His service has been recognised by Surf Life Saving Australia with a 25yr, 50yr and 60yr service award.

When it came to competition, Geoff was quite the swimming force. In one of the Club's great traditions of Belt Swimming at a Torquay carnival in the 60's against a top field in tricky surf, he was the only swimmer to make it to the buoys.

He was also a member of the Club's prestigious R&R teams that medalled at the Victorian State Titles in 60/61, 61/62 & 65/66.

This man has not only been a vital cog in fundraising and club development, but he is also one of those Characters that makes a club truly great.

Happy to communicate with every element of the Club, Geoff has always made everyone welcome and always been there to support everybody.

### DEMONS BLUFF CLOSURE

Following the temporary closure of the Demons Bluff beach in Anglesea, a decision has now been made to permanently close the beach. This was determined due to the significant public safety risk that landslides pose along this section of cliffed coastline.

This was a unanimous decision made by the Great Ocean Road Coast and Parks Authority, Parks Victoria and the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning and follows independent geotechnical advice.

There is temporary signage currently in place at all formal and informal access points informing beach users of the closure. Permanent signage will be installed in the near future.

# DEMAND FOR SURF LIFESAVING SERVICES UNDER PRESSURE

The need for increased volunteer lifesaving services will continue to come under pressure this season following record drownings in 2020/21.

Life Saving Victoria (LSV) reported that over 3.8million people visited our beaches over the past season compared with 2.3million in the 2019/20 period, and tragically, 51 deaths also occurred. According to LSV, these deaths were the highest number of drownings on record. This was largely attributed to restrictions on international travel (and travel more generally) because of COVID-19 and the consequent increased numbers of visitors to local beaches. Of great concern, was the increase in people swimming in unpatrolled coastal areas which stretched rescue services to the limit.

At the same time, the number of rescues rose to 602 in 2020/21 from 497 in the 2019/20 season highlighting the importance of volunteer lifesaving services delivered by our surf lifesavers. The fact that there were no deaths involving swimmers who remained between the patrol flags demonstrated the important role that lifeguards, and our volunteer patrol members perform to keep our community safe. Our Club's patrol activities and training programs, from Nippers to senior members, are key to developing surf awareness and skills to enable us to carry out our role. At the same time our responsibilities extend to ensuring that we can provide guidance and education for all beach goers.

We are likely to see a repeat of these challenges and pressures from increased visitor numbers to Anglesea this season and will need to increase our patrols and introduce new active members if we are to cope with the greater demand for our services.

This message is to ask everyone to support Anglesea SLSC and encourage more members to become 'active' and participate in our lifesaving and community safety programs. We need more young people to get involved, as well as increased funding to ensure that we have the best rescue service resources get the job done.

In the meantime, we look forward to seeing you on our beach and at our Club this summer.

### NIPPER REGISTRATIONS OPEN 1st OCTOBER

Planning is under way for this year's Nipper & Starfish Programs. Registrations will open on 1st October so don't forget that you **MUST** have your memberships finalised **BEFORE** you can register for the Nipper/Starfish program.

### How do I know if my family's memberships have been finalised?

Once your memberships have been finalised renewals, payment and WWCC - you will receive a Membership Confirmation Form in an email which will also contain your Nipper registration password. You Membership Confirmation form must be uploaded into the Nipper registration so make sure you save it onto your computer.

### Why is there a \$25 Nipper registration fee?

Our Nipper program provides the foundations for future lifesavers. To ensure the continuity of this incredible program we need to be able to repair and replace equipment. Our Nippers also receive a nipper pack with their rashie & tee shirt and with Covid impacting the club's ability to fundraise over the last 18 months a \$25 Nipper fee has been introduced to assist in bridging these costs to the club. We appreciate your understanding and support on this matter and cannot wait to get back to training these future lifesavers.

With recent wintery conditions and continued lockdown restrictions, summer feels a long way away. However, the Club has commended preparations for this year's Nipper Program. Now, more than ever, we need something to look forward to!

If you are unsure, check with the Club Office. You will need your SLSA Members Area username and password to access the LSV Members Training Portal for online theory and to book into a practical Skills Maintenance session.

# **HISTORY - ANGLESEA SLSC BOAT SHED**

On Saturday May 1st 2021 there was an exceptionally low tide at the Anglesea main beach, many different features occurred that hadn't been seen for many years - if ever.

A deep channel with a notable rip appeared near rocks below the Clubhouse and just west of the river mouth, at the edge of the waterline a rocky ledge with rock pools as sand had been eroded. In one of the rock pools was found a handmade concrete brick. This brick was of the style made by ASLSC Members in 1956 for their boatshed. This boatshed was completed by Easter in 1956, but unfortunately there were massive high tides during July & August 1956 and the boatshed was destroyed. Luckily the Club's boat the 'Meldrum' was not in the shed at the time.
