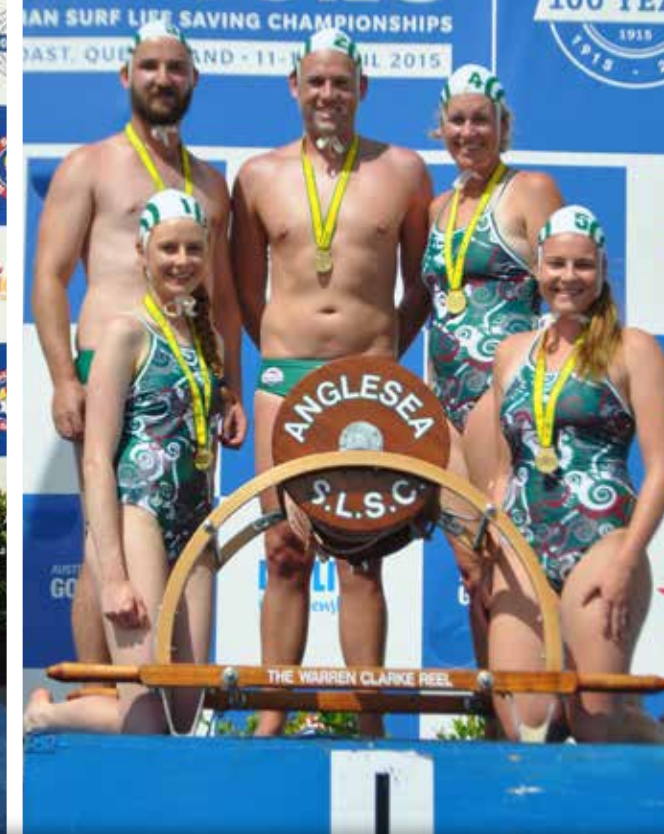

President's Report

The 2014/2015 season has come to an end and what a successful year it was for the Club. As for many years, Ingilby Dickson, with the support of Prue Weber and Jim Geary, will present the great story of the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club over the last twelve months.

As a Club we are blessed with the calibre of members, supporters & sponsors, committee members and directors who donate many hours of their valuable time and resources to ensure we continue as a leading Australian and Victorian surf lifesaving club.

Sincere thanks to the board members for the dedication to their respective club portfolios, which are strong across all facets of the Club; to the volunteers who dedicated their time with outstanding achievements; and a special thanks to Peter Williams, our unofficial full time club manager, who seems to accumulate roles and tasks even when on holidays interstate. Thank you Peter for being an outstanding mentor and support to me and the Board.

The core function of the Club is patrolling and aquatic education. As a club we continue to raise the standard of every member so that they are not only prepared for the beach but able to use their skills in rescue, CPR and first aid in every day life. The Rescue Services team and patrol members under the direction of David Simpson and Tom Cullen have certainly raised the bar from dedicated patrol captains to our 'Rookies' (surf rescue certificate). A highlight over the season is the active participation of patrols with simulated rescues and first aid scenarios. Member skill development and skill retention is a winner as opposed to disengaged patrol members, leading to boredom.

There were many rescues and first aid cases this season. An example of the skills of the lifesaver teamwork was highlighted at an incident outside core patrol hours when a phone call was received by Dianne Feudoloff of two swimmers in trouble. The sea was big with strong rips and crashing surf. Matt Solly, Ross Peasnell and

Tom Penney completed their rescue with the support Victoria Police and Ambulance Victoria.

The Club has incredible trainers and educators supported by Tim Mason and the Chief Instructors. Almost every day during summer there was some form of requalification or award project happening. I can confidently say the skill level of our young trainers and educators is of a very high standard and their skills could be easily transferred into business and industry.

The Club is at an important milestone where its future direction is being prioritised through an updated Strategic Plan. A significant amount of work has gone into this project and I thank John Turner with his SWOT analysis used as a reference; Vice President Lloyd Simpson with his corporate knowledge; and members representing various sections of the club. Our facilitator, Les Taylor, coordinated strategic planning workshops and follow-up meetings, and has drafted a detailed document for presentation to members.



