Redevelopment. Ingilby has provided a significant contribution and dedication to the Club for over eight years. On behalf of all Club members I would like to thank Ingilby. I would also like to acknowledge David Simpson, as he steps down from the Board as Director of Rescue Services, after 8 years on the Committee and Board. David has overseen the re-building of Anglesea Surf Rescue and guiding significant improvements in on-patrol training. On behalf of all Club members I would like to thank David.

Thank you to Jaci Chin-Jewson and Jenny Mauderer in the Club Office. It has been a challenging season with the office staff learning the ropes whilst experiencing ongoing IT issues, which are now resolved. I am sure all members appreciate the amount of work that they have done.

Preparations for 2017/18 are well underway with focuses on the following:

- Greater member engagement opportunities including a new program called Salty Dogs and various social activities;
- Continued improvements to member and stakeholder communication:
- Promotion and recruitment of Surf Sports to build us back to being a strong competition club;
- Continued enhancements to the Member Development portfolio with the introduction of a new program called Surf Camp, and
- The Building Redevelopment Project.

Thank you to all Directors, Club leaders, sponsors, partners, members and supporters for your contribution to the Club this season and I look forward to seeing you at the Club soon.

VICE PRESIDENT - OPERATIONS

Following a 15 year break from holding an official position in the Club, it has been rewarding to take on the role of Vice President, Operations this year alongside Matt Symington and Tom Cullen.

Given the talent and efforts of our existing Directors in the areas of Administration (Ingilby Dickson), Marketing (Jim Geary), Facilities (Simon Horne) and Finance (Richard Carr), much of the day to day activity of the portfolio has continued to operate smoothly and efficiently. This has allowed me to focus on strengthening the club's governance which has seen the development and implementation of independent Governance and Finance Committees. Through these committees, recommendations have been made to, and accepted by the Board resulting in the following outcomes:

- Governance Principles developed and adopted to guide Board activities and decisions.
- Development of a governance framework to manage risks, resources and responsibilities for the upcoming clubhouse redevelopment which is anticipated to cost \$5 million.
- Development and implementation of a risk management framework and strengthening of the club's risk policy.
- Implementation of financial auditing standards that exceed our current obligations but position us for the clubhouse redevelopmentwhich will involve a significant increase in fundraising and expenditure.
- A new procurement policy and process.
- A workshop for club leaders to review this year's financial performance, set and agree future priorities and commence preparation of budgets for the following year.

These outcomes have only been possible through the contributions of members on both committees who have generously shared their wisdom, insight and experience from a range of commercial, business, government and not-for-profit backgrounds and perspectives. I am grateful for their efforts and ongoing interest in building a resilient, robust and well governed club and look forward to their continued involvement.

An additional initiative this year has been to upgrade our office information technology infrastructure (computers, printers and WIFI). Funding for this has come partly from a state government grant resulting in replacement of most of our aged infrastructure and equipment to improve efficiency and operations with the redeveloped clubhouse in mind.

A couple of our longest serving Directors in the portfolio have/ are moving on so I would like to thank and recognize the significant contributions made by Ingilby Dickson and Jim Geary.



Ingilby steps down at the AGM to focus his time on the new and important role of Fundraising Chair for the clubhouse redevelopment. Ingilby has been Administration Director since 2008 during which time his achievements include:

- Management of Ray Marsh Room to generate \$20,000 revenue from room hire.
- Outsourcing of Bar and Cafe from 2009 to deliver \$25k
 in additional income which has been more than
 doubled this year following his establishment of a
 new partnership with Captain Moonlite.
- Office administration including the thankless tasks of managing our membership database, fund raising collections, management of professional staff and the accounts payable function.
- Annual report Coordinating all areas to ensure a professional report each year and recognised to be the best quality in Victoria.
- Merchandise shop Oversee the shop operations and admin to ensure no stock leakage and margin contribution to club.

Ingilby has also been on the Rock2Ramp swim committee for the last 8 years, is still active as a Life Saver on Patrol and has been a competitor for the club since 2004; winning 4 Australian Masters medals (all bronze) and countless State Masters medals mostly gold!!



Jim Geary stepped down prior to Christmas and has been deservedly enjoying the freedom of weekends and mid-week nights without club related commitments or activities. Following several year's involvement as a Nipper parent, Jim become Marketing Director in 2007 and his achievements since then include:

Secured sponsorships and grants exceeding \$1m in value including:

- \$100k five-year Nipper sponsorship with LinFox
- New Patrol Vehicles and ATVs
- Replacement patrol gear including rescue boards,
 Defibs, training mannequins etc
- Solar power system
- Solar hot water system
- \$600k outdoor media sponsorship promoting Anglesea

SLSC in key Melbourne locations

- Conceived and secured Board support to purchase an offsite storage facility in Anglesea which is now paid off and generating rental income while storing gear.
- Been a core photographer of club events such as the Rock2Ramp and also Nippers and competitions covering State, Interstate and Aussies

Jim has also played a key role in the ongoing success of the Rock2Ramp swim, by leading the events marketing and sponsorship activities for the last nine events.

Marketing

This year we focused on improving member and community engagement and communication via the club website and social media.

Our website was totally rewritten and redesigned before Christmas and made accessible on mobile devices as can be seen below. The use of clean white space, simple navigation and lively images has improved the appeal and usability of the site. Content is also being frequently updated including a Latest News section.

