TITLE: Craft Allocation Policy

PURPOSE

To ensure all Anglesea SLSC members understand that basis of the allocation of Club owned equipment.

PREAMBLE

Anglesea SLSC owns a large amount of competition craft. These craft have been purchased by the club for the use of members. Because there are more members than numbers of craft this policy for its allocation has been developed.

POLICY OPERATION

Anglesea SLSC purchases craft that can be allocated to its members to develop their fitness and competition skills as well as acting as tool to retain them as members for the long term.

It is the clubs policy to provide opportunities to its under 21 members to access these craft in preference to "Open" and "Masters" competitors. This policy is based on premise that the majority of "Open" and "Masters" competitors are working and should therefore be able afford their own craft. This applies to the allocation of nipper boards, racing boards and single skis. It does not apply to the allocation of double ski's.

CRITERIA FOR ALLOCATION OF CLUB CRAFT

1. Members must show that they are in "Training" and are following a documented program
2. Members must attend a minimum of 75% club training sessions (May-November)
3. Members must attend a minimum of one club training session per month (December-March)
4. Members must attend a minimum of 75% club fundraising functions
5. Members must attend a minimum of 75% sectional training sessions
6. Members must attend a minimum of 75% Victorian "State" carnivals for the season
7. Members must attend the Victorian State Championships (Junior and/or Senior)

DEFINITIONS

Club Training – refers to Anglesea SLSC club training, which involves the entire competition team. These are conducted once each month from May to November. This increases to once a week between December-March.

Club Fundraising Functions – refers to the core Anglesea SLSC fundraisers: Door Knock, Golf Day & Rock2Ramp.



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Sectional Training – refers to sectional organised training sessions at any location where an Anglesea SLSC program is delivered. E.g. Ski or Board Training

SELECTION PROCESS

A panel consisting of the Director of Surf Sport, Competition Team Manager and Ocean Manager shall assess all applications for craft on a case by case basis.

Members are required to fill out and submit an “Application for Craft Allocation” form.

A weighting of 25% shall be applied to previous results, 25% to current level of training, 25% to commitment to non-competition duties and 25% to the panel’s discretion.

Where exceptional circumstances prevent the above criteria being met, competitors will need to justify why they should be allocated craft. Each case will be individually considered as per the selection process taking into consideration these extenuating circumstances.

Please note: *The selection panel decision is final and there is no right to appeal the decision until the next competition season.*

Submissions must be made prior to 1st October of each season*

****Note:*** *Craft allocation is done on a season by season basis. Allocated craft must be returned to the club at the end of the competition season.*
