President's Report

Welcome to the 2020-2021 Annual Report. As we all know the past year was a very different year as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, however, despite the challenges presented, as a Club we came together when it counted and we were able to operate effectively in the new normal.

The outstanding service as the Club's COVID Safe Coordinator, Matt Taylor, ably supported by Jen McIntyre, ensured that as a Club we could deliver our programs and services to the safest standard possible. There was no doubt that at the start of the lifesaving year there was significant uncertainty about what the year ahead would look like. Behind the scenes Matt supported all areas of the Club with the preparation and delivery of our services and programs whilst ensuring that he was up to date with the latest requirements. Thank you, Matt, and thank you to all members for doing your bit.

The Club's purpose is: 'to save lives and keep people safe on the beach.' This year was one of our busiest on the beach for our patrol teams for many decades. Beach attendance was well up compared to past years as the community broke free of lockdowns and restrictions. The result was a significant increase in rescues, first aids, incidents, and preventative actions. Well done to our patrolling members, in particular our dedicated Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) teams for their outstanding vigilance and service. Thank you also to outgoing Rescue Services Director, Elise Langford for your outstanding contribution, along with your team, to rebuilding our patrol attendance and performance.

A big thank you to Tom, Tara and the rest of the team at Main Beach Kiosk and Main Beach Kitchen and Bar for your service and support of our Club. The friendly service, great offerings and timely introduction to the Club in December was just what the Club needed. We greatly appreciate you coming on-board considering the challenges COVID-19 presented. I am pleased to advise that Tom, Tara and the team will be continuing to service the Club for the 2021/2022 lifesaving year.

We had another successful year for the Member Development area with numerous Bronze, SRC, IRB and First Aid courses being delivered. Thank you to tireless work of the Clubs' trainers and assessors. Thank you also to the outstanding service of Lachie Eaton, Mike Martin and Matt Taylor.

Our Nipper programs, under the leadership of Sam Hume, Matt Keenan and Matilda Cameron, had another great year. Thank you to all of the age group leaders, water safety officers, trainers and parents for your support. It was great to see increasing numbers in our Dolphins program, under the leadership of Ivor Morgan. Thanks Ivor.

It was with sadness that we farewelled two of our Life Members. John 'Jimpy' Shears was one of the Clubs' early members who served the Club in so many ways over the next 68 years. I would also like to thank Bob Ingpen for the generous donation of the mural in memory of Jimpy.

Bill 'Gunna' James, who we will also miss joined the Club in 1966 and participated across various areas of the club during



his time, including as a competitor, team manager and official across the decades. Condolences to the families.

It was an honour to officially open our new facility in late January with our key stakeholders, supporters and fellow members. Thank you to everyone who donated funds towards this amazing once in a generation project which we can all now enjoy for years to come. Thank you also to our business partners PDS Group, BSGM, Michael Carr Architects and Maddocks as without their ongoing support this project would not have been possible. I know that you have heard me thank the Building Redevelopment Committee many times before, however unless you were close to the project, you may not realise the amount of work that these volunteers contributed. Specifically thank you to Peter Williams, Ingilby Dickson and Andrew Suttle. Like you all I am immensely proud of what we have achieved.

The surf sports summer season was significantly impacted as a result of COVID-19 for both our junior and senior competitors. Despite these challenges our competitors continued to participate. Congratulations to the Open Women's R&R team on winning a bronze medal at the 2021 Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships held on the Sunshine Coast, Queensland. The team consisted of the following members: Rhianna Burke, Mikaela Dale, Melissa Bird, Stephanie Warmuz, Karen Dale, Christine Cardwell (Coach).

Our Club staff do a fantastic job supporting our members and reducing the burden on Club leaders. However, we must remember that they can't do everything and as a Club leader or member we all have a part to play in getting things done too. We must all remember that we are here for the Club, opposed to the club being here for us.

One of the highlights over the past few months has been the introduction of 'Nippers 3230'. The level of engagement and passion in this Nipper program has been fantastic. Thank you to Laura Boyer and Petrina Porter for your leadership and the many members and parents for making this program happen.

After five years in the role of President I am not continuing in the role as I will shortly start a new journey with my family which is very exciting. It has been an honour to lead this Club and I am proud of what has been achieved. Vice President - Operations

This year the Operations portfolio has had to deal with COVID-19 while activating member services and hospitality offerings in our new clubhouse. On top of its normal activities, these challenges have meant that not everything could be predicted or went as planned, and almost everything required additional work and effort from the amazing team of volunteers involved.

Key highlights and challenges dealt with include:

Onboarding the new clubhouse

- After years in development and construction, we took ownership and operational responsibility for the new clubhouse with infinitely more control systems, windows, surfaces and floors that need to be operated and or cleaned (particularly under COVID-19 restrictions). Tim Bone, Director of Facilities has worked tirelessly with our primary leads on the redevelopment project, Peter Williams and Tom Cullen to ensure new security systems, cleaning contracts, operational manuals and the like are in place and operating.

Members shop, service area and new office

- Jono Clark, Director of Marketing has led the design and execution of a vastly improved members shop and service area with assistance from Tim Bone and the House Committee. Given the new shop layout and continued improvements to our merchandise range under Jono's guidance, it is no surprise that our sales of club apparel have exceeded all previous records.
- Our small but highly effective team of professional administrators now have a vastly improved office space and areas that they can serve members from.