Season 2016/2017 proved a steep learning curve for all new and existing Board members. A regeneration of backgrounds, experience and personalities is critical for a not-for-profit, volunteer Board to enhance the value proposition to its members. This renewal occurred over the last 12 months in a range of different positions within the Lifesaving portfolio (Rescue, Development, Surf Sports and Youth).

The leadership position I signed up for was to support the President and be the link between the Directors, office bearers and membership groups.

This season there was a focus around risk, governance, strategy direction and succession planning. This included executing a more robust Aquatic Activity Risk Assessment policy and procedure, an adjustment to the direction of the Development area, most notably Development Week and requirements for awards, a review and recommendations of the direction of surf sports and an increased focus of onpatrol training.

Whilst policy and strategy were being developed and implemented, the operational aspect to the club occurred as per normal, with a focus to the horizon on the building redevelopment and the logistical requirements to be able to function efficiently as a club during this period and into the future.

I would like to acknowledge and thank those that stepped down for their service over respective periods of time and to those that stepped up to provide their precious time and expertise.

I would personally like to recognise Tim Mason and Kevin Rigg for their dedicated commitment to Development and Surf Sports and to the club as a whole.

To the respective Directors in Lifesaving I look forward to working with you all in season 2017/2018.

ADMINISTRATION REPORT

With a little sadness but with great pride this will be my last Administration Director's report after 8 years in the role, hopefully providing some positive leadership over that time period.

Looking back I'd just like to highlight a number of the key initiatives we've had over that time and I'm proud to be part of the team that delivered the following activities:

- Oversaw the recent change of staff in the administration office from Di Feudoloff to Jaci Chin-Jewson, which is the first staffing change we have had for over 15 years and was a significant challenge for us all, particularly for Jaci after the long term service of Di.
- Recent upgrade of our administration office accounting software to Xero, together with some improvements in process and procedures rolling out across our administration office.
- Overseeing the café and bar activity that moved from club operation, with casual staff, to a fully outsourced bar and eatery, as we have with Captain Moonlite, has been a significant journey of learning and hopefully improvement and service to the members and the wider community. The financial rewards that have been consequently provided back to the club, particularly over the last year with a significant step change in contribution and improvement in our facilities.
- The shop has continued to improve it's service to our members and also financial contribution with a consistent \$10-\$15,000 benefit each year. We're also in the process of upgrading our point of sale systems for the shop, which will also interface with our new accounting package and provide more effective accountability and hopefully process for the club.
- This annual report is quite a significant task to pull together, and it is a representation of our club and a great promotional document for those historically minded of our activities and, probably with a little bit of bias, the preeminent annual report of surf clubs out of the state of Victoria.
- Fundraising support continues with my own involvement particularly at the Rock2Ramp Swim and more recently the Doorknock, and I'm pleased to see the continued administration and process improvements going on for those important fundraising events.
- Improved accountability across our various activities to develop a clearer cost-to-serve of each of our clubs' key cost centres and activities, and thus ensure greater accountability

and transparency including capital works and planning. Working closely with our finance colleagues to ensure that our compliance and governance continues to improve in the demanding world of governance that we now live.

Under the new guidance of Jaci Chin-Jewson, there has been quite a step change in the administration support that we provide to various functions. In particular, support to the Development Week and Nippers has increased, and we are very fortunate over the summer months to have the support of Jenny Mauderer, to process all those various activities which in the past were provided by volunteers. We will continue to implement improvements in our processes and procedures, and I know Jaci's working hard to ensure the membership process continues to become a little more intuitive and easier to operate for our members in the coming season.

The shop has again been very effectively managed by Tina Kay, who does a fantastic job in ensuring we have the right stock of club merchandise available to our members and community while at the same time ensuring that we get a solid financial contribution and not push our inventory holdings to unsustainable levels. As mentioned earlier we are in the process of upgrading our point of sale systems and I am hopeful that this will be completed over the winter months and ready for another active season, with the merchandise for that period already mostly in good shape for a continued \$10-\$15,000 net return to the club again.

The outsourcing of the café and bar to Captain Moonlite completed their first full year of operations at Easter and the feedback has been very positive amongst members and the broader community. Recently Captain Moonlite received a number of industry accolades for their cuisine, service and the ambience of our Ray Marsh Room. This brings ongoing benefits to both members and the wider community, and I think we should also be very proud of that as the entry point to our Surf Club.

Most of the investment in fittings have been provided by Captain Moonlite with only core items such as tables and chairs purchased and maintained by the club, which continues to ensure sound and effective capital management.

The contribution in rent and commission from Captain Moonlite has been some three times higher than the previous accounting period and we are confident that this will continue to improve and grow. This improved cashflow

is vital to the club as we fund the building redevelopment next year and beyond. I am pleased to also see member engagement is improving, with Captain Moonlite employing members and ensuring a number of effective member discounts and activities to ensure that we don't lose sight of the fact that it is still our members' club and a centre for the broader Anglesea community to engage and enjoy.

The fundraising events all had administration support with the Rock2Ramp separately reported, as is the Golf Day, but I would like to make a comment about the Doorknock. Rachel Keeble has recently completed her last administration task of running our Doorknock over the last three years, and again (with a great result of over \$30,00 received on the night) all operated seamlessly with good governance and process.