A major project which aligns to the strategic plan is the new building upgrade. There are two sub-committees managing this project, 'Finance and Communication' coordinated by Peter Foster and Heather Hunt; and 'Building Management Group' coordinated by Andrew Suttle. The Club has commenced a range of complex and costly processes as we pursue the planning permit. The director of facilities, Kevin Rigg has coordinated a number of projects this year. An important achievement is the power source upgrade to the Club which will address



the frequent tripping of the fuses over the peak summer period and underpin the requirements when the building upgrade is achieved.

This year brought the formation of the Anglesea SLSC Supporters Group with Geoff 'Simba' Inman taking up the role of Chairman. In summary, the group support the club through a range of activities including social and networking, fundraising and sponsorship, support to local members and activities that align to key Club strategic initiatives. Vice President Emma Moore is the communication link between the Board and the Supporters Group.

On behalf of the Club, I'd like to thank Rachael Keeble for her second year coordinating a successful 'Club Door Knock'. It was a testing year as the date was changed at late notice due to thunder and lightening but that did not deter the dedicated members collecting. The Anglesea community is very supportive of the Club and we appreciate their generosity.

Both the 'Bursons - Rock 2 Ramp' coordinated by Race Director Tom Cullen and the 'Golf Day' coordinated by Shane Edmonds and Mark Gowans ably supported by spinning wheel legend Adrian McNaughton, were again supported by many members with great successes. Thank you to the sponsors and members who helped in key roles to ensure the events continued to be a success for the Club. Special mention to John 'Jimmy' Shears for his

continued prime role as senior security manager and bouncer stationed at the Harding's van.

Nippers and Starfish continue to grow with the support of parents and water safety members. We welcomed Frazer Macvean in his first year as 'Big Nipper' and support to David Kay. At the Starfish presentation day I observed the strong link between participants, their water safety mentors and parents. Janet Jones has been outstanding in pulling this project together and I believe many clubs around Australia have contacted Janet to replicate the program.

We have some great Club sponsors who are listed in this report. A special acknowledgement to Alcoa who has been a long-time supporter of the Anglesea community and the Anglesea SLSC, and, although Alcoa is closing down in Anglesea, we trust the special relationship will continue. The Club acknowledges Federal Member for Corangamite, Sarah Henderson, who strongly promotes lifesaving with her political peers; the Surf Coast Shire & Mayor, Councillor Margot Smith; and Rod Goring, Coastal Reserves Manager of the Great Ocean Road Committee (GORCC), and look forward to continued close working relationships.

The Club remains in a solid financial position. We are grateful to Richard Carr who joined the Board as Director of Finance for his detailed financial reports, presentations and work on the ASLSC Foundation which have been outstanding.

The partnerships with Mentone LSC (competition) and Port Melbourne LSC (central metropolitan hub) continue to provide value-added strengths for the Club. Anglesea competition section has had another outstanding year under the direction of Director Competition, Angela Brennan, and Team Manager, Kevin Rigg, and sectional captains. Congratulations to officials, coaches and competitors who have represented the Club throughout the year and our Australian representatives in Junior, Open and Masters. Overall results are included in this report. Outstanding achievements in open competition are gold medallists Saxon Beale in U17 Flags; the Open Mixed R&R Team; and the U17 R&R Team (for a second year in a row).

Moving forward, it is important that Club committee roles continue to be spread over a broad base of the membership and I encourage any member who is eligible for any of these roles to approach the committee where they will be welcomed and provided with support and mentoring. The role could be any value-added activity that supports the Club, so please don't hesitate coming forward.

Thank you members and sponsors for being part of a wonderful and highly respected Club that continues to grow with the community, and is part of a highly respected Surf Lifesaving Australia family.

The café has just finished its first year of its two year extension that we reported in last year's Annual report and with a continuation of excellent services through to the Bar and Café. Services throughout winter have continued with the café open from Thursday through to Sundays and have now developed a good local community clientele which is what we wanted to achieve and be embed into our community. The Deck Café has also supported a number of events and weddings which continue to be good fundraisers for the club which during the autumn and spring period continue to be well and truly booked. Sometimes we create some inconvenience for the club with weddings happening on weekends with others training in

spring in particular, but we hopefully will try and get the balance right between gaining income and providing the facilities for our club members.

