Jim Geary, Director of Marketing & Sponsorship, has put in many hours coordinating sponsorship and his time is very much appreciated.

This season, Mentone LSC and Anglesea SLSC formed a senior competition partnership. The partnership supports strong senior competition teams across the sections, shares facilities and resources, with high level of coaching and support structures. the future of our Club. Draft documents will be reviewed by the Committee and members before being presented at an AGM or Special General Meeting to be voted for adoption.

The Anglesea SLSC strategic plan (that can be found on the Club website) provides a strong focus on the future direction of the Club. The strategic plan provides guidance for the Committee and members on community engagement, 'winning in life' through lifesaving activities and projects to enhance the Club.

The Building Sub-Committee comprising of Ron Canale, Michael Carr, Jeremy Farrington, Graeme Weber, Prue Weber, Michael Krause, Kevin Rigg and Jim Geary (Chair) has been formed to look at the long-term building and facilities to support the needs of the Club and community. The vision is to have a building that is functional, provides a safe environment and easy access to areas such as rescue services, first aid and nippers. The facility needs to be large enough to cater for training, meetings, administration, social functions and storage of essential life saving equipment. The challenge includes interface of the Ray Marsh Room and the current site of the old Club.

The Club has strong administration and financial leadership with the team of Ingilby Dickson, Shane Edmonds, Diane Feudoloff, Judy Sutherland and the 'Foundation' members. Anglesea SLSC is one of the few clubs in Victoria that owns an asset such as the 'offsite storage facility' and whilst we aim to fully pay off the loan for this property in the near future, it has seen significant appreciation in value. This is an investment for the future and will be recorded as one of the most significant milestones of the Club history

Season 2009-2010 resulted in an outstanding year for our coaches and competitors with significant rewards at Carnivals, Manly-Freshwater Australia Day Carnivals, Victorian Titles at Lakes Entrance and for those who competed in the limited events at the Australian Titles at Kurrawa, Queensland. This season saw incredibly large and boiling surf at the Australian Titles with most events being cancelled after the tragic passing of Saxon Bird -Junior Ironman, Queenscliff SLSC, NSW. In what could be described as difficult and frustrating 'Aussies', Anglesea competitors and support team showed great encouragement and patience.

We had another great Nipper season managed by Michael Szulc, supported by our age group leaders, water safety and mums and dads. A pleasing aspect of the continued growth of Nippers is the participation and support of parents taking on roles. Without parent support, the Club could not run such a successful program

of basic surf lifesaving skills. I am pleased that a core group of Nippers continued training and competed at Lakes Entrance with great enthusiasm confronting the challenges of the shore break.

Last years AGM saw the appointment of two new Life Members and we congratulate Helen Lee-Williams and Lloyd Simpson on their Life Membership of Anglesea SLSC.

Sadly, we lost two long term members of our Club in recent months, Bruce 'Mo' Edmonds (Past President) and Edward 'Spiv' White. I'm sure all long term members would acknowledge Mo and Spiv as Anglesea SLSC family.

It has been another busy year for the Anglesea Surf Club with continued growth from the record season we had the previous year, although the GFC took its toll on business and the community.

The Administration function continued to support all facets of the Surf Club, well serviced by Di Feudoloff with support from Judy Sutherland, who we sincerely thank for their support and assistance.

Rescue Services Report

And so we reflect on another great season on the beach with the Anglesea SLSC. As always we have out done ourselves with the standard of our patrols, thanks to the dedication and commitment of our volunteer lifesavers who all do such a great job.

It seems like only yesterday that we were getting everything ready for gear inspection and now it's nearly time to do it all again.

During the 09/10 season Anglesea Main Beach had approximately 93,000 visitors, we recorded 29 rescues, 82 minor first aid cases, 8 major first aid cases and 1561 preventative actions. These are interesting statistics, whilst our total attendance is down nearly 30,000 from last year, we have nearly doubled both our number of first aid cases and rescues and have increase our preventative actions by nearly 500. This shows an increase in the great work done by those who patrol our beach, well done and thanks to all of you.

Some notes worthy aspects of the season include the purchase of Marine VHF radios, and the training of a group of locals to use these radios. These radios and skills will be vital in helping Anglesea SLSC respond to call outs both near and far, in areas where there is poor radio coverage. This development is another testament to Jim Geary and his grant finding ability, and of course Marine Safety Victoria who partially funded the equipment and all of the training.

Special mention must be made to highlight the great work done by the Anglesea Lifesaving Emergency Response Team (ALERT), They have been called out to 3 emergencies in the past

season, the most well known of these being the rescue of 5 scouts who were trapped by rising tides on the cliff face near the scout camp. The quick response provided a great outcome for the scouts. Moreover, highlighting Anglesea SLSC's ability to work in with the other emergency services to provide assistance not only during the summer months, but indeed all year round.