Food and beverage offerings

- Following extended delays, which were beyond the Club's control, we secured a new Restricted Clubs Liquor Licence

mid-December that significantly increased the number of patrons able to be served from 120 to 300. We were able to extend our "red line drawing" (area that alcohol could be served in) to include the John Worrell Room, deck area and associated training rooms. This eliminates the need for guests and visitors to sign in on entry and sets us up to operate a restaurant at the same time as running Jimpy's Bar for members or for an event.

- Jimpy's Bar was brought to life in the John Worrell Room, staffed by volunteers under the leadership of the always professional and smiling Alex Stott, Bar Manager. This was the first time in many years that the Club has operated a member's bar, so the positive response and feedback has exceeded expectations and would not have been possible without the contribution of our many volunteer bar team members. That said, there have also been many learnings regarding the challenges of securing and rostering volunteers to work in the bar and the management and stocking of supplies. These are being reviewed and considered for the coming season.
- The Kiosk Main Beach and Main Beach Kitchen & Bar were launched as summer pop-ups in December. This last-minute deviation from our original plans was in response to our selected food and beverage tenderer requesting a postponement to their opening due to delays to the Club securing its certificate of occupancy and Liquor Licence. Compounding these issues late last year was the uncertainty and complexities impacting hospitality businesses due to COVID-19 and news that the "old" wing of the clubhouse would need to be closed for several months to complete mandated remedial works some time in 2021. We are grateful to the agile and professional teams at Bomboras and Four Kings who were able to set up and operate a pop-up kiosk and restaurant offering with two weeks' notice. Their accommodating approach to working with the club under



extremely challenging circumstance and COVID-19 induced uncertainty has been amazing. A new tender for the Club's food and beverage requirements is being planned.

Functions and events

- A key benefit of the new and improved clubhouse is our ability to run functions and events to bring members together while also being able to generate much needed revenue by allowing others to hold their special occasions with us.
- While COVID-19 has restricted the scale and operation of events, it has been great that members have been able to enjoy a handful of events including a Ladies Lunch, Trivia Night, several band nights (thanks to Patrick Haseler and his band 6 Foot Over) and Memorial Night.
- It has been great that Club General Manager, Jen McIntyre supported by the office team has been able to secure external bookings for a number of weddings and other celebrations that bring in considerable new revenue for the club.

Finance Committee

- To ensure our financial position remains strong, Derek Stott has taken on the role of Chair of a newly formed Finance Sub-Committee reporting to and assisting the Board, Richard Carr (Finance Director) and Jen McIntyre (General Manager).
- Please join me in thanking Derek for his leadership and considerable work on this activity.

House Committee

- Our House Committee represent members interests and needs regarding the operation of the clubhouse along with food and beverage services and offerings. Given the ever changing and challenging environment created by COVID and need to onboard a new clubhouse, this team of volunteers

has done an amazing job to review and respond to the many and varied "curve balls" that this year has presented.

Vice President - Lifesaving

While the past year has continued to be difficult with activities curtailed due to ongoing restrictions associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, the highlight has undoubtedly been completion of the new Club House project. The facilities for members and visitors are unprecedented and are the envy of other Surf Coast clubs – and the view from the deck outside the John Worrell Room and Jimpy's bar is exceptional!

However, as I have mentioned previously, the Club is much more than simply a nice building – a Club is its members. We have as our highest priority, the delivery of high-quality rescue services to the community - it is what we do on the beach and in the water which will determine how successful we are as a Club. The focus must now be on building our lifesaving and surf competition capability.

Consequently, a major focus will be on attracting more volunteer members to expand our life saving capacity and achieve the highest standards of life-saving skills.

Club memberships were maintained at a high level during the past season despite the combined impacts of the COVID-19 environment and not having all the Club facilities available. Total LSV registered members numbered 1590 of which Active Members (all age groups) accounted for 807. Half of these were 6 -13-year-olds which provides a great pool of volunteer lifesavers... if we can retain them – a continuing challenge. A complete membership profile is detailed further in this report.

A particular focus for the Club is our Nipper program. This is where our future lifesavers and competitors start their journey and it was pleasing to see this season, that not-with-standing the COVID-19 restrictions, over 400 Nippers participated in the summer program. Particular credit to Junior Development Director Sam Hume and 'Big Nipper' Matt Keenan with the large number of support staff, including many Nipper parents, for the great work in delivering a successful program.

A great innovation this year was the recent introduction of the 3230 Nipper Program designed specifically for Anglesea children which has proven to be a great success and an excellent platform to engage with the local community. This project has been driven by member Laura Boyer supported by several of our local Anglesea Club members and again parents are playing a central role in delivering the program.

One of the objectives of our Club is to provide activities for members of all abilities. The Starfish program started by Janet Jones and Naomi Symington and managed this year by Matilda Cameron, has been a stand-out program in providing opportunities for young people with disabilities to participate in surf lifesaving activities. Members might have seen the TV story on the 'buddy' program involving lifesaver Jack Livingston and Starfish member Jeremy Dali and the relationship that resulted in Jeremy's advancement in surf lifesaving. There have been many outstanding examples of the success of this program which continues to grow in our Club and has now been extended to other SLSC Clubs throughout the country. It is a great demonstration of inclusiveness and the role that Anglesea SLSC can play in this process.

I should also take this opportunity to mention to Nipper parents, families, and friends that the Club wants you, and needs you, to be involved to provide volunteer support for the many activities and events within the club. You are welcome to register your interest with the office in participating in Club activities.