Nippers continue to provide great support to our Doorknock process and I'm hoping that in the new year that we up the ante with a greater level of support to generate additional funds for our building redevelopment. Rachel, many thanks for your great contribution.

So from me, as I now focus on the building redevelopment

tasks and particularly the funding of that important once-in-a-50-year task, I will continue to be about and working hard for our club. In the meantime I look forward to providing a transition and handover across to the new administration director post-the AGM, and I would like to also acknowledge and thank Derek Stott who has stood in for me to pull this fantastic Annual Report together, and hoping perhaps that he will be able to continue that support for a year or two in the future.

RESCUE SERVICES REPORT

The Anglesea SLSC is trusted by thousands of visitors each year to keep them safe at our beach and we, as a club, could not provide the services or safety without the incredible time and commitment by so many club members each year.

As we close another season we review the on-going initiatives that we have developed and continue to improve, change or adapt, these include our comprehensive Patrol Captain, Vice Captain & Mentors Handbook to provide critical role specific information to these personnel, internal Patrol Audits, on patrol training, ASR specific thank you celebrations, incentive programs and online sign-ups. We have continued our on patrol training for all members and improved the focus by improving the quality of our services. Thank you to everyone who took time out of their busy lives to spend a day, weekend or multiple patrols on the beach.

My role as the Director is only possible with the amazing support, dedication and leadership of the team who lead with me. Thank you to Jack Fry who led and coordinated our Patrols this season, as the Patrol Coordinator. Jack was instrumental in ensuring our Anglesea Surf Rescue groups were manned with all the appropriate level awards, leadership skills and personnel.

Thank you also to Colin Anderson and Lloyd Simpson, Colin for ensuring our IRB equipment is continually repaired and operational for training and patrols, and to Lloyd for guaranteeing that our First Aid supplies are operational, safe, fully stocked and regularly replenished. Both of these roles are critical for our club operations, yet few realise the commitment and dedication of these members. Lloyd and Colin have been key members of the Rescue Services department for many years and I am very grateful for their ongoing support and leadership.

Over the past four years we have worked tirelessly to rebuild the Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR), with a core group of highly trained members who ensure that our beach is patrolled each, and every weekend, in-line with SLSA and LSV guidelines. Four years ago ASR had only 14 members, this year we have successfully established 8 ASR groups with 80 members.

It is with great pride that I offer my thanks to all of our amazing Patrol Captains for implementing so many of our new initiatives and achieving higher standards. Our new, first year Patrol Captains include Erik Kroy, Courtney Higlett, Lachie Appleby and Adam McWha, and the ongoing commitment from our experienced Captains, who have continued to lead their own patrols for another season, include Rosie Anderson,

Ash Smith, Nick Tait, Seb Top, Tom Cullen and Elise Langford.

To all of the members in Anglesea Surf Rescue, your time and commitment to ensuring our club continues to meet all of our requirements is greatly valued. It is essential that we, as a club, continue to encourage and support our own members who wish to stand up and become leaders on the beach.

This season ASLSC members manned the beach for a total of 6,450 hours on 47 different patrols. With a major focus on increasing on-patrol training and development of our core lifesavers, the Anglesea Surf Rescue group, and all members alike, it ensures the Anglesea Main Beach continues to be a safe beach for all members of the public. This year our members performed 1,329 preventative actions, which ensured there was only one rescue performed this season. We performed 22 first aids, including 2 major first aids ranging from breaks and dislocations to major wounds. There were also 2 beach closures due to severe storms in the later period of the season.

A special thank you to our members whose commitment above all, greatly assisted our club in its success this season, including members who patrolled for 30 or more hours, which was almost double the expected 16 minimum hours asked of them. These members have been listed in my report. A special mention must go to Andrew Rechtman and Sean McVernon on their competition to reach the most volunteer patrol hours this season. Unfortunately, it came down to the final weekend, which Andrew had a prior commitment on, allowing Sean to win by a mere 2 hours! Thank you both, to Sean for his 121 hours, and to Andrew for his 119 hours of volunteering. Both Andrew and Sean received a Bronze Medallion Award for Patrolling / Volunteering at LSV's Volunteers Award Evening last May.

In my 5th year as the Director of Rescue Services, I can only look back with immense pride. We are leaders in the life saving services, organisation and structure that we operate in and for that I am so grateful to have a club and members who support us in implementing so many successful initiatives.

Thank you to each of you for your help, support and time over the years.

Not even a beach clearing storm with raindrops the size of golf balls could dampen the spirit of our Nippers this year. Thank you to Fiona Fitzgerald who approached every element of the role with the children's best interests at heart and has implemented some innovative changes to the program.

NIPPERS REPORT

Another action-packed Nipper season came and went in the blink of an eye and was largely filed away as a success. Again, we reached near capacity with approximately 460 Nippers taking to the beach, which is an extraordinary exercise if you are brave enough to think about it. What impresses me most about this is the sheer number of willing volunteers who coordinate to make the season possible.

Sponsorship is secured by Johnathan Clarke to ensure our Nippers are clothed in rash vests, t-shirts, hats and bags. Items are ordered and printed by Tina Kay, delivered and sorted for distributions by a willing band of bag packers. Rash vests are sourced and printed by Matt Symington, Nippers are registered, minimum swim proficiencies authenticated and new families wonderfully and patiently supported throughout the overwhelming process of navigating membership and Nipper registration by Jenny Mauderer and Jaci Chin-Jewson.

