# **Beach Safety**

Spring has arrived and it has brought some beautiful warm weather with it! If you are planning to head down to the beach, remember to take care as the beach has many risks regardless of the time of year:

- 1 Lifesavers will be back on duty from 30th November, so where possible always swim between the red and yellow flags as this is the safest part of the beach.
- If you're planning a beach trip before lifesavers are back on duty remember to always swim with a friend, as rescue services will not be readily available to assist you if required.
- 3 Beaches have many risks; remember to read all the signage at the beach entrance prior to entering the water to ensure you're aware of hazards (such as strong currents, rocks and unstable cliffs).

# HALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS

WE ARE CURRENTLY SEEKING NOMINATIONS FROM CURRENT FINANCIAL MEMBERS FOR ATHLETES, COACHES AND CONTRIBUTORS TO BE PUT FORWARD TO THE HALL OF FAME SELECTION COMMITTEE.

In order to maintain the integrity of the Hall of Fame the following criteria has been established for nominations. Nominees must exemplify the highest standards of:

- Sportsmanship,
- Integrity, and
- Character.

All candidates will be judged on their significant and or long-term contributions to Anglesea SLSC competition. The nominee must have been a financial member of Anglesea SLSC for at least 7 years.

Individuals and teams may be nominated from three categories:

## 1. ATHLETE

Any person or teams who have distinguished himself/herself at the highest level in the field of Surf Life Saving competition while a member at Anglesea SLSC.

# 2. COACH

Any coach with at least 7 years coaching experience. Criteria for consideration should be based on accomplishments that merit state, national or international recognition or significant contributions to the competition programs at Anglesea SLSC.

## 3. CONTRIBUTOR

An individual who has made outstanding contributions to the competition programs at Anglesea SLSC other than coaching and competing for a period of 7 years.

All nominations received must contain active and current address and contact information for the nominee (or family if deceased).

In addition to the official nomination form, the following materials should be submitted for an individual or teams consideration:

 A letter of recommendation from the person making the nomination and other letters of support from appropriate individuals who can validate or substantiate information related to their SLSC career or contributions of the nominee.

AFTER ABOUT 10 YEARS OF PLANNING, SEEKING LEASES AND PERMITS AND FUNDRAISING WE WERE FINALLY ABLE TO SIGN A CONTRACT FOR THE REDEVELOPMENT IN EARLY JULY WITH WORKS OFFICIALLY COMMENCING ON 15TH JULY.

For those who have not seen the site, the old building is well and truly gone and the contractors, FourSquare Constructions have to date:

- Undertaken preliminary works to maintain services to the second building;
- Demolished the old clubhouse;
- · Completed the piling works; and

 At the time of writing, commenced the excavation down to the lower ground level.

We expect the project to take around 12 months and the contractors are currently about 20 days ahead of schedule.

You will have seen that Captain Moonlite is operating but there will be a period next year when they will be closed as the new and existing buildings are integrated. In the meantime please remember that parking is significantly compromised so plan accordingly.

- New members will complete an Induction Program prior to the Bronze Camp

## **Advanced Award Training**

- LSV are currently offering Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART)\* and Frist Aid courses in Melbourne and other locations around the state. (see LSV Member Training from Anywhere for details)
- We will also be offering advanced award training in Anglesea during the summer period. The priority is delivering qualifications to members who have a strong patrol record. (see ASLSC Website for details)
- It is no longer possible to requalify ART and all existing holder must resit the entire course this season if they wish to remain proficient

#### **Skills Maintenance (Requal)**

Skills Maintenance is the process that Award holders must undertake to ensure that their qualifications remain current.

Bronze Medallion, SRC, IRBD, IRBC and Resuscitation (HLTAID001) must all be requalified annually

Other Advanced Awards need to be requalified on two or three year cycles.

If you wish to complete, patrol or complete Water Safety then you must requalify before the 30/12/19

Requalification dates are available via the Club website and online theory for all awards can be completed now via LSV Member Training from Anywhere for details

# Rescue Services **UPDATE**



THE 2019-2020 PATROL SEASON WILL COMMENCE ON 30 NOVEMBER 2019 AND RUN THROUGH TO 13 APRIL 2020. PATROLS WILL BE OPERATING EVERY SATURDAY AFTERNOON, SUNDAY AND PUBLIC HOLIDAY (EXCLUDING CHRISTMAS DAY) BETWEEN THESE DATES.

We are looking forward to seeing everyone out over summer patrolling the beach. Please remember to register for patrols before attending as there are only 20 spaces on each patrol. You can register for patrol through the Anglesea SLSC website under the 'rescue' section. You are required to complete a minimum of 3 hours and be actively involved in a set up or pack up in order for your hours to be counted.

Please remember bring along your bathers, patrol shorts, shirt and skull cap as when you are patrolling you are required to wear these, including wearing your skull cap on your head. In addition, don't forget to bring along a drink bottle, towel and wetsuit. If it's your first patrol, please let your Patrol Captain on the day know, as they will provide you with a set of patrol uniform for you to keep.

If you are interested in joining Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) please reach out to Emily King (Anglesea SLSC Patrol Coordinator) on 0400 771 512, as we are always looking for new committed members.

ASR is a group of our most loyal and dedicated patrolling members, who ensure that Anglesea Main Beach is patrolled at all times during the volunteer patrol season, ensuring all awards are covered and LSV and SLSA minimum requirements are always met. It provides a great opportunity to continue to develop lifesaving and leadership skills.