Of course, a crucial role is that of Member Development without which we would face a diminishing pool of active members for our patrolling and competition needs. This has focused on Bronze and SRC qualifications, as well as an increase in special training courses in first aid and IRB operations. 44 Bronze and 41 SRC qualifications were awarded. Lachie Eaton had responsibility for these programs and the successful



outcomes achieved. These required a major commitment to delivery and increasingly stringent (and somewhat restrictive) training was necessary to meet LSV requirements. There is an urgent need for additional trainers and assessors to ensure our new members are properly qualified and accredited. It also requires greater consideration on the part of LSV to facilitate more flexible training programs to attract and retain more volunteers in future. The current system is acting as a deterrent in many cases to prospective new members.

Special mention should be made of the work of our patrols over this difficult period. The importance of this work cannot be overstated. It is the primary reason for our Club's existence and the performance of our patrol members and leaders has been exemplary. The challenge is to continue to attract young people to become members and participate in our lifesaving and surf sports activities. Elise Langford as Director Rescue Services, supported by Lachie Appleby (Gear Steward), James Betson (IRB Manager), Matt Anghie (First Aid Officer), Freddie Graham (Patrol Coordinator) together with volunteer patrol members, ASR patrols and lifeguards continued to deliver high quality services despite the significant restrictions imposed on them.

Competition is a major pillar of the Club's activities and responsibilities and some positive developments are occurring in our Surf Sports area. Last year I reported on the decline in the numbers engaged in surf sports activities and the need for greater focus on building our capability and capacity. Competition is not a secondary consideration as it plays a major role in creating members with greater surf awareness, skills, and fitness and as a result, better lifesavers. Consequently, we are taking greater steps to introduce new members to the various sports, from swimming, boards and skis, beach events (running and beach flags), surfboats and the traditional R&R event. I highlighted in the previous Annual report that it was the first time that we had not been able to 'field' a surfboat crew in competition. I mentioned that we were taking steps to rectify this and had introduced a 'Come & Try' program to enable anyone with an interest in boats (or indeed, any of the other sports) to take the opportunity to experience the sports with a view to becoming competitive participants. This has

coincided with three established crews and one of the surf coast's most experienced coaches and sweeps joining Anglesea and this is leading to a major 'rebirth' of our surfboat section. We have also benefited from another experienced sweep also joining Anglesea to take charge of another two or three crews for next season. A number of the crew members have become involved after introduction through the Come & Try program and we will endeavour to extend this process to other surf sports areas such as boards and skis next season. To assist in promoting greater involvement by new members in surf sports and competition, a short video highlighting the various sports at Australian SLSA Championships was produced as part of our member development and training program.

Brief mention should be made of the performance of Anglesea at this year's Australian Titles in April on the Sunshine Coast. This will be dealt with in more detail in the Surf Sports section by the Director Ian McGain. Around 33 members participated in boats, beach events and R&R. Given the much more restricted competition season in Victoria compared with Queensland and NSW surf lifesaving clubs who experienced a relatively uninterrupted season, Anglesea performed very well. Boats made the quarter finals, while beach events also managed quarter and semi-finals and R&R also managed a Bronze medal. I would acknowledge the great efforts by Sai Dale as Team Manager and thank him on behalf of the team for dealing with the many aspects of our attendance and performance at the Aussies.

As always, much of our activity requires administrative support and the work that our office is required to undertake through Jaci Chin-Jewson and Jennie Mauderer, often under great pressure, to submit competition entries and record patrol hours is often overlooked. Administration Report

This is my fourth season as the Director of Administration for the Club and my eleventh year as a SRC Trainer. This was a milestone season as we moved into our brilliant new clubhouse and enjoyed using the outstanding facilities, all while managing within the COVIDSafe operating restrictions.

The highlights :

- The completion of the new clubhouse has been a huge highlight. All Club members can be rightly proud of the efforts of the whole team involved in bringing this new building to life, led by our President, Tom Cullen and supported by the almost daily engagement at the site by Peter Williams, and enabled by the fund raising efforts led by Ingilby Dickson. The official opening ceremony in late January was a fitting celebration and recognition of the magnitude of the task undertaken and completed.
- Our Anglesea Surf Rescue teams, led by Elise Langford and her dedicated Patrol Captains and their volunteer life savers, supported by the Life Guard services, have once again provided a professional level of care to over 100,000 visitors to our beaches, with no major incidents during the season.
- The leadership and commitment of the Member and Youth Development Directors, Lachie Eaton and Sam Hume, capably supported by Matt Keenan, Matt Taylor, Ben Gilbert, Patrick Hasler and Ivor Morgan, have been instrumental in making the Nipper and Dolphin programs so successful over the summer and off peak seasons.
- The increased social engagement of our Members that was evident in the nightly buzz in Jimpy's Bar, was an aspect of Club life that really hit the mark with so many Members and visitors to the Bar. The bar team, led by Alex Stott, Matisse Andrews and Mick McConnell and their happy band of member volunteers did a great job, inspite of only having a 'pop-up' bar facility for this first season.
- The Ladies Luncheon event was a sell-out success, with over 110 Members and their guests enjoying the hospitality and sensational views of the Anglesea beach. It was also an example of how the new John Worrell Room and the balcony have added another dimension to the potential for our Club, both in providing Members with a venue to enjoy and to enable the Club to market the venue to support our revenue raising plans.
- As one of a dedicated team of SRC trainers over the years, who have endured wind, rain, hail, spiders, power failures and other distractions in the tents, the new training rooms and audio visual equipment have made a huge positive difference to the trainers and to the students. Again I would like to acknowledge and thank all the Trainers and Assessors that devote their time and energy to developing our members skills and knowledge, your contribution has been sensational.
- The activation of the Main Beach café and eatery on very short notice was a very popular venue and special thanks to Tom McGrath and his team for making this a reality for Members and visitors when our longer term catering plans for the RMR were disrupted at the last moment by the ongoing COVID-19 operating restrictions.