Then once Boxing Day arrives there are literally hundreds of parents and long-standing members who happily lend a hand. As always, our age group managers and leaders did an outstanding job, Fraser MacVean was a fantastic support in coordinating upwards of 60+ water safety officers each day. Lucy Haigh took over the running of the Art Show which is a much loved and important aspect of the season and also did the sausage and bread collection runs every Nipper morning. This year we retired the Queen Sausage role and tried a 'all hands on deck' approach. I am happy to say that parents rallied on their designated day and we again raised a significant sum for the club.

This year we tried a slightly different approach to our age-group structure and had an Age Group Managers/
Leader role which required no surf-lifesaving skill set and then a group of Coaches to deliver skills based training on the beach. The rationale for this was to enable more parents with good 'kid wrangling' skills, but no surf-lifesaving experience to be involved. Secondly, it enabled us to make use of some of our younger members including Hamish Neo, Alisha and Max Mauderer, Baxter Kay, Max Suttle and Anna Hume to coach groups, without needing to worry about the 'kid wrangling'. We were extremely fortunate to have Chris Porter come down each morning to brief our coaches and water safety.

Each year our Water Safety volunteers turn up session after session to fulfil a crucial and very much underplayed role within the program. Not only do they ensure the safety of the 450 children on the beach, but also act as friends, mentors, coaches and leaders. I would like to extend my gratitude to the 100+ volunteers involved in this year's program. In addition, I would like to thank the Anglesea SLSC Bears for their donation to enable all our Water Safety to be clad in new orange rash vests.

In addition, we offered three levels of activities within each of the water areas to enable Nippers to self-select activities that suited their ability, confidence and interest in the program. This was a huge success, with many parents feeding back that it enabled their child to feel less nervous and happier to get involved, knowing they were not going to be asked to go beyond their comfort levels.

This season also saw the continuation of the community building side of the program. Nippers were encouraged to learn names, make friends and support each other during sessions. We were incredibly fortunate to have Rowena Webster, the Captain of the Australian Women's Water Polo Team and ex-Anglesea Nipper, speak to the Nippers. Her words were inspirational as she reminisced about her time as a Nipper and the life-long friends she made. She also reflected on the fact that she struggled at Nippers and that the fact that she was not the best enabled her to learn to enjoy sport for sports sake and that her success in water polo is based on learning to work hard for the things you want. It was a very powerful message for our young Nippers.

Activities outside the beach program, such as age group Bocci nights and the family fun night were offered to help grow the connection families have with the club. Thanks goes to Jess Handreck for running the Bocci nights and the Anglesea Supporters Group for the wonderful job they did hosting our family fun night.



first win as a crew. An outstanding effort. The same crew also raced at the first VSRL event in Apollo Bay against the Open Men in which they came 4th overall. Another fantastic effort by a beginner crew.

The section then had a small break over the Christmas period and were ready to suit up and race the VSRL surf boat carnival at Fairhaven. We had two crews entered, but unfortunately this carnival was relocated from Fairhaven to Fisho's beach Torquay due to shark sightings. Undeterred, the crews went in with a great mindset (even though they were racing on flat water).

The Open Women raced first and raced hard even though they experienced unfair and out of line turning cans/bouys. This put them at a disadvantage of at least 3-4 lengths off the start. They improved throughout the day making it through to the finals, finishing 4th overall.

The Open Men competed next with a fill in the bow seat, after Jason Heard injured his knee prior to Christmas. This changed the dynamic to a degree, but not phased by this, the crew were amongst the leaders to the turning cans. Unfortunately the return leg was not what they wanted and they found themselves in the middle of the pack for most races. The guys finished 5th overall in the block racing. Next race was the Seaspray weekend (21st-22nd Jan) which



also has the VSRL Open championships. The section was represented by: Open Men, Open Women and 2 reserve crews.

Conditions on the Saturday were very tricky for all. Conditions not seen or rowed in for some time, but the crews (Open Men, Open Women and 1 reserve men) rowed well. This was the first time for the Reserve Men's crew Anglesea 4 Stroke in these conditions. They rowed well and above all expectations. The Open Men and Open Women failed to secure the state team selection, missing out narrowly. Sunday saw a friendlier day for racing, a boaties dream, 3-4 foot clean waves with little wind. Unfortunately the Open Women's crew could not race as their bow, Megan, suffered a bruised coccyx bone in the last race of the day on Saturday. The Open Men raced well finishing in the top of the field, but the last race saw them rollover just before the line, leaving them languishing in third position, and unfortunately finishing just behind the winner on points. Talking point of the day was the Anglesea Reserve men, The Late Takeoffs, competing in their first event with a new rower, Harry Wetherall. They rowed above all expectations and took out the Reserve grade pennant. What a fantastic result for these guys. Well done.

The weekend of the 4th and 5th February saw 2 crews represent Anglesea. Our Masters Men, *The Drifters*, competed at the LSV masters championships and our Reserve men *The Late Takeoffs* compete at the Senior State carnival both held at Ocean Grove. The conditions at the start of the day for the masters were a Rowers paradise, with clean rolling sets coming through. The Masters Men competing against a few other crews and raced well. The event combined the 260's years and the 240's years to ensure that all crews raced against 5 crews. The gents raced hard and well in their block racing.