The shop has been well managed again by Tina Kay providing a great consistent and reliable service and ensuring all apparel and almost all merchandising requirements are coordinated to ensure that we get the best value for our club. The sales were on par with last year yet represented a slightly higher stock value we had in the annual accounts. Otherwise Tina continues to provide innovative and an excellent range for our club and the shop also provides help and assistance for other Administration functions particularly during the summer period for event registration and other activities.

I would just like to comment on the excellent accounting and compliance that we have through Di managing our office with good support from Judy Sutherland. Richard Carr is also now the Finance Director we have seen some changes in the way the Financial reporting takes place with the use of Quickbooks and Di has adapted those changes to continue to improve the way our accounts are presented.

I am looking forward to helping and assisting with the Administration role again in the forthcoming season. I would also like to thank Adam Lana who has designed and printed this report since 2009. the assistance of Colin Anderson, for ensuring our equipment is continually repaired and operational for training and patrols and to Lloyd Simpson for guaranteeing our First Aid supplies are fully stocked and regularly replenished.

Thank you for the ongoing support from all of our Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) members for another excellent season. This year we saw several new Captains take charge of their own patrol; Isaak Newcombe, Rosie Anderson, Ash Smith & Mieke Foster. It is essential that we, as a club, continue to encourage and support our own members who wish to stand up and become leaders on the beach. Thank you also, to the ongoing leadership from our other ASR captains. To all of the members in ASR, your time and commitment to ensuring our club continues to meet the LSV patrol requirements is greatly valued.

This year we introduced several new initiatives to continue improving our patrols and the standard of how we perform them. Firstly we re-introduced the captains, vice captains and mentors handbook. This is designed as an information booklet, resource and a checklist to assist each of you with the knowledge that is required to be a leader and perform patrols to a high standard. We introduced the mentor program for each Patrol Captain and by extension, their patrol members. The aim is to ensure the wellbeing of the Patrol Captain and to improve their skills through offering assistance, guidance

and a point of contact with a highly experienced club member and a support network. We also introduced and highly encouraged greater 'on patrol training' through scenarios, mentoring from ASR members and skill development. These initiatives will continue to be a focus in the coming years with ever increasing demands placed on us by LSV and SLSC and high expectations from the public.

This season ASLSC members manned the beach for a total of 5,667.5 hours over 47 different patrols. With a major focus on increasing on-patrol training and development of our core lifesavers, the Anglesea Surf Rescue group, and all members alike, it ensures the Anglesea Main Beach continues to be a safe beach for all members of the public. This year our lifesavers performed 1,808 preventative actions, which averted major rescues having to be performed on the beach. We performed 44 first aids, including 5 major first aids ranging from bone breaks and dislocations to major wounds. Thank you to every member who assisted on one or many of our patrols. A special thank you to our members whose commitment, above all, greatly assisted our club in its success this season. Our members who patrolled 30 or more hours, almost double the expected minimum hours (16 hours) asked of them.

Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) had a very successful season with a brilliant commitment from members, taking our total number of participants to 71 members this season, across 7 patrols.

ASR is a core group of patrolling members who, as a group, have all the qualifications necessary to patrol the beach, ensuring we meet all LSV and SLSA requirements every weekend, and are the only members who are rostered on to patrols at Anglesea SLSC. On average each ASR member completes an average of 42.5 hours for the season. A big thank you to each of the patrol captains for their commitment to ASR, their members and ensuring that our beach was supervised for all of our visitors. This season our Patrol Captains were Rosie Anderson, Toby Dickson & Ben Mason, Ash Smith & Mieke Foster, Isaak Newcombe, Ken-Leon Yap and Jack Fry.

This year a number of new initiatives were introduced to support and complement the patrol capacity. This included the introduction of a Mentor program for the Patrol Captains. Beach Coach Report

I began my journey into surf lifesaving forty one years ago in 1974 as a scrawny teenager from Geelong High School. There are too many competition highlights, athletes, coaches, characters and numerous stories to mention here. Some people reflect on National Titles or State Representation as the peak of success and I am certainly honoured to have had those opportunities as an athlete and a coach. But they are only a small part of this extraordinary story that is the Green and White Beachies.

From memory I took on the role of Head Beach Coach at Anglesea in 1989/90 and in the last twenty five years it has been a great privilege to identify, guide, coach and mentor some amazing athletes and to work with some very dedicated coaches all of whom made huge contributions to the athletes and club. All of these experiences have been some of the most memorable moments of my life.

We consider ourselves to be that one event area in Surf Lifesaving, as a Victorian Club, that can take on the big Queensland, NSW and WA clubs and be competitive at all age levels. Throughout this period we as the Anglesea Beach team have had some truly remarkable achievements: with close if not more than ninety national medals; to be the only club in the 100 years of SLS history in one year to make all age division national relay finals (male and female) and to have three athletes represent Australia: Abby Lewtas in S.L.S, Tim Williams and Elly Hutton in Athletics.

At the national championships this year at North Kirra, I was walking back to the track with John Baldock after a warm up session prior to the day's competition ahead. I looked over to John thinking of the thousands of times we had walked up and back to warm up athletes, to officiate, to check results, to congratulate, console our athletes, teams and at times parents, on the many beautiful beaches of this extraordinary country we live in.

This was to be the last time as Head Coach I would walk with John to the competition area where we had shared so many highs and lows. John has been the sounding board when I needed a straight forward opinion and



the type of assistant coach who kept things simple and to the point. Above all what I am most grateful for and proud of is the strong friendship with John that has not only endured but become one of trust, respect and honour. And that indeed has been the greatest of my personal achievements, the friendships and those are the memories that last a lifetime.

The transition for the new Head Coach I hope will be a smooth one, made even more so with the management skills of Adam Martin who in the last two years has created strong connections with the club, athletes and parents regarding training and competitions which has given John and myself more time to focus on coaching.

Over many years of coaching Lloyd Knight as an athlete, then mentoring him as a coach and now this year working with him and his squad, has given me the opportunity to take a small step back and to trust another with the future of the beach team. Our alliance with Mentone LSC grows stronger with John taking training sessions Wednesdays at Mentone with a core group of juniors and Hayley Atkins working with a number of junior club squads, which includes the Mentone girls. The very talented group of U/15 Anglesea-Mentone girls were a huge points gathering group for us at the Victorian Championships, with five in the sprint final and two medal winning relay teams.

We would also like to acknowledge Saxon Beale as the winner of this year's Bruce Thompson

Award as the most successful beach athlete for Anglesea. I believe all event areas and clubs need change, to find different ways forward if they are to engage and develop the next generation of surf life savers. Moving on and letting go is part of that process of renewal. I will continue to work with John, Adam and Lloyd to secure the future of the Anglesea Beach Team and the club in whatever capacity I can. As previously mentioned, these last twenty five years as Head Coach has been an absolute honour and privilege. Thank you to all who have been a part of this incredible journey I have been on. I am blessed and grateful to have had this opportunity to play a small part in the lives of so many wonderful people in surf lifesaving and the Anglesea club.

Anglesea Surf Boat Section Report

Season 2014/2015 proved a successful year for the Anglesea Boat Section.

With 3 sweeps, Joe Bergin, Neil Heathcote and David Eades taking the helm for various carnivals throughout the year, the crews showed potential right throughout the season.

The open Men's crew, Anglesea Gold led the way through the early stages of the season and then broke through, with success in the VSRL Australia Day carnival at St Kilda. The boys thrived on the short double course, using the format to their advantage and taking first place, defeating Rosebud. Anglesea Gold came 4th at our home carnival, and then 3rd at the VSRL open at Lorne. At Shellharbour they logged some great racing in the bank and later they placed 4th at the state titles held at Ocean Grove. The Under 23 men's crew HMAS Oarsome came together early in the season and rowed the Anglesea carnival and then decided to make a day of it at St Kilda, taking out their division and then backed up for a second place in the Reserves to the formidable Mordialloc E-Coli crew. Not to

be outdone, the Under 23 girls, the Hooligans, took 3rd place, and showed they were building to what would be a sensational finish to their season. With 'Fanbelt', David Eades, stepping in the fillies came 4th at Torquay after a solid days work and then won Bronze at the State Titles. The Hooligans and HMAS Oarsome also travelled to the Youth Stampede at Point Leo. The Hooligans finished 4th and the HMAS Oarsome claimed second prize, showing the potential in the younger members of the section. The open women's crew, Anglesea Spirit, competed at Anglesea and St Kilda. Injuries forced some crew changes in the women's crew late in the season and they look forward to a full preseason and competition schedule in 2015/2016. The 260's Men raced at the Vic Masters for a Bronze medal, and travelled to Shellharbour where they brought home the Gold. The 160 Women had some success in the Vic Masters and then again at ASRL Open, where they placed second with some nice silverware from both carnivals.



At the Australian Titles, the boat section had 5 crews make the journey to Queensland. Tuesday saw the 120 women the Wave Runners take on Met Caloundra (the QLD state title winners) and Grange in surf that saw carnage in every race. A fantastic first round, crossing the line in front then a second in the second round despite the crew going for a swim (twice!), earning the crew a Gold medal. The girls saw fit to share the top spot with the crew from QLD, deciding that a count back hardly seemed sporting when the surf was so big and the Qld crew was unavailable to row off the next day. The 260 men the 'Dribblers' swept by Fanbelt had a late round where they put it all on the line, and got through their round cleanly. Lucky for them, they had the points to maintain their position as Barry White had a plane to catch. The 'Dribblers' won Bronze for their efforts. We then moved on to later in the week with the Under 23's and Open men and women competition creating some exciting racing through the heats. The Under 23 ladies and open men made it through to the final day of racing on the Sunday. Anglesea Gold made it to the second round of finals navigating the uneven shoreline. This shoreline was the undoing for the men with an unlucky wave crashing through the boat at the start of the race and the men unable to make up the lost ground. The Under 23 Hooligans attended their first Aussies and proved that their hard work, strength and determination had set them up to progress through the quarter and semi finals which found themselves in the



Australian Surf Life Saving Final. This is the first time in about 10 years since Anglesea has been represented in an Australian final in the boat section. The girls fought hard giving everything they had and leaving nothing in the tank. They came 6th in Australia and we are very proud of their performance. The Hooligans have a bright future ahead of them and we hope to see them come back next year to go a few better.

cancelled due to over booked programs. By way of compensation, members that made the trip up were rewarded with a much utilised day off on the Monday public holiday. At this stage again we should thank the South Curly Surf Club for their gracious hospitality and 'understanding'.

Back in Victoria again we lost Coach Porter to an inhospitable Antarctic Island (South Georgia) and thankfully Rosco 'the big show' stepped up to fill his big shoes. Congratulations should go to Chris (and team) on their amazing and inspirational achievement. Following the Port Fairy carnival in late Feb we commandeered a couple of locals to put on the White and Green, in the form of Mark and Ilona Plant. A warm welcome back goes out to Plants and I'm sure we will can utilize Planty's determination and 'competitive spirt' when appropriate.

For the second consecutive year Ocean Grove held the Victorian State Championships, on the last weekend in March. Those who battled through the heats in cold and windy conditions on Saturday where rewarded with a fine day for the majority of the finals on Sunday. In the cadet areas, many podium results in the U15 Girls section shows promise, alternatively in the U17 section it was the boys who shone- winning gold in their ski relay, taplin, surf teams. In the Junior (U/19) events the way was led by the ski paddlers with the Boys taking out the single, double and ski relay. A special mention should go to Joel 'Saucy' Saunders for being involved in all three golds. In the Women's area, Sarah Bray's season of hard work payed off taking out the U/19 single ski and stepping up in to the open section to win the woman's double





ski (with Maddy Hurst) and combining also with Sophie Conroy to take out silver in the ski relay. Maddy Hurst individually took out the single ski; well and truly putting the pressure on the open Men to continue the ski section dominance.

The clean sweep was nearly off to a shaky start with the Open Mixed Double Ski late on Saturday afternoon, the result coming down to a photo finish- with the decision awarding both Anglesea (T.Penney, M.Hurst) and the Half Moon Bay pair joint Gold Medals. From then on the Men clearly wanted to leave little interpretation for the judges, finishing a wave clear in both the Men's Single (T.Penney) and Men's Double (combining with Sam Phillips). Sam also joined with Edmonds and Penney in the Ski relay (2nd) and finished off the weekend with an impressive 3rd in the single ski, acquiring a gold, silver and bronze. Other notable results in the Open Men's area was a silver in the life saver Relay (qualifying a team for the Australian Titles) and Bronze in the men's surf teams. Just when we thought the Board Section would go home empty handed Joel Simondson and Tim Edmonds pulled out an impressive Gold in the Open Mens Board Rescue. Overall the weekend was a great success for the craft section and pivotal to the magnificent team result for the club of winning the points score for the championships.

Travelling once again to the Gold Coast for the Australian titles in Mid-April, tested athlete's resolve of a long season coupled with the postponement of much Easter celebration. The step up in competition from States to the National Titles is always a dramatic one but this year it seemed accentuated by the

surf conditions and location. Throughout the rounds on Wed- Friday; flat and small surf at Kirra Beach created extremely tight racing in the craft areas, often with little 'ripples' on the way home condensing already extremely close fields. The pace was on from round one, meaning every minor mistake were costly for some. A broad congratulations should go to all athletes that represented the club at the highest level, individuals will no doubt take away lesson to be learned and performances to be built on for the seasons to come. It is not often that the craft section has praise for the Boaties, but in the case of the Life Saver Relay it is warranted - with the Open Men pulling out a huge row coming in clear first in the semi-final, giving us a 10+ second advantage over the top QLD crews. Unfortunately the team finished 5th, not proceeding to the final, but solace is taken in knowing we have a competitive crew to back us in the years to come. Two events in which the club was very proud to be represented in on Sunday was the Open Men's Double and Open Women's Double Ski, with T.Penney and S. Phillips as well as M.Hurst and S.Bray proving they are well placed in the top 16 crews in the country respectively. Although the crews didn't have the final races they would have hoped for, consolation comes in the form of knowing they are within striking distance of the podium in the future.

Once again well done to all athletes on a great season. Thank you to all the supporters, coaches, mentors and parents that make what do possible.

Gallipoli

This event evolved from an idea by NSW surfboat rowers to participate in the Centenary of the ANZAC landings at Gallipoli, Turkey, in April of this year. Given that the surfboats were characteristic of the boats used to land soldiers at ANZAC Cove in 1915 and the fact that many lifesavers were involved in the Gallipoli campaign, an event involving Australian, New Zealand and Turkish crews was a fitting way to commemorate the campaign.

Planning commenced some five years ago with Anglesea one of only two Victorian surf clubs to sign up in 2010 (the other club being Lakes Entrance). We managed to acquire an early design surfboat from Wye River for the event with the intention to leave this boat (as was to be the case for all boats involved) in Turkey for use by local and UK clubs.

Many of the clubs who signed up for the event received widespread community and club support including from local RSL's (and which was also the case for Anglesea).

The surfboat marathon was certainly a once-in-a-lifetime experience with memories which will stay with us forever. Despite a number of obstacles and uncertainties along the way, we wouldn't have missed this for the world!

Some 26 boats, representing 32 clubs (some forming composites) and 50 crews participated.

The Marathon

The race started at Eceabat, directly across the Dardanelles' straits from Cannakale, near the so-called narrows which was the site of the naval battle a month before the ANZAC landings and which precipitated the landings on the western side of the peninsular. We had expected to spend a great deal of time sorting out our boats and preparing them (these had been sent by container a month previously) but were delighted to see them all lined up, rigged and ready to go – a great credit to the ASRL support team and the Turkish boat rowers who had obviously done a great deal of work in preparing them for our arrival.

We started the first leg of the marathon in cold, wet and windy conditions but later as we progressed down the east side of the peninsular, conditions improved and remained so for the next few days. Both legs on the first day were around 12kms and fortunately we were assisted by a trailing current. The first day ended at Morto Bay, the site of the French landing (and it was interesting to find that the French lost more soldiers and sailors here than Australians during the campaign).

The second day involved an 8km leg from Morto Bay to X Beach (Fusilier's landing site on April 25th) just beyond W beach at Cape Helles, the latter being the scene of the slaughter of British troops from the 'River Clyde'.

This was followed by an 11km row to Kum. Conditions were quite benign at this stage and the thing that impressed us was the clarity of the water. Even though metres deep, the sea bottom was exceptionally clear. The other feature that struck us during the journey up till now was how few suitable beaches were available for an assault, with rocks ledges and cliff faces directly up to the water's edge. These made our crew change-overs 'tricky' at times.

The third section on this day was a 6km row from Kum to Brighton Beach (Z Beach) next to Gaba Tepe. From here, after a crew change, we rowed to ANZAC Cove which was the most poignant part of this event and which had the greatest impact. A 'row-in' was arranged together with a surf-boat salute (oars raised) followed by a short service, ode to the fallen, and playing of bag pipes. When we approached the beach from the sea-side, which most people would never have experienced (apart from the original ANZACS), we realised what an impossible task the troops were facing, to scale the cliffs and ridges at ANZAC and North Beach, with the imposing Sphinx, Nek and myriad of gullies facing them. After a row to North Beach and then back to Brighton Beach, we had completed the 65kms or so of the two day row.

The 'Alternative' Dawn Service

While the official government Dawn Service was held at North Beach and Lone Pine on April 25th a separate Dawn Service for surfboat teams and many other tourist groups, together with Turkish communities, was held at Gelibolu



(from which the Gallipoli peninsular derives its name). Gelibolu is around 40 kms north of Eceabat on the eastern side of the peninsular. This was a very special event. In many respects, much more personal than the 'official' ceremony with many hundreds in attendance. What was particularly surprising was how the residents of Gelibolu embraced the service (being held as it was around 3.00/5.00 am on April 25th!) The beach was lit up and donor kebab shops and cafe' were doing brisk business. The service also involved 120 students from Barker College, Sydney, with a 60 piece orchestra and 60 person choir. Their performance at the ceremony was exceptional. Lady Cutler (wife of former Governor General Sir Roden Cutler VC) was special guest with speeches by an Australian military officer and the Mayor of Gelibolu (whose speech was in Turkish and then translated perfectly in English. All of our participants were given a scroll of his speech (translated into both languages. It also occurred to us whether there would be many instances of a country commemorating an 'invader' at an event such as this. It did highlight how friendly and welcoming the Turkish people were to all of us.)

A major part of the service was a 're-enactment' of the landing with 26 boats in 4 waves, landing on the beach at 4.30am – at exactly the time as the landing 100 years ago. The water was as still as I've ever experienced, and the silence plus the splash from the blades in the light from the beach, created a phosphorescent effect. Added to this was the lone piper from the South Curl Curl crew who played 'Amazing Grace' on the journey in. Altogether, the service was something none of us will forget.

ANZAC Day finished for us with a very well supported game of 'two-up' on our cruise

ship which lasted all afternoon, followed by some high quality performances at the bar!

The tour culminated with a gala dinner in Istanbul on April 26th.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all who participated (including James Brathwaite our ex Anglesea member from London, who proved himself a formidable athlete in the boat, the bar and the disco, and David Butt from Broulee who stepped in at the last moment to fill out one of our crews). The camaraderie was excellent and Anglesea was well to the fore in representing our club, Anglesea RSL and the Surf Coast in this iconic event. The four years of headaches ensuring that we would get to the starting line and to the many months of training were worth every bit of this unique experience.

Non Active Member Training

A key feature of the training program this year was the ongoing provision of early responder skills to our non active members (largely Nipper Parents and Older Members). We nearly doubled the number of Resuscitation certificates issued and for many this represented their first course attended in the club. Other older formally active members also took the opportunity to refresh and update their skills by doing a Resuscitation Course and I look forward to seeing them all at reguals this summer.

Next year with the help of our new Bronze Instructors we plan to expand the Resuscitation Course to include most Nipper parents in an ambitious expansion of that program.

We had a very large group of new instructors come to the Bronze Instructors Camp this year which was a welcome endorsement of the program. The senior Instructors responded very well to this influx and we restructured the Bronze Course to increase the number of classes from 4 to 6. This both lowered class sizes for the students and increased the opportunities to instruct for the Trainee Instructors. We also introduced a lead in weekend for the Trainee Instructors and lead by Mieke Foster, this weekend was a great event helping the candidates to refresh their Bronze skills prior to the main camp. In addition we enhanced the mentoring and coaching system for Trainee Instructors which was a runaway success brilliantly conducted by the three Coaches.

Well done to Chris in particular who ran a number of sessions which has set us up to re-establish IRB Racing which will be attractive to many members and will improve our IRB Skills dramatically.

The facility is faced with the ever changing needs as our environment changes. The need to maintain and provide modern facilities for enjoyable education and development of our youth, along with additional emphasis on the junior activities around the Club. It's a key part of our Community Service. This is an ongoing task and must be meet to provide for our future.

Asset management strategies by the Club and its stakeholders will benefit from developing the facilities for all members, this is your Club, and we continue to provide to the needs of the Club and its Member as a whole. In the past year we have seen changes to the facility in the following areas:-

New Infrastructure Works:-

- Upgrading works to the Club Café & Deck, ongoing works are still needed to maintain the Café to provide a revenue stream for the Club.

- New work to the patrol room & shed painting and other maintenance which is ongoing.

Future Works:-

- Upgrading new air conditioning to the boy's bunkrooms.
- Continuing works on the upkeep to the Deck Café with a new bar fridge and ongoing works to the deck.
- Replacement of the timber on the bridge to the Ray Marsh Room & Café.
- Upgrading the carparks to increase security & parking for our members.
- Streamline the security systems to all levels of the club.
- Continuing painting around the club is ongoing as to maintenance to the facility.
- Upgrade to the hot water systems.
- New Gym equipment.

Due to strong growth of our club the development of the club's facilities must continue to grow with the increasing needs of the community and its members. The plans for a new building to replace the older part of the club are based on current standards to achieve the high quality sustainable design in

energy and efficiency, to cater for the needs of the user groups in the frame work as a lifesaving club. To meet these needs the club must continue to upgrade the facilities.

Marketing Report

The Anglesea SLSC has also continued to receive the benefits of many grants throughout the year including some \$22k through the VESEP grant program that was used to purchase a new IRB / Outboard and lifesaving gear such as defibs etc. In addition the club was also a recipient of a \$20k grant through the Solar Towns program that will be used to install a gas boosted, solar hot water system with 4 storage tanks in the upper clubhouse to replace the electric hotwater tanks servicing the bunkrooms, member showers and the café.

There were also numerous other grants received from organisations such as realestate.com.au, Surf Coast Shire and Alcoa which were be used to support our lifesaving activities.

We have also continued to enjoy the support by our long term sponsors including Alcoa, Burson Autoparts, Hardings Hardware, Hamlan Homes / Squeekies, MC Herd Wholesale Meats, Funky Trunks / Funkita and XOSIZE for the Rock2Ramp, one of our major fundraising events.

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and are net of any rebates and discounts received.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2015

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees at the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Employee benefits expected to be settled more than twelve months after the end of the reporting period have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may satisfy vesting requirements. Cashflows are discounted using market yields on national government bonds with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cashflows. Changes in the measurement of the liability are recognised in profit or loss.

Employee benefits are presented as current liabilities in the balance sheet if the association does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting date regardless of the classification of the liability for measurement purposes under AASB 119.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depends on whether the outcome of the services can be measured reliably. If this is the case then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period. If the outcome cannot be reliably measured then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

We have reviewed the accompanying 2015 financial report of the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. which comprises the balance sheet as at 30 April 2015, and the income and expenditure statement for the year ended on that date, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the Committee of Management's declaration.

Assurance practitioner's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the 30 April 2015 financial report based on our review. We conducted our review in accordance with Standard on Review Engagements ASRE 2400 *Review of a Financial Report Performed by an Assurance Practitioner Who is Not the Auditor of the Entity*, in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, anything has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the financial report is not presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the recognised accounting principles and procedures. ASRE 2400 requires us to comply with the requirements of the applicable code of professional conduct of a professional accounting body.

A review of a financial report consists of making enquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Independence

In conducting our review, we have complied with the independence requirements of the Australian professional accounting bodies.

Basis for qualified opinion

Receipts are a significant source of revenue for the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. It is impracticable to establish controls over the collection of these revenue streams prior to the entry in its financial records. Accordingly as the evidence available to us regarding this revenue is limited, our audit procedures with respect to receipt's has been restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. We are therefore unable to express an opinion on whether receipts and obtained by Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. are complete.

Qualified Opinion

Based on our review which is not an audit, except for the effects on the financial report of such adjustments, if any, as might have been required had the limitation on our audit procedures referred to in the *Basis for qualified opinion* paragraph not existed, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the 30 April 2015 financial report of the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. does not present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. as at 30 April 2015, and of its financial performance for the year ended on that date, in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards.

Basis of accounting and restriction on distribution

Without modifying our conclusion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. to meet the requirements of the club's constitution. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