I would like to warmly thank and congratulate Jen McIntyre on her contribution to enhancing the effectiveness of the Club's administration, marketing, communications and fund raising efforts through numerous grant applications, and her ownership of the day to day administration of the staff we employ, many thanks for making my role easier !!

The added capability of the Club to host functions, including weddings, birthday celebrations, corporate events and special events such as the film crew location have created new time and support demands on the management team. I support the continued investment in adding dedicated staff to maximise the Club's revenue and to ensure we deliver a quality event experience for our Members and clients.

The daily operations of the business of the Club continue to be very well managed by Jaci Chin-Jewson, our Admin Coordinator, and Jaci is very well supported over the peak season and during her vacation breaks by Jennie Mauderer our Admin Assistant. Jaci and Jennie, the Facilities Officers and the Bar team all report to Jen McIntyre.

Jaci has continued the task of collating, designing and producing the Club's 'Green & White' broadsheet magazine, which has significantly reduced the external design and production costs.

In addition to managing the front office functions, Jaci has developed broad knowledge over the past four years in running of all the back office aspects of the role, which encompasses banking of incoming funds, payments to key service providers including Local, State and Federal Governments, LSV and SLISA, and to the numerous services that the Club requires, including water, gas, power, fuel, food, insurances, merchandise, first aid supplies, pest control, cleaning, repairs, phone and web-based telecoms, IT support and waste removal services. The 2021/22 season is shaping to be a memorable one, hopefully as COVID-19 restrictions ease with the vaccine rollout progressing, and our beaches will continue to be a great place to enjoy, while our members willingly volunteer to patrol the beaches keeping us and our visitors safe in the water.

Rescue Services Report

The 2020/21 was a season like no other, however, Anglesea managed to achieve its goal of providing a safe aquatic environment for 148,211 visitors to the beach. With heavy restrictions faced across Victoria in the lead up to the start of season and ongoing changes to restrictions throughout the season the Rescue Services Team faced a number of new challenges.

The 2020-21 season saw changes to the Rescue Services Team with Freddie Graham taking on the role of Patrol Coordinator and Jessica Handreck taking on the position of Patrol Development Coordinator. Pre-planning for the season commenced in August with Freddie preparing the patrol roster for our ASR teams. This is always a tricky task, however, it had increased complexity in 2020, due to frequent changes to COVID-Safe requirements, resulting in multiple iterations of the roster and teams being developed for a variety of potential circumstance. Jessica Handreck (Patrol Development Coordinator) was busy ensuring all ASR members had re-qualified in preparation for the season.

Matt Anghie (First Aid Officer) ensured the first aid kits were well stocked prior to the start of the season and that the first aid room was well stocked carrying a sufficient number of spare consumables for use during the season. This was particularly important in 2020 as the patrols and lifeguards dealt with the highest number of first aids experienced in recent years. I would also like to thank Lloyd Simpson for his assistance preparing first aid equipment and the new first aid room during the stage 4 lockdowns when travel was restricted.

Lachie Appleby (Gear Steward) and James Betson (IRB Manager) again worked tirelessly repairing and coordinating the servicing of all of our patrol equipment prior to the season. As a result our equipment passed the annual gear inspection and was ready for the first weekend of patrol. Lachie and James' ongoing maintenance support throughout the season enabled the Club to have sufficient equipment on hand for all patrols and water safety activities over the season. I would also like to thank Colin Anderson for his assistance with the preparation of IRB's during the stage 4 lockdowns when travel was restricted.

Our seven Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) teams delivered all of our 48 rostered days of patrol over the course of the 2020/21 season. This is an incredible achievement by the team given the rapidly changing COVID-19 restrictions.

Anglesea's Patrol Captains and their teams were rostered, on average, to complete 43 hours of patrol for the season. This was almost triple Anglesea's Club requirement.

The role of Patrol Captain is a challenging one: managing the beach; monitoring visitors, assessing surf conditions as well as up to 30 members on patrol on a number of occasions. In spite of these challenges, our ASR Captains kindly volunteered their time to lead and share their knowledge and experience with their teams this season. During the 2020/21 season the ASR teams were able to lead the Clubs seven Patrol Captains and Vice Captains:

- ASR 1 - Lachlan Sallabank (C) & Jack Livingston (VC)
- ASR 2 - Emily King (C) & Jessica Handreck (VC)



- ASR 3 - Elise Langford (C) & Matt Anghie (VC)
- ASR 4 - Bailey Wraith (C) & Luke Ross-Smith (VC)
- ASR 5 - Mason Schaub (C) & Marli Wilkinson (VC), Kate Owen (VC)
- ASR 6 - Lachie Eaton (C) & Cam Barr (VC)
- ASR 7 - Ed Mackay (C) & Rachael Gay (VC)

We thank our ASR Captains, Vice Captains and their teams who were vital in ensuring that Anglesea met its minimum requirements with LSV. A special thank you goes to four of our Patrol Captains; Bailey, Mason, Emily and Elise who are stepping down after a number of years as Patrol Captains. We thank them not only for their leadership over the past few years, but their ongoing support they will provide to the incoming Captains in 2021-22.

2020-21 saw record numbers of incidents on beaches state-wide and Anglesea was no different. With people unable to travel during school holidays beach attendance during patrolled days was 40,380 over the course of the season. As a result of increased beach attendance there was an increase in activity at Anglesea Beach. Our volunteer lifesavers performed 8 rescues, 52 first aids, 3,210 preventative actions and responded to 3 incidents.