They rowed 4 races finishing 2nd in their division and 3rd overall. A great start to their campaign for Aussie gold. Our Reserve Men started later in the day, with conditions deteriorating quickly, as the wind freshened, which flattened the swell and built a stiff headwind to row into.

This was the crew's first race together as the combination for the Aussies, with a couple coming back from extended holidays. The guys were up against some stiff competition from Lorne and Portsea who had been on the money for most of the season to date. They put up a valiant effort but unfortunately missed out on a top three placing, finishing 4th overall. It was a tough start for the crew, but it was great to see them improving with each race against the other

Three crews then turned their attention to the ASRL (Aust Surf Rowers League) Open Championship that was held in February at Shell Harbour SLSC. The Masters men raced on the Friday, with testing waves of 5-6ft combined with a strong on shore wind, making it very tough. There were many broken oars that littered the beach with crews scrambling to get replacements so they could continue to race for gold. Racing was cut down to 2 races due to the surf and our Masters Men came home with a bronze medal. A fantastic effort and a job well done.

Saturday saw the Open Men and Open Women compete in their 5 rounds of block racing. Conditions being better than the day before saw some exciting racing. Our Open Women were on the pace all day. They were consistently in the top half, until the 2nd last race when a crew crashed into them off the start. They finished 4th, sitting on the verge of being eliminated. It came down to the last race, unfortunately they missed out on the knock out finals by 1 point. A commendable effort by the girls.

Open Men raced well and finished in the top half, putting them in a position to make knockoff finals. Again the last race was crucial. The men needed to finish in the top half to make the cut-off. Unfortunately the race was not their best, missing out by 2 points. A massive effort considering that the crew had a change in personnel with a new sweep on the day and a new 2 seat rower. Well done to all crews. You represented Anglesea with true professionalism.

All attentions turned to the LSV State Championships held at Port Fairy on the weekend on Sat 4th and Sun 5th March. The section was represented by 4 crews: Open Women Anglesea Wildfires, Reserve Men Anglesea Gold, Reserve Men The Late Takeoffs and U19 Female Anglesea Heart Breakers made the trip.

The Reserve Men Anglesea Gold were able to have the service of Glen Lazzaro and Lachlan Andrews who came across from Seaspray SLSC. With no time in the boat, the crew got together for a training row prior to the commencement of competition. With the boat feeling as good as it could, the Reserve Grade men were up first. It was a tough day of racing for both Reserve crews as the Reserve grade had 4 heats into a semi then a cut to a six boat final. Unfortunately the Anglesea Late Takeoffs were not able to secure a birth to the semi-finals. They finished just outside the top 12. Our second Reserve Men's crew Anglesea Gold raced extremely well after a slow start. They managed to keep themselves in the top half of the crews securing a birth into the semis ranking 3rd overall.

In the semi, the crew lead the race to the turning cans, where the other crews took full advantage of a wave which our crew missed. Digging hard the crew managed to hold off a fast charging Mordialloc crew. Making it through to the final, the crew was ready to go. The lads raced hard and fast leading majority of the way. They turned first and had a healthy lead on the competition, leading with 300m to

go, our crew tried to pull down a wave, but unfortunately slewed to the side allowing the crews behind to catch that wave and slide through. The lads tried to get the next wave to get a cheeky podium spot but again came unstuck. After all that effort they finished 5th in the final. A fantastic race and showed some real form but did not get the result they wanted.

Open Women competed in their 3 heat block racing. They cut the field down to 6 going into the final race. Our girls raced hard and fast, taking their form from the Australian Open into the State Titles. They were consistently in the top half of racing, however one race did not fall their way when they crashed into another crew meters from the line. It was all up to the last race to secure a birth in the finals. Having a great start and turn, it looked possible, but unfortunately they finished 4th. Well done to the girls.

Last was our U19 Female crew Anglesea Heart Breakers. With a girl new to rowing, Poppy (from Mentone), she raced with 3 girls who transferred from Seaspray. Finishing with a 1st and two thirds, winning the bronze medal on points. It was by far the best result for the section, and from a crew had never raced together before. It was great to see them grinning from ear to ear.

The boat section also fielded a boat relay consisting of 3 crews: Open Women, U19 female and Reserve Men Anglesea Gold. All crews raced hard against the more fancied Mordialloc and Fairhaven crews, who had Victorian state representatives. Not fazed, Anglesea finished a commendable 2nd position behind Mordialloc. Two medals for the section and two medals for our U19 females.

Last event of the day was the Lifesaver relay. The club fielded two relay teams. This consisted of a boat crew, ski paddler, board paddler, swimmer and runner. Our Open Women were in the A team, whilst *Anglesea Gold Reserve men* raced in the B team. Our Open Women got hit by a few waves putting them behind, but our men were able to get themselves out in front with Warrnambool. The boat leg finish was separated by 1 second with Warrnambool leading. B crew came second overall. A great way to finish the Vic State Titles.

Lastly, the Australian Open Championships. This proved to be very disappointing for all involved. With the challenge of getting crews to the event (Open Men having two fillins plus a sweep) and with Cyclone Debbie causing havoc, racing did not happen for the Open events.

The Master's men competed well in their heat racing, to make it through to the Aussie Final. The team were primed and ready, but unfortunately did not get off to a great start, being hit by two or three waves, and filling the boat. Racing hard, they emptied the boat and started to make their way back to the field, coming around the turning cans they put themselves well and truly in the mix for a medal. One crew raced away to take the gold, leaving 3 crews to fight it out for the minor medals. Our lads were coming home like a train, but agonisingly, just missing out on the bronze. A great effort to finish off the season.


