## FROM CUBS TO BEARS



MY THREE YEARS OF JUNIOR R&R BEGAN WHEN I JOINED THE CLUB AS AN U16 MEMBER IN 1962 AND GAINED A SURF LIFE SAVING QUALIFYING CERTIFICATE (KNOWN TODAY AS A SURF RESCUE CERTIFICATE).

I attended the Club Annual Dinner in the middle of winter as a young 15 year old with legends such as Swampy, Smoothie, Llyo, Jimpy, Simba, Sneesby, Mo, and many others, all resplendent in Club blazers and white shirts. I particularly remember John Ashenhurst (Club logo designer) and Ajax, arriving after football in Tongalla, exhausted but suitably rehydrated.

'Trap' Robert Morgan, a slightly fiery redhead, had swapped Clubs from Pt Lonsdale, hoping to compete with Mr Worrell's Senior R&R (competition fierce). Swampy then challenged Trap to win a Victorian Junior R&R Title. Trap then asked a few of us if we were interested in Junior R&R. Training started the next day and a Victorian second place in 1964 was obtained.

In 1964/65, with some changes in personnel and more training we gained a First Place at the Victorian Titles and qualified for Australian Titles. Trap, with some theatre, presented the Pennant to Swampy, who, calm and relaxed, challenged Trap to win an Australian Title, then finished his beer (no Victorian Club had won an Australian Title in any event at this time). We travelled to



Scarborough in a DC3, refuelled at Adelaide (head winds) and gained a very credible Third Place. Our team of Peter White, David Young, Doug Solly, Grahame Fletcher, Steve Dyson and Michael McConnell were now recognised.

In 1965/66, another slight personnel change, and I was the only survivor from 63/64 team. More training, again a first place at the Victorian Titles, and off to Coolangatta for the Aussies. Trap's fulltime involvement in Senior R&R, led him to recruit Big Pip, John Fidler, as coach. We trained on Coolangatta's beach, with the instructions to 'Train as Winners'. On the day of the competition Mr Worrell gave a motivation speech, (as only Wozza could), and we marched onto the arena believing we were winners, and we were – Gold! This was only the second Australian Title won by a Victorian Club, which is probably not given the recognition it deserves.

This Title was very much Trap's Title, as without him and his Wolseley, there would have been no team.

## Building Redevelopment

*Update  
September 2018*

Since the last broadsheet in June we have finalised the detailed design and documentation and have just received a new cost estimate from the quantity surveyors of \$5M to \$5.6M dependent on which options we choose.

In parallel and under the guidance of our project managers, the PDS Group, we are currently working through satisfying various requirements as stipulated in the Planning Approval and Coastal Management Consent.

As set out in previous newsletters we have a Project Governance framework that identifies a series of decision

gates to ensure members' interests and process transparency are observed and maintained. A key decision point is where we sit financially before going to tender. We are currently at \$3.6M and continue to investigate further funding options so if you are considering contributing, now is the time to get in touch with our Fundraising Chair, Ingilby Dickson on 0425 233 300.

## Liberal Nationals pledge \$500k

**BEACH SAFETY**

After a chilly winter, spring has finally arrived along with some much warmer weather! Everyone is looking forward to getting back down to the beach to enjoy some sunshine and beautiful beach days.

As with any time of the year, the beach still has risks:

- 1 Please remember that voluntary patrols and lifeguards are not back on duty until December, so it is unlikely that rescue services will be available to help you if you get into trouble while swimming.**
- 2 Never swim alone! Always swim with a friend or have someone watching you while you swim.**
- 3 If you choose to swim and find yourself caught in a rip remember to swim parallel to the beach to swim out of the rip and then swim back to shore (never swim directly against the rip).**