Anglesea was again serviced by lifeguards each day over the peak summer period and extended to late February due to the increased beach activity in 2020-21 which saw a beach

attendance across Anglesea Main Beach and Point Roadknight during lifeguard shifts of 107,831. Lifeguards play a vital role in keeping our beach safe during the week and we thank them for their service as well as the 4 rescues, 62 first aids, 6,112 preventative actions and 13 incidents they managed while working at both Anglesea Main Beach and Point Roadknight this summer.

It was pleasing to see the number of members who signed up to voluntary patrols this season. There was an increase in the number of members who patrolled in the 2020-21 season, when compared with both of the previous two seasons. It is a Club requirement for all of our Active Members to complete 16 hours of patrol each season, and it was pleasing to see that record numbers of members completed their 16 hours of patrol this season. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank our Active Members who patrolled this season and we hope to see them return next season.

Youth Development Report

The 2020/21 season was heavily influenced by the coronavirus pandemic with many of the usual activities such as Club Training Days, our Adventure Race, the September training camp in Queensland and our Family and Presentation nights unable to be held. Many of the regular carnivals were also cancelled. Despite these limitations, the Youth area had a successful season in which we welcomed in another era in the Club's history with the opening of our new clubhouse. The new build included a dedicated Youth space which was generously fitted out by funding provided by the Hilton White Estate through the Supporter's Group. I would like to thank both the Supporter's Group and Hilton White Estate for their ongoing support of the Club's youth in providing equipment and opportunities to increase youth retention and transition them to become full patrolling and competing members.

An adapted and highly successful Nipper Summer Program was able to be completed due to the considerable efforts of our volunteers including Big Nipper Matt Keenan, set-up/pack down maestro Patrick Haseler, water safety coordinator Ben Gilbert, COVID officer and all-round contributor Matt Taylor plus our age-group managers and water safety personnel who help coordinate the program and keep our Nippers safe this summer. Many of the constraints put on the Summer Program in the past two years with the lack of a clubhouse and COVID restrictions have generated new and even improved ways of organising the program.

Our Starfish program celebrated 10 years this season and has grown and expanded regionally, nationally and internationally from a beginning that started right on our own Anglesea beach. It was fantastic to see Janet Jones and Naomi Symington whole-heartedly congratulated for their vision and hard work over the decade, while the current coordinator Matilda Cameron along with all of the trainers and families again delivered another great Starfish season.

This season saw a number of new innovations developed to

engage and retain Youth members. Lachie Eaton organised and ran the 4-day U15 Surf and Skills Gap Year Program for 14 members which was aimed at those who completed their SRC the previous season and provided further development of surf skills and additional first aid training including completion of the First Aid Certificate. The program did a great job of bridging the year between SRC and Bronze and Lachie should be congratulated on his hard work and endeavour in this program, as well as for the Bronze Camp which ran in December after many necessary modifications to ensure COVIDSafe conditions and requirements were met.

An additional Nipper program called 3230 Nippers ran for the first time and sought to provide a term 1 (and term 4 later in 2021) 2-day per week program for local primary school students to get involved with the Club and develop essential surf safety skills. A huge congratulations to General Manager Jen McIntyre who did a large amount of background work to get this program up and running, and to Laura Boyer who was an absolute dynamo in leading the sessions along with a core group of volunteers including Trina Porter and age group managers Prue and Ryan Long, Jen Tucker, Beck Shaw, Adam Saw and Andy Gooday. The Nippers were also keenly supported by Club stalwarts Peter Williams, Mike Martin and Bernie Murray, as well as the Supporter's Group who assisted with BBQs and member scholarships. This really was a highlight of the season with many local children and families interacting with the Club for the first time, including two parents Angus Staines and Peter Crowcroft who went on to get their SRC during the term. I hope we can further develop the program, engage more families and more fully embrace the local community in our membership and activities in the coming seasons.

On January 20th, 27 members, half of whom were in the Youth area, were successful in swimming the challenging 3.8km stretch of water across the Heads from Point Nepean to Point Lonsdale called the Rip. Welcomed by a large crowd,



and with positive print media and local radio station coverage, the day was a fantastic highlight for these swimmers who had completed 13 open water training sessions in preparation over the preceding months. The project was an effort to engage our Club's youth in a shared, challenging experience, and to provide a fitting focus for this group of members who had a paucity of events during the summer due to the pandemic.

The sense of Club camaraderie and achievement was high, with one parent expressing "our sincere thanks to everyone who put in the work to support and train this group to their success. The joy and smiles were infectious. As they say, it takes a village, and they are so lucky to have such amazing villagers. What a way to get 2021 off and running. Thank you." Given the success of this project, we plan to make it a bi-annual event for the Club's youth.

The Youth area also ran the Mission, a 400m swim, 800m run, 400m board, 800m run event designed to challenge the youth members to complete the required distances for the Gold Medallion and a necessary standard for future lifeguards. Held in large surf, 13 young Nippers, 13 older Nippers and 6 SRC/Bronzies successfully completed the event on January 24th, demonstrating amazing determination, fitness and surf skills developed through the Club's training program. Coordinated and encouraged by Naantali Marshall, Youth members also completed virtual events including the Rock 2 Ramp, Coolangatta Gold and Pier to Pub this season.