The section is moving forward in the right direction, having people in the right places behind the scenes, helping and developing the section to be bigger and better. To those, we thank you very much.

TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT

This year has seen the stepping down of Tim Mason as the Director of Member Development, who had been in this role for the past 8 years. During Tim's time in office, Development has seen considerable growth and the broadening of the skill-set of the membership through the creation of programs focusing on a range of areas. Most notably, Tim;

- increased the self-sustainability of Development Week through the creation of the Training Officer Course and Probationary Assessor Course,
- enhanced our IRB capabilities as a club by introducing the Silver IRB Camp and Summer IRB Crew Courses, and
- engaged members, not involved in Development Week, through the January Bronze Program and Parent Resuscitation Courses.

This is not a complete list of Tim's achievements, all of which took considerable hard work, dedication and commitment. Tim is also a fabulous mentor who equipped many young club leaders with invaluable experience. I would like to thank Tim for his many years of service to Development, and I hope to honour the legacy of Tim's work by continuing to ensure that Anglesea offers high quality courses that enhance our lifesaving service and community.

Development Week

Our Development Week program continues to be a popular program for young club members. Hugh Moodie and Emily King were integral to ensuring that we again provided a fun and engaging educational experience for our participants. I would like to thank both Hugh and Emily for their tireless work in organizing and running the camp.

IRB Program

This year Mason Schaube and Sean McVernon made significant and very successful changes to the IRB Program, aiming for greater driver competency in the club. Candidates are now required to complete and log a set target of hours, aimed at building experience, prior to being able to be assessed. This tied in with several IRB crew courses, ran expertly by James Betson. Thank you to the IRB team for your continued work in increasing IRB competency within the club.

SRC Program Leader : Ingilby Dickson

SRC is the first major lifesaving qualification that allows those that complete the course to join a Patrol, and to also compete in senior carnivals. This year was my 11th year running the SRC course and we saw another 61 young under 14s all pass, and many began Patrol activities later that month, which was great to see such a positive community service commitment from them.

I am very lucky to have a fantastic team of trainers and supporters to help run this course over the Nipper period and all volunteer their time. Derek Stott and Noel Langford were the key trainers with support from Jakob Shaw, Hugh Marslen, Michael Lombard and a significant number of Bronze holders providing water safety and guidance. The administration of the course is always a big task and this year we had great support from Katya Chaney and Karen Devlin, making the process flow smoothly.

All the best to the 61 new SRC holders for Patrol next season and for their Bronze in the future.



Parent Resuscitation Courses

Over summer, Alice Bills and Lachlan Eaton also ran three parent resuscitation courses. These courses were well received and resulted in the continued engagement of the membership base, outside of the Development Week.

Development Review

In February, a focus group of trainers, assessors and candidates conducted a review of Development. This review identified several challenges currently faced by the section. These included:

- A lack of water skills in candidates,
- Inadequate focus on courses outside Development Week with courses not being spread across the season.
- Insufficient retention of members over 18 years old, creating a bottom-heavy structure with too few individuals willing to take on leadership or support roles and a lack of experienced trainers,
- Inefficient use of resources by providing inappropriate training, and
- Poor communication with membership.

Exciting Plans for 2017/18

Concentrating on tackling some of these challenges, a Development Team has been established to work together in the 2017/18 season to manage the Member Development section. This team will continue to grow and develop throughout the seasons ahead.

The Development Team is looking forward to introducing several new initiatives in 2017/18, such as;

- Surf Camp Trial to increase the water skill level of the club, Ken-Leon Yap and Chris Porter are trialing a new program during Development Week, aimed at building leadership skills within the young club members and enhancing water skills by travelling to different beaches and learning how to tackle a wider variety of surf conditions.
- On Patrol Training to provide scenario-based, patrol-focused training for our Advanced Resuscitation Techniques and Spinal Management Courses, we will now only be offering these courses whilst on patrol through training officers on each ASR.
- Anglesea Assessor Group qualified and aspiring assessors that have contributed to the club will be invited to take part in the Anglesea Assessor Group. This involves mentoring younger assessors, an 'Assessor Re-qual' at the start of the season to ensure all assessors are up to date with recent changes and social events to acknowledge the hard

work our assessors do throughout the season.

- Selection of Development Week candidates Anglesea Development Week is an incredibly popular program that we are very proud of. However, to ensure we are able to continue to provide high quality instruction, we have decided to limit numbers, to ensure we have sufficient resources to deliver a valuable experience to all participants. To fairly allocate spaces, we are establishing a selection process that is transparent and reflective of the values that we endeavour to foster in our lifesavers and club members.
- Season-wide Engagement Bronze, IRB Crew, IRB Driver and First Aid courses will be offered throughout the season to ensure all interested members can take part in these programs.

Thank you

I would like to give a huge thank you to Mike Martin AM who gave a massive amount of his time and dedication to Development this season. Mike was an integral part to the co-ordination of both Development Week and the assessment of courses throughout the season. Mike assessed a large proportion of the candidates himself, lodged all courses in 'Surfguard' and chased candidates for awards that could not be processed. Mike also trained new assessors in Bronze Medallion, SFA and Spinal Management, and mentored assessors at re-quals and other assessments. I am very appreciative of Mike's tireless work this season.

Lastly, we could not run the incredible number of courses without our many volunteer trainers and assessors. Thank you all for your continued work in Development and I look forward to working with you all in the future.

FACILITIES REPORT

Our building and infrastructure is definitely looking forward to the redevelopment. Age related wear and tear of our facilities is leading to more frequent failures of high use items, such as roller doors, locks and noticeable damage to high traffic areas, mainly in the lower clubhouse area.

We have minimised the spend on facilities, especially where these will be demolished in the near future, opting for repairs where ever possible, or strategic replacement, to maintain the safety and operability of our facilities.

As examples of this approach, we have had to invest in significant electrical maintenance work and upgrades in many areas of the club, essential to ensure the safe operation of the building and to ensure the café and restaurant facilities were reliably supplied. This investment in upgraded electrical hardware systems, including the new circuit boards, will be

transferrable into the redevelopment. Significant repairs to the IRB storage area and the installation of an upgraded security system will also be transferrable.

Thank you to all of our members for your patience and tolerance of these 'band aid' maintenance solutions, and if any obvious safety issues arise within the facilities, we will respond promptly!

Anyone having key or Fob issues, please let me or Jaci know so we can replace them, or at least get you access.

I look forward to the continued improvement of our club and enjoyment for all.

BUILDING REDEVELOPMENT UPDATE

We continue to move slowly forward on this important project. Following a number of consultation sessions in 2016 there were some significant revisions made to the plans to address a range of concerns. After further discussion with the Department of Water, Environment, Land and Planning a revised application for Coastal Management Consent (CMC) was submitted in late 2016 and was granted in March 2017. This was required as the clubhouse is on Crown Land. An application for Planning Approval was then submitted to the Surf Coast Shire in April 2017 and is currently under consideration. In parallel with the planning application the project team are going back to all sections of the club to reconfirm their expectations and requirements from the redeveloped facility.

We currently anticipate construction will commence during 2018 and it is planned to take approximately 18 months, so at a minimum, one summer season will suffer significant disruption. Chris Porter, who is overseeing transition planning, is currently working with all sections of the club to develop plans for how best to minimise the impact of this disruption on patrols, training, nippers and general club life. As things are now moving forward the club has moved to put in place a range of measures to ensure the redevelopment is managed and delivered appropriately.

These include:

- Committing to a Project Plan with Emergency Management Victoria to oversight the State Governments \$1.5M contribution to the redevelopment;
 - Setting up a project management team as shown on the accompanying diagram;
 - Developing a set of 'decision gates' that will ensure all decisions to proceed are based on quantifiable and objective evidence;
 - Committing to a procurement plan that ensures that the procurement of goods and services:
 - Is conducted in an ethical, honest, fair and transparent manner;
 - Delivers the best value-for-money outcome (e.g. price, quality, reliability, service, delivery, payment terms and participation of Strategic Suppliers);
 - Is performed in a way that manages procurement risk; and
 - Follows a process that is intended to protect the reputation of the ASLSC.



We reiterate our thanks to all members for their support to date and look forward to significant progress over the next 12 months.

Our first Summer has come and gone with lessons learnt and ideas to improve for next season. The coffee cart we engaged to cope with Nipper Day coffee rushes served quality coffee but feedback was it took up too much space so we will investigate options to engage a smaller cart for next summer. We will also improve marketing so the cart has maximum impact and helps reduces wait times in the restaurant by offering a take-away alternative.

To cater for the large number of drinkers on the deck during the peak season we had a custom (removable) bar ledge built to allow orders to be taken through the window as well as adding a permanent bar ledge around the edge of the deck (on the Point Roadknight side) for additional seating.

During the peak season we recognized a need to offer quick and easy beach-side snacks and light meal options at lower price points for members so we introduced our Beach Bar Menu. Available on the deck only, it allowed our kitchen to better cater for members looking for an easy and more affordable snack/meal while the restaurant was at capacity offering members and guests a meal from the full menu. Selected dishes from the Beach Bar menu were also made available take-away (at a discounted price) to cater for the Patrol team and younger members looking for a quick option to take back to the beach.

WHAT'S AHEAD:

We are working with the Club to increase the drinking area capacity for members and guests by removing the stage in the RMR and adding a bar ledge with stools along the window (facing the Alcoa tower), we will also add banquette seating along the famed 'Gold Medal' wall to further enhance the space. These improvements will, largely be covered by Captain Moonlite, bringing the total investment to the club and venue to \$60K.

Starting in December 2017 all paid up members will receive 10% off lunch or dinner. Just flash your member card to receive the discount (not available for breakfast or coffee). We will continue to offer our member beer & wine at happy hour prices from 4pm every day. We will also still offer our Members & Locals night every Thursday* & BYO nights every Sunday*

Bruce Graham Fidler 4/1/1936- 21/8/2016

Bruce joined the ASLSC together with his brothers John and Carl, on 27/12/1952. He obtained his Bronze Medallion on 17/1/1953 no 43197 and immediately became involved in administration and competition with the Club. Bruce was a crewman in the Club's first boat swept by Harold Menalaus and also competed in R&R. It was not unusual in those days to represent the club in several disciplines. Bruce was Club Registrar 1954,1955, assistant Chief Instructor 1956 and on the General Committee. Bruce was granted leave of absence and spent several years

living in the UK with his twin brother Carl. The two brothers competed in an Australian R&R Team at a Carnival in Bude Cornwell. He met his wife, Joyce, in England and returned to Australia. He resumed membership of the club and was secretary for three years 1975-77 when his brother John was President. Bruce patrolled for 9 years at Anglesea

Bruce will be remembered by his peers as a popular personality and for his initial contribution to the early development of the club and later term in administration

Geoff joined ASLSC in 2012 to help re-invigorate the R&R Section. Geoff was a member of at least 8 other clubs during his lifesaving career, and his enthusiasm and interest led to the resurgence of R&R in Victoria.

He first competed with Pt Leo in a Junior R&R team and gained a silver medal at the SLSA titles in 1964, then, from 1969 he started coaching R&R teams from different Clubs with great success at the SLSV, LSV & SLSA Titles.

Geoff held a variety of positions on SLSV and LSV committees and while Superintendent in 1977, Geoff developed an 'Annual Requalification' program for BM holders so that they could remain active and up to date with requirements for patrol. This was adopted Nationally in 1978/79 season.

With SLSA he was on the R&R Advisory Committee from 1997 to 2010, Chairman from 2006 to 2010 and on the Technical Committee from 2011 to 2016.

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The directors have determined that the company is not a reporting entity and accordingly, this financial report is a special purpose report prepared for the sole purpose of distributing a financial report to members and must not be used for any other purpose report prepared for the sole for any other purpose. The directors have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the mannance.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention, except for certain assets, the surfucts as one of have been written down for fair value as a result of impairment. Unless otherwise stated, the accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the profeyear.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the *Income Tox Assessment* Act 1997.

Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

Inventories acquired at no cost or for nominal consideration are measured at the current replacement cost as at the date of

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is initially recorded at the cost of acquisition or fair value less, if applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Bant and equipment that has been contributed at no cost, of nonminated and recognised at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired. The plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure that the carrying amount is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the utilisation of the assets and the subsequent disposal. The expected reclash flows have been discounted to their present values in estimating recoverable amounts.

Freehold land and buildings are measured at their fair value, based on periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by independent external valuers, less subsequent depreciation for buildings. increases in the carrying amount of land and buildings arising on revaluation are credited in equity to a revaluation surplus. Decreases against previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves in equity. All other decreases are harged to profit or loss.

Any accumulated depreciation at the date of revaluation is offset against the gross carrying amount of the asset and the net amount is restated to the revalued amount of the asset.

ntangibles

Goodwill is recognised as the excess of the purchase price for a business acquired over the fair value of the net assets at the date of acquisition. Goodwill is assessed for impairment annually and is carried at cost less accumulated impairment losses.

Frade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful debt has been created.

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Financial Assets

Investments held are originally recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company that remain unpaid at 30 April 2017. Trade payables are recognised at their transaction price. They are subject to normal credit terms and do not bear interest.

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to 30 April 2017. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related costs.

Employee Benefits

Provisions
Provisions are recognised when the entity has a legal or constructive obligation resulting from past events, for which it is probable that there will be an outflow of economic benefits and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured using the best estimate available of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

h and Cash Famiyalent

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Revenue from the rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the services to customers.

Revenue from commissions is recognised upon delivery of services to customers.

Revenue from interest is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Revenue from dividends is recognised when the entity has a right to receive the dividend.

Goods and Services Tax

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Transactions are recognised net of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

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Leases

Finance leases are leases of fixed assets where substantially all of the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset are transferred to the entity, but the legal ownership is not transferred to the entity.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a corresponding liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased asset, or the minimum lease payments measured at present value including any residual values.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term.

Operating lease payments are charged to the income statement on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

Lease incentives are deferred and amortised over the period of the lease.

Profits and losses on sale and leaseback transactions are recognised in the reporting period in which they occur.

Grants

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when the entity receives the grant, when it is probable that the entity will receive the economic benefits of the grant and the amount can be reliably measured.

If the grant has conditions attached which must be satisfied before the entity is eligible to receive the grant, the recognition of the revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

Where the entity incurs an obligation to deliver economic value back to the grant contributor, the transaction is considered a reciprocal transaction and the revenue is recognised as a liability in the balance sheet until the required service has been completed, otherwise the income is recognised on receipt.

Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for a nominal or zero value. These assets are recognised at their fair value on the date of acquisition in the balance sheet, with an equivalent amount of income recognised in the income statement.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Government Grants

Government grants received are recognised as revenue on a basis to match the recognition of revenue with costs incurred in the



Notes to the Financial Statements

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

The trustees of the Foundation have prepared the financial statements of the Foundation on the basis that the Foundation is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. These financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of beneficiaries, the information needs of stakeholders and for the basis of preparation of the Ancillary Fund Return. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the trustees have determined are appropriate to meet the purposes of preparation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention, except for certain assets, which, as noted, have been written down to fair value as a result of impairment. Unless otherwise stated, the accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the prior year.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

Irade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful debt has been created.

Financial Assets

Investments held are originally recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

Frade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company that remain unpaid at 30 April 2016. Trade payables are recognised at their transaction price. They are subject to normal credit terms and do not bear interest.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the entity has a legal or constructive obligation resulting from past events, for which it is probable that there will be an outflow of economic benefits and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured using the best estimate available of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

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