With a great a surf club comes great responsibility, thankfully we have a great a Foundation who have generously purchased 2 new defibrillators, whilst thankfully we haven't used them, these machines save lives and now we are able to have one with our patrol, one at Pt Roadknight and another in the club house ready for call outs should and when we need it. This is comforting knowledge as one of the best predictors of mortality in sudden cardiac arrest is the time from arrest to defibrillation, with 3 of these units at our disposal we will dramatically decrease this time and never leave our patrol without one.

Another highlight for the club this season was the return of the Rescue Services run nipper carnival for grade 5 and 6 students from eight primary schools in the area, this event was again a great success and saw over 300 students participate in Lifesaving activities and learn important surf awareness skills. Special thanks to all who volunteered their time to run the day.

This Season would not have been possible if it wasn't for the countless hours spent by so many. I would like to especially thank William Hamlyn for his 70.25 hours. I would also like to thank the following members of the Rescue Services team for their incredible time and effort;

Competition Report

IRB Report



This IRB team report reflects on two seasons, as this years Australian IRB Championships were held very early, in April as they were held in Tasmania. The fact that the national IRB championships were held in Tasmania shows the progression our sport is making in terms of trying to encompass and encourage all members within SLSA to be part of its growth.

Season 2009/2010

Penguin, Tasmania hosted the 2010 Australian IRB championships, the first time Tasmania has held National IRB championships. With a rural setting providing a spectacular backdrop and a region so supportive about hosting the championships, this year's Australian Titles rewarded all competitors who attended. Great weather, small waves and a train running along the beach all added to this unique venue.

Anglesea's competitors were fantastic. For many this was their first time to an Australian IRB Championship (9 competitors) yet all twenty two competitors who represented the club showed why Anglesea is such a great club. An added bonus was that eight came home with a medal hanging around their neck. So with the team made up of so many U18 competitors and

first timers it was a bit of a surprise that the club came 4th overall. To again be so close to the top of IRB competition is fantastic; something that we hope will continue to encourage members to become a part of.

The highlight of the weekend however was the gold medal by our female tube team, Anglesea A comprising Julia Cullity, Rebecca Plant and Ken-Genie Yap. Having entered the final as the defending Australian Champions the pressure was on, but from the start they had a near flawless race. Winning comfortably, the whole Anglesea team celebrated when Jules crossed the line, winning back to back national titles. A great effort and with Anglesea's third gold medal in IRB competition in as many years Anglesea is continuing to show that its competitors have the tenacity to win.

Anglesea also won two other medals, both in the male events. Anglesea B comprising Jeremy Farrington, Morgan Day and Rose Wilcox won bronze in the male rescue race. This event is considered the 'blue ribbon' event in IRB racing and with over 110 teams competing; getting a medal certainly isn't easy. A very close final with only inches separating most of the teams, Jeremy fell across the finish line to claim 3rd.



Anglesea B comprising of Jeremy Farrington, Ryan Nolan and Felipe Araujo won bronze in the male tube race. For Ryan and Jeremy this is the second time they have medalled in this event. There are some very strong swimmers in this event but Anglesea held its own and placed 3rd, another fantastic result.

Nearly all of our other male and female teams managed to make either quarter or semi finals. For many whom it was their first year, it shows a great progression and gives them a very bright future in the sport.

Friday again had the interstate challenge with 5 Anglesea competitors and the team manager representing Victoria. Despite some solid performances Victoria placed second to Queensland by 2 points. Hopefully for Victoria it is third time lucky next year!

The Victorian titles were held on the 27th/28th of June at Ocean Grove. With the Victorian Titles being held after the Australian titles, Anglesea's team was a bit smaller than usual however it didn't stop the team from getting some fantastic results in freezing cold conditions. Overall Anglesea came 4th Standout performances were:

Anglesea B comprising of Jeremy Farrington, Morgan Day and Rose Wilcox won gold in the male rescue race,

Anglesea B comprising of Jeremy Farrington, Morgan Day, Rose Wilcox & Anna Plitsch won silver in the Male Mass Rescue Race and

Anglesea A comprising of Jeremy Farrington, Toby Dickson, Morgan Day, Timothy Dodd, Rose Wilcox & Anna Plitsch won bronze in the Male Teams race

Special mention must also go to Emma Doyle, Anna Plitsch and Sam McCombe who finished

just outside the medals in the female rescue race and Nick Tait & Jack Fry who were close all but couldn't make the finals.