Phoebe Gowans and Mackenzie Keenan represented the Club at the Champion Lifesaver Day on February 27th. This LSV-run Youth event brought together leading youth from different clubs to establish friendships and expand their perspectives by exposing them to theory and practical scenarios, including a visit from the rescue helicopter in a bid to inspire the next generation of outstanding lifesavers and club leaders. Both Phoebe and Mac had engaging experiences and I am looking forward to watching their further development over the next few seasons.

Ellie Morgan and Olivia Hope represented the Club at the LSV U13 and U15 Camps respectively. These camps provided an opportunity for youth members to develop their leadership, interpersonal and teamwork skills whilst also broadening their understanding of lifesaving. Both Ellie and Olivia thought the teamwork and leadership training were fantastic, developed many new friendships and returned excited at the opportunities that lifesaving could provide them.

The Club had 14 Nippers compete in large surf and challenging

conditions over the Labour Day long weekend in Warrnambool for the Nipper State Championships. Unfortunately, the pandemic restrictions limited the championships to U12 and U13 competitors only. Overall, we finished fourth on the club point score, only just behind third which was a fantastic result for our team. The unusually large surf really tested competitors and made for some exciting moments for Nippers and parents alike.

Our Nippers demonstrated their considerable skill, fitness and passion for the surf, and as always, the event provided a great opportunity for Club members to bond together and deepen friendships right across the whole weekend. I would like to congratulate each of our competitors, and thank their parents and siblings, our water safety officers (Matilda McIntyre, Charlotte McKenzie, Naantali Marshall), age group managers (Tim Farrow, Adam Martin, Ivor Morgan, Sam Hume), officials (Shem Fitzgerald, Ben Gilbert, Barb and Jim Morgan and Mike Martin), coaches (Ivor Morgan (head coach), Naantali Marshall, Matt Taylor and Sam Hume) and our team manager Yvette Morgan for their efforts over the weekend and over the season. A special thank you to Ross Peasnell who also assisted with coaching for the first time this season, passing on many valuable lessons our youth successfully implemented in their racing.

One week later a non-LSV event, the Nipper Surf Sports Development Carnival, was run for the U9-U11 age groups at Cosy Corner. It was the sole opportunity for U9-U11s to compete for the season, and as such was an unofficial state championship. We had 11 competitors competing with many great results that bode well for the future of the competition team. Summer Morgan was the stand-out performer of the event winning the point score for the U11 girls after a clean sweep in the water area events.

Overall, the Youth area has found new ways to adapt and develop in the unprecedented and challenging circumstances of the pandemic. For next season, it is my hope that we can build on our progress and continue to make a meaningful contribution to the development of our youth, our Club and our local community, for the mutual benefit of each.

With their support and inclusion, it allows us to run a smooth sailing and fun program for all our participants.

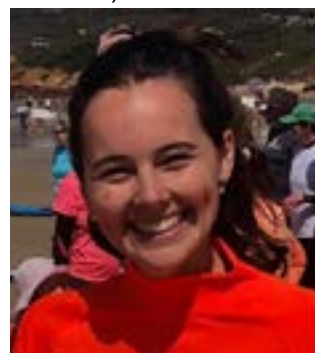

Both also competed at the Australian Championships with Marli placing 4th. Boat Section Report

Following a year in which we reached a low point in surfboat competition with several members either retiring or moving to other clubs in 2019/2020 our membership numbers and crews recovered significantly during the season – despite restricted activity because of the pandemic. In December we benefited from the transfer of three leading crews while also starting to see some traction from our 'Come & Try' days with new members joining the Club to take on surfboat rowing.

We were fortunate to have one of the State's leading coaches and sweeps, Scott Tannahill, join Anglesea contributing significantly to our boat performances. In addition, we also welcomed another experienced sweep, Scott Hastie to our ranks. Scott has previous experience at Kirra and Torquay and has taken on coaching and sweeping an U19 Women's Crew and an additional one or two Male Reserves crew for next season.

Many of these new crew members also have considerable lifesaving experience and will add considerable assets to our patrolling capability.

As mentioned, Scott Tannahill has elevated Anglesea's surfboat performances to make it a leading competitor in competition, with great prospects for the next season.

A summary of the crews' performances since December is provided below:

Open Men's Crew ('Pirates')

After being denied their last season in Under 23 and no preseason because of the COVID lockdowns, the boys decided to take on Reserve Grade. A Gold medal at the State Titles made up for a somewhat short turbulent season.



Open Women's crew ('Lightning')

A late start to the season did not stop the girls using their years of top level experience to take out the other elite crews to gain selection to represent Victoria at the ASRL Interstate Championships where they did The Big V proud.

A mid-season crew change saw Jess having to step out due to career improvement and Bec come in. The crew is planning a massive campaign next season including taking on the George Bass Marathon where they will be defending Champions and then, follow up with leading our team to the Aussies in Perth.



U19 Men's Crew ('Storm')

As with all our crews, our U19's had lost a year and no preseason training. This did not stop them winning every heat and final in the State including Gold at the States and representing Victoria at the ASRL Interstate Championships. Next season the boys will again be in Under 19..... Look Out!



Competition was restricted in Victoria this season due to COVID-19 although the Victorian Surf Rowers League (VSRL) played a major role in 'kick-starting' competition in December 2020. An important innovation was the introduction of a reduced competition format for craft (skis, boards, and boats) which proved very successful. The first of these was held at Anglesea at the end of January and this also enabled many local clubs to experience our new club facilities. The shortened carnival format was also well received given that many clubs are required to cover long travel distances to compete on the day.

In conclusion, the outlook for our boat section is very positive but success means a lot of hard work for all involved, sweeps, crews, and support staff. I would emphasise the tremendous commitment of our sweeps. In the case, Scott Tannahill and Scott Hastie for their outstanding commitment to training and supporting their crew members (often involving very early starts several mornings a week in Melbourne and Surf Coast). Their efforts need to be recognised and commended.

I would like to thank all those who came back for another season, and those who put their hand up for the first time, and gave up their time over the season to make sure it all happened, in particular:

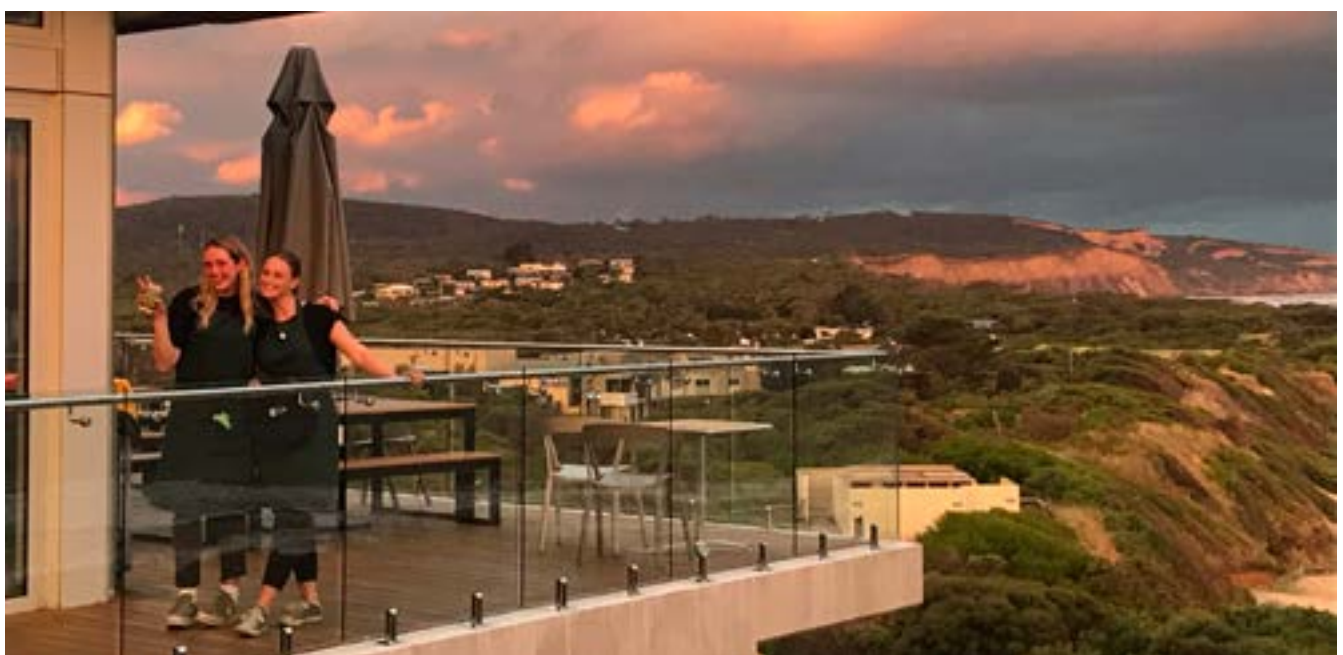

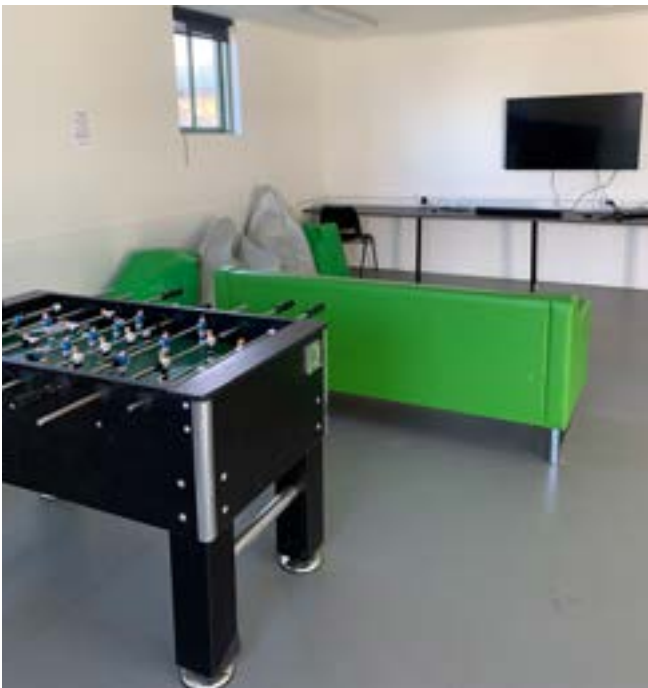


Supporters Group

A Personal reflection by Ron Canale on his relationship with Gavin and the effect it had on his life.

'I first met Gavin when he was appointed to coach the St Mark's U17 football team. From the outset he was a revelation to all of us who had never met someone so driven for our team and individual players to succeed. Gavin was a strong disciplinarian who developed a personal relationship with each player in an attempt to advance that person's future aspirations in life as well as sport. Gavin introduced us to a level of training that we had never achieved before and molded us into a coherent team – orientated group.

Gavin was the reason I joined Anglesea Surf Life Saving club.

