The 65th Annual General Meeting on Sunday 7th August saw a significant change in the management of ASLSC in that a much younger cohort of members took on key positions.

In opening the meeting retiring President Warren Clarke thanked members for their support over the past two years and acknowledged the efforts of the Board and Committee members in continuing to position Anglesea as a leader in surf lifesaving in Victoria. Tom outlined his vision for the future with a focus on making a great club greater by focusing on key areas including governance and risk management to ensure we continue to serve the community and our members at the highest possible level.

In presenting the annual accounts Finance Director Richard Carr noted that the club had had another strong year financially and that the ASLSC Foundation continued to provide valuable financial support. Peter Williams updated those present on the proposed re-development of the lower clubhouse advising that the plans were currently being revised in response to member and community feedback. He noted that the club anticipated re-submitting the applications for coastal consent and planning approval within the next few weeks. He also advised that in addition to the \$1.5M State Government grant that the club had received there was another \$1M in pledges towards the redevelopment. Retiring Club Captain and Life Member Matt Solly, on behalf of the Life Members, recommended Prue Weber for Life Membership outlining her outstanding service to the club over many years particularly in preserving the history of ASLSC. This nomination was approved by acclamation. It was also noted that Prue had been awarded Life Membership of Life Saving Victoria at the recent Awards of Excellence.