Season 2008/2009

The national championships were held at Kawana Waters on the sunshine coast in Queensland. Typical of this area in June we experience nearly all weather and surf conditions however a tricky shore break was consistent throughout the carnival.

Fifteen ASLSC competitors made the journey north where reasonably large surf greeted them on the Friday for the Interstate competition. The 5 ASLSC competitors (and 1 team manger) that represented Victoria on Friday had mixed results in the tricky conditions, with Victoria placing 2nd to Queensland. The shore break showed what it was going to do most of the weekend and play havoc with crews.

With lots of rolled boats, crews & drivers falling out, just making to the turning buoys unscathed became a priority. These conditions unfortunately saw the majority of our competitors out either in or before the quarter finals. Hard luck story goes to defending Australian champions Jasmin Ellis, Brooke Dalvean, Penny Rogers who in the female mass rescue quarter final suffered gear failure. Disappointing given we know how good they are!

From all of these mixed results came a gold lining. Julia Cullity, Rebecca Plant and Ken-Gene Yap representing Anglesea A, won gold in the female tube rescue! Leading from start to finish Jules, Bec and Kenny blitzed the field, with Jules claiming the win as she ran over the line. It was especially sweet for Julia whom after 18 years of trying finally had that gold medal at the National



Surf Life Saving Championships. An awesome result and one that was thoroughly deserved for all their efforts!

With that result Anglesea placed 10th overall, a bit lower than the previous year but still a great team effort!

The 2009 Victorian IRB Championships were held in cold, windy and sometimes very wet conditions in Wye River. The Anglesea team who braved the elements came home with 1 gold, 1 silver and 1 bronze, overall finishing 3rd. The only gold medal came from the male tube rescue featuring Jeremy Farrington, Ryan Nolan and Wayne Cartwright. This race has become a pet event with Anglesea winning it nearly every year.

The silver and bronze came from the female tube race with Anglesea A comprising Julia Cullity, Rebecca Plant and Ken-Gene Yap winning silver and Anglesea C comprising Jasmin Ellis, Brooke Dalvean and Wayne Cartwright winning bronze.

in Harriet Brown and Jack Hanson have enrolled to do courses over the next 6 months with Wyn Training Solutions.

In addition to our sponsorship support, we have continued to enjoy the support of our local media including the Geelong Advertiser, Surf Coast Echo and in particular the Surf Coast Times, who provide coverage for our events but also recognition for the efforts and achievements of members.

In the lead up to the summer season, the Directors identified a risk with a IT network and saw a need to improve the integrity and redundancy of our IT infrastructure and the implementation is nearing completion of a project to utilise an offsite server for software and data storage needs. This will provide industry standard redundancy and backup facilities for the club data.

Funding from our sponsors and also numerous grants from public and private institutions has again enabled us to purchase important rescue equipment including a new IRB and trailer, rescue boards, nipper boards and other operational and rescue gear and also allowed the refurbishment of the bunkrooms including much improved ventilation and climate control, the installation of blackout blinds and many other improvements around the club facilities. We also successfully applied for a grant offering some \$8,000 of Microsoft and Symantec software through the a not for profit support program administered by Donortec.

On the marketing side, I also see the partnerships that have been forged with Port Melbourne and also Mentone an opportunity to extend the benefits to sponsors of all 3 clubs as these relationships further develop which we are only beginning to explore.

Anglesea has also established a sub-committee comprised of Ron Canale, Michael Carr, Jeremy Farrington, Graeme & Prue Weber, Michael Krause, Kevin Rigg and Jim Geary (Chair) to redevelop the lower clubhouse. So far, the sub-committee has explored some options with further work being undertaken. I would like to thank Ron Canale for donating the services of a geo-technical engineer and also Michael Carr who has also donated his architectural services. We will keep all members informed as work progresses.

Once again, I look forward to the outcomes of our grant "pipeline" that we currently have in place and members will be informed as outcomes become known.

In closing, I would like to thank on behalf of the committee and members of the SLSC, all our sponsors and supporters and also the grant benefactors for their ongoing support and generosity in supporting our club. I would also like to thank Jake Foster Jnr and Malcolm Plant for their assistance in setting up the IT network including the off-site server and also the POS terminals that were used in the club shop and bar over the summer months

I would also like to encourage all members and their families to consider our sponsors when purchasing any goods or services. We have many companies who support our club and when making purchase decisions we should consider goods purchased from our sponsors and supporters particularly those who may be involved in running a business on a day to day basis.

It is with deep sorrow that the Directors of the ASLSC wish to advise of the passing of our esteemed Life Member Bruce (Mo) Edmonds on 22nd April 2010.