Towards the end of the footy season Gavin explained that he was Vice Captain of the Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club and that among others, were going to recruit an acquaintance of myself and the Moorefield brothers by the name of Wayne Leslie, who was a champion swimmer and future SLSA R&R Champion with the ASLSC Junior team and later with that team was inducted into the ASLSC Hall of Fame. Gavin asked if we would like to join as a group, become members and undertake a Surf Bronze. We all thought it a good idea and the rest is history. Once I was qualified Gavin introduced me to John Sneesby and I became a junior boatie.

Gavin competed for ASLSC in Senior R&R but never stopped following the group that he recruited through his football coaching.

My connection through Gavin began in 1964 and I can truly say he changed the course of my life and many others by his guidance.'

When 'Gunner' was awarded ASLSC Life Membership in 2005 this was richly endorsed by those who were fortunate to know 'Gunner'.

'Jimpy' was born in Melbourne and attended Scotch College with his brothers where his love of rowing was fostered, crewing in many fine school boy teams and later at Mercantile Rowing Club. His love of Oarsmanship was lifelong. On leaving Scotch he joined the family business

J. Shears & Sons, wholesale suppliers of pastry cooking essentials, only leaving when business was sold, allowing him to spend his retirement full time in Anglesea.

'Jimpy' was part of the 5th Bronze group at Anglesea : J D Shears, T W Shears, H P Shears, R R Ingpen, A Morton 'Fox', R A G Vines, W Willmott. many were to serve ASLSC in its early years, Herbert Shears as 3rd Club President, Bob Ingpen as the Club Mural painter.

His memory of ASLSC members was prodigious, his recall of names, faces, clubhouse events and deeds on the beach were always told with relish and humor. Ray 'Swampy' Marsh noted in the 10th Annual Report ;"I remember the time 'Jimpy' and myself ran what is now called a Garden Party in the local hall!! Never again !! It took too much living down". 'Jimpy' in the next 60 years never mentioned it! It must have been some party.

During the 1940s there was a cartoon character named 'Jimpy', so John thought that it was a most appropriate name for a man of his talents, so the name 'Jimpy' stayed with him.

The rousing song 'Beer is Best' was first sung by Doug Francis and 'Jimpy' still lives on at Anglesea SLSC.

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The directors have determined that the company is not a reporting entity and accordingly, this financial report is a special purpose report prepared for the sole purpose of distributing a financial report to members and must not be used for any other purpose. The directors have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention, except for certain assets, which, as noted, have been written down to fair value as a result of impairment. Unless otherwise stated, the accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the prior year.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

Inventories acquired at no cost or for nominal consideration are measured at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is initially recorded at the cost of acquisition less, if applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure that the carrying amount is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the utilisation of the assets and the subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in estimating recoverable amounts.

Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful debt has been created.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company that remain unpaid at 30 April 2021. Trade payables are recognised at their transaction price. They are subject to normal credit terms and do not bear interest.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.
Revenue from the rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the services to customers.
Revenue from commissions is recognised upon delivery of services to customers.

Financial Statements

Revenue from interest is recognised using the effective interest rate method.
Revenue from dividends is recognised when the entity has a right to receive the dividend.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax

Transactions are recognised net of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

Grants

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when the entity receives the grant, when it is probable that the entity will receive the economic benefits of the grant and the amount can be reliably measured.

If the grant has conditions attached which must be satisfied before the entity is eligible to receive the grant, the recognition of the revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

Where the entity incurs an obligation to deliver economic value back to the grant contributor, the transaction is considered a reciprocal transaction and the revenue is recognised as a liability in the balance sheet until the required service has been completed, otherwise the income is recognised on receipt.

Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for a nominal or zero value. These assets are recognised at their fair value on the date of acquisition in the balance sheet, with an equivalent amount of income recognised in the income statement.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Government Grants

Government grants received are recognised as revenue on a basis to match the recognition of revenue with costs incurred in the project.

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

Provisions are measured using the best estimate available of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue from interest is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Revenue from dividends is recognised when the entity has a right to receive the dividend.

We conducted our review in accordance with Standard on Review Engagements ASRE 2400 *Review of a Financial Report Performed by an Assurance Practitioner Who is Not the Auditor of the Entity*, in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, anything has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the financial report is not presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the recognised accounting principles and procedures. ASRE 2400 requires us to comply with the requirements of the applicable code of professional conduct of a professional accounting body.

A review of a financial report consists of making enquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Financial Statements - Foundation

Independence

In conducting our review, we have complied with the independence requirements of the Australian professional accounting bodies.

Other Matter-Subsequent Event-potential impact of COVID-19 Outbreak

I draw attention to subsequent events surrounding the COVID-19 outbreak that have had an impact on the financial markets after reporting date. This event may cause a financial impact not currently disclosed in the financial statements and I am not able to determine any result from this abnormal event.

My opinion is not qualified in respect of this matter.

Basis for qualified opinion

Receipts are a source of revenue for the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Foundation Pty Ltd. It is impracticable to establish controls over the collection of these revenue streams prior to the entry in its financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us regarding this revenue is limited, our review procedures with respect to receipt's has been restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. We are therefore unable to express an opinion on whether receipts and obtained by Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Foundation Pty Ltd are complete.

Qualified Opinion

Based on our review which is not an audit, except for the effects on the financial report of such adjustments, if any, as might have been required had the limitation on our audit procedures referred to in the *Basis for qualified opinion* paragraph not existed, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the 30 April 2021 financial report of the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Foundation Pty Ltd does not present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Foundation Pty Ltd as at 30 April 2021, and of its financial performance for the year ended on that date, in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards.

Basis of accounting and restriction on distribution

Without modifying our conclusion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Foundation Pty Ltd to meet the requirements of the Foundation's rules. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