Bruce joined ASLSC and attained his bronze medallion in 1959 he received his 50 year service award in 2009 having held over those years many distinguished positions with the Anglesea SLSC. After serving as Assistant Chief Instructor he went onto be Chief Instructor from 1964 - 1967. Bruce was actively involved in running and co-coordinating both junior and senior competition activities including being the ASLSC Nipper Co-ordinator for some 13 years between 1968-1981. He was Club Captain from 1972 - 1977 and was recognised as ASLSC Best Club Person in season 1963/64 and again 10 years later in the 1973/74 season. He was Anglesea's SLSV delegate from 1974 - 1977 and then again from 1986 - 1988. In 1975 he was awarded Life Membership at ASLSC and went on to serve as Vice President from 1977-1984 and President from 1984-1988. (Pictured: Bruce Edmonds in action on his favourite surf ski)

As a competitor Bruce was a dedicated ski paddler competing in the 'B' Grade ski section at Victorian carnivals but always willing to step up to 'A' Grade when the opportunity arose. He won the Best Ski Paddler Award for ASLSC in 1969/70. In 1961 he placed 3rd in the 'B' Grade single ski race at the Victorian titles. He also won the Over 35 Single ski race at the 1976 and 1977 Victorian titles. Bruce was also heavily involved in March past participating for many years in the Anglesea SLSC teams.

Bruce also contributed actively at State level as an SLSV Carnival official from 1971 - 2008. He was SLSV Junior Activities Board Superintendent from 1981 - 87 and participated as Education officer in the 1984 SLSV Wieland Shield team and as Manager in 1990 SLSV State Team Manager in 1990 and 1991.

Bruce achieved many awards as a competitor and office bearer at both Club and State level including the SLSV Wishart medal in 1975/76 and a Life Member of SLSV in 2000.

Having contributed so much to Anglesea SLSC SLSV and LSV Bruce would often observe first before stepping in to add his constructive comments and ideas. Our thoughts go to Margaret Grant Shane Kellie and Alice and his broader family he will be sadly missed by all.

Lived and worked in Geelong as well as Melbourne. He first worked at Patrick Rowe & Assoc as an Accountant, then he later became an Auditor and worked in his own business. He died while visiting his brother in Queensland in September 2009.

Doug was a softly spoken and an unassuming gentile person, always willing to lend a helping hand. He gained his BM 23/1/1955 V59 as an Anglesea SLSC Member, by October 1955 he joined the ASLSC Social Committee. He was Hon Auditor 1961-63, Treasurer 1964/65, 1979/80, Assistant Treasurer 1980/81; on the General Committee 1976. During his tenure he managed the club bar in a most meticulous way introducing yearly tickets for use at the bar

Awarded Best Club man Award 1976/77. He gained IRB Crew Certificate 1980, IRB Driver Certificate 1981/82 was Power Boat Officer 1981. Awarded SLSC 25 Year Service Award 1981/82. He won his section for annual Pt Roadnight Race on his wave rider in 1979/80 Season. He will be missed by many at Anglesea.

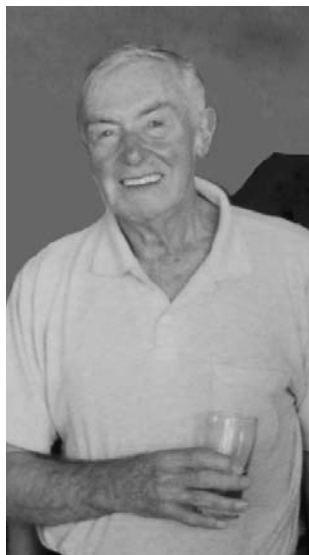

On his block at Pt Roadnight he had Betty Thompson's Beach bathing box, (which had had to be removed from the main beach in 1967), later he built his house, but this was burnt in the 1983 bushfires.

Ian assisted ASLSC with a Newsboy's project in 2005, when a country person could gain their BM at Anglesea.

Over the many years Ian had been always interested in the Club's activities and had been a most generous supporter.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ending 30 April 2010

Statement of Accounting Policies

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus View and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Standards board and the Associations Incorporations Act 1981.

The financial report has been prepared on a cash basis, based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Incorporation in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Income tax

The income of the Incorporation is exempt from income tax in accordance with the provision of Section 23 (g) (iii) of the Income Tax Assessment Act, as the Incorporation falls within the definition of a society, association or club established for the encouragement of a game or sport.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a specific identification basis and include direct costs and appropriate overheads, if any.

Property, Plant and Equipment

All assets have limited useful lives and are depreciated using the straight line method over their estimated useful lives. Assets are depreciated from the date of acquisition.

Depreciation rates are reviewed annually for appropriateness and the rates used for each class of asset are as follows:


