President's Report

With another season completed and planning well under way for season 2014/15, it gives me great pleasure to report on another successful year for Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club and its members.

Our most important responsibility is to patrol our beach during the season and make sure it is a safe environment for all beach users. Our Rescue Services Team has again provided excellent service and ensured that Anglesea remains one of the safest beaches in the area. We thank all our members who patrolled this season, sometimes under terrible weather conditions, and in particular our Patrol Captains who took on that extra level of responsibility.

Thank you to all those members who so freely gave of their time in order to provide this great public service. We would also like to acknowledge the work of our Gear Stewards Ross Peasnell and Colin Anderson, who worked tirelessly to ensure that we had our IRB's in top operating condition at all times.

Supporting our patrolling effort is the work of the Member Development team under the direction of Tim Mason and supported by the Chief Instructors and their teams. In addition to providing the annual requalification program they delivered a highly successful Bronze Camp and numerous other award programs over the summer period resulting in some 700 awards gained this season. Adding to a long list of innovations emanating from Anglesea, this season saw the introduction of the '3 Stage Bronze' whereby adults, in particular nipper parents, are provided with the opportunity to obtain this qualification over a number of years.

Anglesea has a proud record of supporting members to advance their leadership skills and this year Lauren Chan and Hugh Moodie are recipients of a 2014 Life Saving Victoria "Building Leaders Scholarship". This program provides participants with the opportunity to develop through workshops, advanced leadership development and specialised training. This scholarship program also includes a two week trip to Sri Lanka where

the participants gain exposure to international lifesaving practices and training together with having a unique cultural experience.

At the 2013 LSV Awards of Excellence Anglesea's Bernie Murray was awarded Life Membership in recognition of his long and outstanding contribution to the development and running of Nippers at the state level and his continuing contribution to surf sport at both the junior and senior levels.



The Junior Activities area had another sensational season under Director David Kay and his team delivering a great program to our 550+ Nippers thanks to the support and assistance provided by the Age Group Leaders, the Water Safety team and the mums and dads. Special mention also needs to be made of Janet Jones and her team for their continued development of the 'Starfish Nipper Program' for kids with special needs. This wonderful program, which defines the inclusive nature of lifesaving, is now being taken up by a number of other clubs based on the programs developed at Anglesea.

Anglesea started the competition season by successfully hosting the second round of the Australian Surf Rowers League 'Triple Crown Event' in November which saw crews from WA, Queensland and NSW compete against some of the local crews.



At the state level Anglesea again performed strongly winning a number of carnivals including our home event in early January. The highlight of that day was the launching of our new surfboat 'The Andrew Ramsden' which was purchased with generous support from the Club Patrons. At the State Titles at Ocean Grove Anglesea finished second to Mordialloc who absolutely swamped the U15 area – one area we need to improve upon.

In April the competition team headed to West Australia for the Australian Titles and again led the way for Victoria with 3 Gold, 3 Silver and 2 Bronze medals together with a number of other finals appearances across the Masters and Senior competitions. Anglesea was again the top Victorian team in the Senior competition. Special mention must be made of the U15 5 Person R&R Team (The Cheeky Devils) of Marli Wilkinson, Olivia Carboon, Mia Duckett, Mikaela Dale, and Hannah Uehara together with their coach Christine Cardwell who in their first season together claimed Gold. Sally Cumming won Gold in the 30-34 Women's Beach Sprint as did Shane Edmonds in the 40-44 Year Ironman – outstanding results.

A special mention must be made of Kevin Rigg who took on the role of Director Surf Sport as well as Team Manager this season. I've lost count of the number of people who have commented to me on the level of commitment Kevin makes to the competition

area including managing our successful competition relationship with Mentone.

For a number of years we have been talking of the possibility of a redevelopment of the lower clubhouse area. A major stumbling block was overcome this year with the finalisation of a new 21 year licence and lease which has been entered into with the Great Ocean Road Coastal Committee. This provides the Club with a measure of responsibility for the land immediately surrounding the building which we had not previously had and greater clarity over permissible uses of the facility including the cafe. This now allows us to push on with developing of plans for the redevelopment and to start the relevant permit processes. I would like to acknowledge the valuable contribution of Michael Carr who, via his architectural firm, has developed the plans for the redevelopment.

Financially the club has again performed well this season and the financial report is contained later in this Annual Report. Of note is the fact that the club now owns the offsite storage facility, having paid off the 10 year loan in 5 years. The Board has committed to continuing to set aside funds on a regular basis in order to build up funds for the redevelopment.

Sadly one of our long time members and a Patron of Anglesea SLSC, Andrew Ramsden passed away this year and is sadly missed. On the recommendation of his fellow Patrons, the club approached his wife Anne who readily accepted the opportunity to replace Andrew as a Club Patron.

To run a successful Club is a team effort and I would like to acknowledge and thank:

- All of our Directors and our Committee who work hard year round to ensure we remain at the forefront of every aspect of lifesaving.
- Our sponsors for your support of our club events and the club in general. We hope



that your association with our club continues to be a positive one for your company.

- The organising teams of our three major club fundraisers – the Golf Day, Rock2Ramp and the Door Knock. It takes a lot of work to prepare, conduct and review these events and the funds that they raise are essential for keeping the club financially sound.
- Our Club Patrons for their ongoing support and valued contributions to our club.
- The Anglesea SLSC Foundation who continue to work quietly in the background and provide significant financial support.
- Our Office Manager, Diane Feudoloff, for the job she continues to do in keeping things ticking along within the sometimes nebulous environment of a volunteer organisation.

In conclusion I would like to thank the wives, husbands, partners and families of our members for your support which is vital to the effective operation of any volunteer organisation and in particular my wife, Helen who has provided such great support to myself over the 9 years that I have been President.

Administration Report

It is a great pleasure again to be a part of the Anglesea Leadership Team and look after the Administration functions now for my fourth year and I am looking forward to continuing to provide my voluntary services again.

Administration activities had another good positive year with the Café, Shop and the Administration function managed through Di Feudoloff all performing at or in excess of our targets.

On the administration side a big thank you again to Di particularly for processing over 2,000 memberships and it is great to see that many of them are now being processed online. We do understand processing family memberships with the SLSA system is not easy but we appreciate your vigilance as it does help the document flow if we can process as much of our memberships

online. Otherwise Di looks after many other activities across our Administration from supporting the various fundraising activities to our Accounts Payable/Receivable which includes chasing various Directors to ensure we have good compliance and governance over our administration and expenditure processes. Thanks also to Judy Sutherland who looks after the Treasury function but also acts as a backup for Di when she is on leave.

The café is in the process of finishing its third and final year of its current contract and again now we have seen the café operate throughout the calendar year including the quieter winter months with a broad set of services to ensure that our club facilities are well utilised and a point of gathering and networking both for the club and the local community. It is pleasing to

see the patrons continuing to grow particularly in the winter months where the café is now open Thursday to Sunday. We also support a number of external functions such as weddings which usually take place in our quieter months February through to early December and which provides an excellent income for both the café and the club with some marginal inconvenience for those members who use the club facilities during those winter months. Our plan is to continue to utilise the services of Amanda and Chris Gross and we are currently negotiating a contract extension with some refinements on both sides to provide further improvement in services and related activities. We are hoping this extension will take us closely to a below Club House building renovation timeframe where we can review then the type of café contract and activities that we require post that timing.

I would also like to recognise the great support that the Administration area provides for the Golf Day, Rock 2 Ramp and the Doorknock by Di but also a number of other key helpers. Significant administration tasks whether it be processing entries or simply managing the cash collection of the Doorknock all has to be done smartly with good governance and compliance and a great result again.

The shop has had another positive year and many thanks to Tina Kay who has now run the shop facilities for over three seasons and doing a superb job. Stocktaking continues to be spot on and the range of merchandise and apparel that we now provided to club members and other supporters and friends continues to be well received. Tina also provides excellent support to our fundraiser activities such as the Rock 2 Ramp and the competition area for all of their apparel requirements so we have a good coordination and central control. Tina is also supported by her casual staff who are all club members which works well to ensure that we keep these activities within the Anglesea Surf Club Community.

I would also like to mention the SRC team and activities which I help lead with a number of fantastic helpers. The SRC is a sub group of the overall Junior Life Saving activities led by David Kay and allows the older junior members who are thirteen or fourteen years of age to achieve a certificate called the Surf Rescue Certificate which provides a great gateway to their Bronze



which usually happens two seasons after. These members then are available to help our patrols following their exam which usually takes place towards the end of the first week of January. This year we met 68 young Lifesavers who all successfully completed their SRC certificate and it is great to see many of them on Patrol straight away in the summer months. A special thanks to Noel Langford and Derek Stott together with a number of helpers who made my task of coordinating the SRC this year a lot more relaxing than perhaps it has been in the past!

We now move and prepare ourselves for the AGM and of course this overall Annual Report is a key part of that, which as I write this report it is coming together well and thank you to all who have contributed as it is an excellent reflection of our Surf Club with great integrity and professionalism. I am looking forward to seeing you all on the beach for another great summer ahead.

continue to encourage and support our own members who wish to stand up and become leaders on the beach. Thank you also, to the ongoing leadership from our other ASR captains Lauren Chan, Tom Cullen, Ben Mason, Jack Fry and Paul Lunny. To all of the members in ASR, your time and commitment to ensuring our club continues to meet the LSV patrol requirements is greatly appreciated.

2013/2014 Patrol Breakdown

This season ASLSC members manned the beach for a total of 5,527.5 hours over 51 different patrols. This saw our lifesavers perform 10 rescues using the IRB (8), rescue tube (1) and other (1) and perform 26 first aids from breaks and dislocations to major wounds. We also performed 1556 preventative actions, potentially preventing a number of serious incidents from occurring.

Out of our 704 qualified members, 393 members completed hours ranging up to 101.5 hours,

completed by Andrew Rechtman. In the coming season, to continue to achieve our requirements, we will be working with our members to build the participation and increase our patrolling numbers, in order to strengthen our core patrol groups and ask for assistance from a greater proportion of our qualified members

Thank you to our gear steward Ross Peasnell, with the assistance of Colin Anderson, for ensuring our equipment is continually repaired and operational for training and patrols, to Lloyd Simpson for guaranteeing our First Aid supplies are fully stocked and regularly replenished and Chris Porter, Tom Cullen and Matt Solly for their ongoing assistance with the day to day needs of ASLSC.

Nippers Report

The Anglesea Nipper program ran from October with our Sunday Dolphin sessions through to the Victorian Junior State Championships in March. We had just over 580 children including SRC's and our wonderful Starfish members, 22 Age Group Mangers, 20 Age Group Leaders, 70 water safety officers, 10 First Aid Officers, numerous general volunteers helping with beach set up and preparing & cooking the BBQ all working together to create what we hope was a wonderful experience for all.

The weather was not as kind to us as previous years and our Nippers encountered some very challenging conditions in the water. With the wonderful guidance and supervision by Age Group Leaders and water safety officers they managed to improve their skills and confidence in these difficult conditions.

As usual the busy period was from Christmas to early January where Nippers undertook the Surf Education Program as well as being well represented in the Annual Anglesea Door Knock, the Nipper Art Show, Cosy Corner Carnival where we were represented by 150 children. Later in January our Nippers took part in our Junior Club Championships, followed by the Surf Coast Regional Carnival which was hosted by Anglesea. Anglesea Nippers qualified 45 relay teams to

represent Anglesea at The Victorian Junior State Championships in Warrnambool where we had 75 Nippers compete over the two days.

This year we expanded our Surf Education Program to introduce children to aspects of First Aid, Environmental issues, pollution, looking after our beaches and tours of the club, all of which was well received. I extend a big thankyou to Mieke Foster who did a terrific job running this program.

The Victoria Junior State Titles were held over the March long weekend, which was



a most enjoyable weekend in the water, on the beach and socially it was a great chance for families to catch up again. We had a solid performance finishing 8th overall out of 30 clubs, 2 positions higher than the previous year. The pleasing aspect was we managed to make the final in 80% of the events however we did meet some impressive opposition from some very strong clubs, none more so than Mentone LSC who were the eventual Victorian State Junior Champions. It is clear to improve the overall performance we need to put more time into our competitive training.

Congratulations to all who qualified and competed at the State titles. We had some outstanding performances which received medals

All of this could not have been achieved without the wonderful support from all our volunteer helpers, age group leaders & their assistants,

water safety officers & their leaders, water area leaders, beach set up team, photographer, First Aid team, second hand wetsuit stand and the BBQ team who estimate produced about 6000 perfectly cooked snags!

Finally we must mention & thank our fantastic sponsors Lorraine Lea Linen, (Adrian Ryan). Adrian continues to be a terrific supporter of our Club and Nipper program, Sea-Band (Matt Symington, no stranger to the club), we welcome this year as a new sponsor, Interface Recruitment (Jeremy King) & Ocean Road Landscaping (Peter Shaw) all of whom not only donated generously but were hands on helping out on the beach and at the BBQ's.

Finally a massive WELL DONE to all our Nippers, see you next season.

Big Nipper

Starfish Nippers 2013/14

Starfish Nippers, which is now in its third year at Anglesea, had another terrific season and was a credit to the whole Anglesea Lifesaving Club. I am so proud that our club is so inclusive of all levels of ability and we are welcoming new families into our nipper community. We had 12 Starfish Nippers this season, three of whom have been with us since the beginning, four who started two years ago and five new nippers to add more laughter and enthusiasm to our group.

We had 16 trainers who were such passionate and reliable volunteers, giving up their holiday time and even in some cases paying membership with the sole purpose to be a trainer. We have many families involved within the trainers group too, including the Fry family – Liz and Charlie; the Toohey family – Loretta, Tom and Clara; the Dickson family – Greta and Fiona; the Cameron family – Bronwyn and Matilda; the Jones family – Janet, Lucy and Harry; and Matt Mullins, Win Brown, Loretta Robinson and Jill Mason.

Having more trainers than nippers has meant we have not only been able to fulfill our policy of having one-to-one ratios but have also been able to allocate two-to-one assistance in



some cases, giving more individual instruction especially in the water and on the boards.

One of the highlights was seeing trainers on the board with their Starfish catching a wave in, with big smiles on their faces. Our nippers are building their confidence and skills in the water with all this extra assistance. In one case, a nipper who didn't want to go on the board last year was on the board every session this season, learning new skills and gaining more confidence in the water.

Our Starfish have improved in many areas including their concentration and engagement skills, focusing for much longer on the activities and fitness. We also had a few sessions with nippers from the Under 8s program taking part in beach and wade relays. Integration is important and it was fantastic to see the Under 8 nippers helping our Starfish and communicating with each other while parents networked and interacted together.

This season we also included more concentrated water safety awareness, with Starfish first watching demonstrations of rescues with lifesavers and then entering the water in pairs, taking in turns to rescue each another.

We have been very grateful to the State Trustees Funding for their grant of \$10,000 to encourage other clubs to start Starfish Nippers in their clubs and develop the starfish website and resources. Jake Foster has done a great job upgrading and rebuilding our website with resources for other clubs, developing an introduction DVD

and producing a Starfish Nippers pamphlet for clubs. Last year Point Lonsdale and Hampton Life Saving clubs started Starfish Nippers with huge success and at this stage we have Torquay, Ocean Grove and Mentone starting up next season. We will market these new resources and website to all clubs in Victoria, and I am sure once they have seen our program, more clubs will want to be involved too. Special thanks go to Naomi Symington for all her help with developing the resources as well as to Jake Foster for his fantastic contribution to this program.

A special thanks to our Starfish Nippers – Jeremy, Anna, Chris, Sienna, Liam, Matt, Alice, Jared, Callan, Walter, Georgia, Manon and their families for giving us so much joy and laughter on the beach.

Competition Report

Anglesea SLSC again achieved the highest Victorian club point score at the Australian Surf Lifesaving Titles at Scarborough in 2013-14.

The competition season 2013-14 assembled its hardened, dedicated competitors from the winter program (they must have picked up a few tips up from the 'Bears' program). From the season start with long distance competitions, to the pinnacle of the Australian Surf Life Saving Titles, there were many incredible performances by new U15's in senior competition right through to the 'grand masters'.

One of the club's most inspiring events for the season occurred at the Victorian State Titles in Ocean Grove. For those who were not able

to see the men's open double ski, picture the following: An incredibly fast start with Tom Penny and Sam Phillips showing pure strength. The surf was up and the boys carved the waves apart with their speed. Around the buoys and heading for home they had the lead. Their wave petters out beneath them, the crews behind rapidly approach in a dead zone where a Half Moon Bay crew pick up the same wave as Tom and Sam. Approximately 20 metres from the finish, Half Moon Bay take a wild left hook on a wave which pushes our boys off the wave but Half Moon are unable to pull back onto the wave to take the win. Both crews are now parallel with the beach, in dead water. Anglesea disadvantaged on the surf side. Tom and Sam sprinted around the crew blocking them. This is extremely hard from a standing start, pushing to the finish flags for a win. All the Anglesea supporters along the beach jumped in unison, arms to the sky in full voice. A memorable event won fairly with determination, focus, fitness and skill. Bill Phillips had a smile from ear to ear....

The 2013-14 Victorian and Australian Titles season provided many outstanding individual

and team performances. Our club youth competing in swim, board, ski and beach were outstanding with many making semi-finals and finals against Australian super clubs which provide the level of professionalism which is recognised in our major sports and AIS.

Congratulations to the following competitors achieving gold; Sally Cumming (Masters Beach Sprint), Shane Edmonds (Masters Ironman), the U15 R&R Team (The Cheeky Devils) and all those gaining a place in finals.

Attending the Aussies is always a costly and logistical exercise and with this season being held in Scarborough Western Australia, it was a challenge for competitors, coaches and parents to raise these funds through various fundraising activities. Ingilby Dickson provided outstanding support in achieving equipment and craft logistics.

With the bulk of the U15's to U19's competitors coming from the Mentone LSC partnership, we

Christening of new surfboat

The section greatly appreciated the significant contribution made by several Club members towards the acquisition of a new boat for competition early this year. We acknowledge the support of those members and particularly, the great efforts of the late Andrew Ramsden who passed away just prior to the purchase of the boat. Andrew was instrumental in arranging for others to contribute to its purchase. The boat section extended its sincere condolences to Anne, Michael, Jenny and Rebecca on behalf of all members. Andrew was an inaugural member of the Club, a former Boat captain and sweep and Chairman of the Surf life Saving Victoria Foundation. He was largely responsible for the fundraising and development of what is today, LSV's Headquarters in Port Melbourne. We would like to express our thanks to 'Ramo', Bob Harding, Garry Johnson, Frank Herd and John Worrell for their generous support.

Whilst it was a sad occasion we were honoured to have Anne Ramsden launch

the new boat and christen it in memory of Andrew at the Anglesea Carnival on Jan 5th.

The new boat was also used to commemorate another of our great champions, Bill Knott, whose ashes were spread off the main beach at Easter. Bill won many awards as a top surf and belt swimmer and was a State representative over a number of years.

This is the first new boat for almost a decade and will greatly enhance our chances in the coming seasons. It represents a new design by South Coast Surf Boats of the Sunshine Coast and is a fast boat which had its initiation in competition at the Victorian State Championships at Ocean Grove and the Australia Championships at Scarborough WA in April.

Anglesea well represented in surf boat competition

A highlight of the season was Anglesea's entry of two ladies crews in the George Bass Surfboat Marathon at the start of the year. For those not familiar with this event, this is the world's

longest boat marathon and extends nearly 200 kms down the NSW south coast and follows part of the journey undertaken by early explorer Surgeon Commander George Bass and 6 oarsmen in 1797. This was a gruelling race over 7 days, considered the ultimate test for surfboat rowers. Having travelled the journey in 2010 with our 240 Years Masters crew I can testify first hand, just how challenging the event is and the physical toll involved. Completing the race is a fantastic effort by the Anglesea girls, particularly given the extreme weather and surf conditions experienced this year – considered by some ‘old-timers’ as among the worst in recent memory.

Anglesea performed creditably in several of the local carnivals this year with the girls in particular making several finals and the Mens Reserve crew also in several recent finals, and improving with each carnival. We entered an U23 ladies crew for the Anglesea Carnival (with most aged between 16 and 18 years) as well as a Mens U19 crew. Both performed well and showed plenty of potential for the future. Unfortunately, school and travel commitments prevented both crews from carrying on for the rest of the season but we will be endeavouring to get both crews on the water for next season.

The Australian Surf Rowers League (ASRL) national championships were held at Stockton Beach NSW in early Feb. Anglesea entered two ladies crews in Open and Masters, as well as our 240+ Mens Masters. Results were mixed but the Mens Masters did manage a back to back gold medal to add to their 2013 result.

The VSRL Masters were held at Lorne in Feb and Anglesea did well in the silverware department – but gold was hard to come by! Mens 140 years, Womens 200 years and Mens 240+ all came home with silver medals. The Womens Open and Mens Reserve crews performed at the LSV carnival at Lorne on the following Sunday and again made it through to the finals.

Whilst the surf has been rather benign for most of the season to date, Fairhaven was a different story! Carnage was the theme for the day with sloppy but heavy surf and many top crews spending time in the water (as distinct from on the water!). It was wisely decided to cancel the Ladies events and junior age groups with a number of crews moving around to Point

Roadknight to take on some great surf at the point. Back at Fairhaven, the Mens Reserve crew did a commendable job to get through to the finals with a top three result, leaving many of the top fancied crews floundering – literally!

Womens Open and Mens Reserve were our representative crews at the Vic Titles at Ocean Grove. The Mens Reserve crew (Matt Napier, Chris Leach, Ross Williams, Wes Avery and David Love sweep) contributed to a gold medal in the Lifesaver relay. It was disappointing that they were given little time between this event and their semi in the reserve section, which contributed to their missing a placing in the latter.

The Aussies - Scarborough

The Womens Open and Mens 240+ Masters contested at the Aussies at Scarborough. The Scarborough shore break was particularly severe early in the week during the Masters competition and early heats of the reserve and open sections with considerable carnage and spectacular wipe-outs. The Womens crew again performed well making the quarter finals while the Mens 240+ years (K. Bent, I. McGain, B. White, D. Warburton and N. Heathcote, sweep) were narrowly beaten to take out the silver medal.

We have started the 2014/15 season with good prospects and welcome the return of Joe Bergin from Seaspray who has three new crews (Open Mens, Mens Reserve and U23 Womens) currently in training.

Thankfully in stepped Matthew Symington who sensed an urgency to restructure and secured the Beach Team a new Manager in Adam Martin, who not only made my job as Head Coach much easier in being the go between with information and communication to athletes and parents, but as an ex elite beach competitor Adam knew the ropes and was invaluable at carnivals, in particular the State Titles.

John Baldock rose to the occasion conducting training session at Mentone every second Wednesday during the season for our junior development squad and together John and I created contacts and future junior pathways with the Mentone/Anglesea athletes and parents which included Friday afternoon training sessions. The real action plan now is to have the parents and athletes who have been given this coaching and support to involve them further and commit to season 2015. If we can get everyone on-board we will see the beach team over the next few years once again dominate the sand.

Lloyd Knight with his squad having trained all pre-season came into the competition with focus and intent, giving the beach team stability and leadership.

As Head Coach I was very pleased with the cross event co-operation we had with the R&R coaches and management, who encouraged girls from their teams to be involved in another event area. This not only enabled us to field relay teams, but also identify individual talent, which strengthened our team and added valuable

points for the club at carnivals. With new recruits Saxon Beale, Danielle Macaulay and Daniel Cussen and Eleanor Cooney-Hunt in the fold, suddenly we had athletes who would consistently place top three at local carnivals and State Titles and our U/15 & U/17 age divisions were very strong, creating great depth for relay teams.

Such is the talent of our new recruits that the recipient of the Bruce Thompson Trophy 2014 for the athlete who scored the most points over the season has been awarded to Danielle Macaulay. Not only has Danielle been a fantastic addition to the Anglesea Beach Team, but her enthusiasm and passion for the sport of surf lifesaving and her ever present smile has endeared her to all club members.

There is certainly some great talent in the U/15 girls and boys division across from our Anglesea and Mentone squads. The big issue was and remains our non-existent Open Men's team and general lack of depth and this is something that needs urgent focus. Senior leadership from our men's and women's open teams have always been the Beach Team's primary source of beach culture and now more than ever, we need that leadership to take us into the years ahead.

The State Championships proved to be a watershed moment where we were consistent at the top end in individual events, with our relay teams gathering many valuable points. It was all hands on deck, with Lloyd, John, Adam, Matt and myself working together to gather the troops. Bolstered with a number of water/craft athletes chipping in with relay runs, we secured second position, almost taking top spot on the point's ladder in the beach area, which at the beginning of the season seemed to be only a distant belief. Of particular commendation to the Open Women's Relay team who claimed gold by defeating the highly



fancied and nationally-ranked Mordialloc along with Saxon Beale's U15 flags & sprint double.

Travelling to the Perth for the Nationals with only three specific beach competitors, to make four finals was really quite impressive. Eleanor: 4th U/15 Sprint, Saxon: 6th U/15 Sprint, U/15 Girls Relay: 6th and Sally Cumming: 9th Open Women's Sprint (her second Open Final in a row). Sally also won her Masters Division Sprint, for the third time year in a row, which is very impressive. It was a great team effort as athletes, parents and the club supported all competitors during the campaign. Saxon and Daniel Stonehouse fronted up in the flags for strong performances, with Saxon making it through to the semi-finals, eventually being knocked out by a finals medallist.

As a member of this club for over thirty years it is clear to me that coaches, managers, athletes and parents all need to work together for the common good, as opposed to locking down athletes or event areas. If we keep programs narrow and specific rather than athletic for athletes who are not State or Nationals level yet, or have them sit in a tent all day waiting for one or two races, when they can be involved in other areas, to experience other skills, meet other club members and have some fun, then we as a club have failed.

This is only the start, the real work is yet to be done if the beach team is once again to win our section at the State Titles and be a force at the

Nationals. My job in 2015 is to make sure all athletes, coaches and parents get involved, that recruiting and development at junior and senior level remains our goal, with communication and Surf Life Saving culture our priority. To be a team, we must be as one, act as one, believe we are one and not just say we are Anglesea/Mentone. Thank you to everyone for the great work you all do for not just the Beach Team but the Anglesea/Mentone Team. A huge thank you to Kevin Rigg who simply does an amazing job to keep this club on the beach and in the water. Also a big thank you for the continued support from the Anglesea Board of Directors. Without people like Kevin Rigg and Peter Hurst getting on with the job and giving us the clear pathway for competition we would never achieve the results we have in 2014. Let us learn our lesson from the past and not place the burden on a few, so they burn out, leave and we are left with no-one to take their place. It's time to share the load.

On a personal note I would like to pay tribute to Charles Jones, the father of Marcus who passed away in May this year. Charles was an ever present supporter of not only his son Marcus but the entire Anglesea Beach Team. I will miss those quite moments' shared sitting with Charles at a carnival and simply enjoying the sun, sand and the green and white caps in competition.

The State Championships at Ocean Grove, saw Anglesea dominate again in the water area, in what turned out to be increasing testing conditions as the weekend progressed. Unfortunately this year we missed winning the Overall Point Score for the Carnival by only 11 points to Mordialloc LSC, which in retrospect is still a very commendable result. It was great to see Anglesea represented thoroughly in nearly every medal presentation of water events over the course of the weekend, in particular a promising sign is the depth of our Under 15 group which often had multiple teams vying for the podium. A couple of notable Gold medals were the Under 15 boys in their board relay while the Girls took out their respective Surf teams event. The under 17 men started what was to be a comprehensive weekend for the Anglesea ski section taking out Gold in their ski relay. The Under 19 Men really showed their power winning gold and silver in every ski event at the championships (single ski, double ski and ski relay), quite a remarkable achievement! The Open men had a run of thirds, led by the old bronzed man of the sea himself (Shane Edmonds) in the Surf teams, Ski relay and Taplin relay. Not to upset convention Eddo finished the





day off with a Bronze in the Open Iron Man. The club won back the coveted Open Life Saver Relay Title while in the Open Women's area a couple of bitter seconds were handed out by the gods of surf. In what was dubbed the most spectacular finish of the Carnival, Sam Phillips paddled his way to Gold in the Open Men's Double Ski, recorrecting his wayward partner as well as an out of control Half Moon Bay team to cross the line only inches before the impending field.

Now we are amicable again, a great amount of thanks must be given to all those involved in transport and logistics to get equipment across to Perth for the Australian Titles, which is massive undertaking and one that without such efforts, would make competing interstate impossible.

The 2014 Australian Championships, showed some very promising results for the Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club. A lot should be taken from this session as many of our junior athletes grow in ability and confidence in racing at the highest level. The water area at Nationals is always fiercely competitive, but all competitors did

themselves and their club proud by persisting and pushing to make it through the arduous rounds. A number of notable results must be mentioned, firstly to the Under 15 Boys board relay racing in their first Australian final. The Under 19 Men also excelled with Anglesea having two athletes in the Single Ski final and performed one of the top results for the carnival finishing a very competitive 6th place in Under 19 Ski relay (L. Watson, H. Vulcan, J. Campbell). Maddie Hurst turned her misfortune from States around and proved that she is by far the strongest Female ski paddler in Victoria racing in two Australian finals (Open women's ski and Open Mixed Double Ski). There were also many promising semi-final and quarter-final achievements that can be built on in the season to come.

Once again, well-done everyone on a great session! A massive thankyou to all those who made it possible and supported the competition section over last twelve months. This year we trialed a new Nipper parent program which enable parents to acquire CPR and First Aid skills as part of being a member of an Emergency Services Organisation. 48 Parents spent two mornings doing their Resuscitation Certificate and more than 20 spent another two mornings upgrading that to a Cert II Senior First Aid certificate.

In addition 10 Parents felt comfortable doing a 200 metre swim and spent another two mornings getting their Bronze Medal.

The program was such a success that we are planning to roll it out across a much broader group of parents and older members next year. It sets a great example to the junior members and gives parents the ability to respond effectively should someone need CPR or First Aid.

Marketing Report



During 2013/14 we were successful in receiving a number of grants including some \$10k from the Commonwealth Bank Staff fund that has allowed us to purchase new nipper boards for use by Starfish nippers and the general nipper program. We also received grants from Alcoa, our long term community partner and also the Surf Coast Shire that allowed us to purchase 4 new buoys for the Rock2Ramp one of our major fundraising events.

In mentioning the Rock2Ramp, we have enjoyed the support by our long term sponsors including Alcoa, Burson Autoparts, Hardings Hardware, Hamlan Homes / Squeekies, MC Herd Wholesale Meats and also Wyn Training. This year Funky Trunks / Funkita increased their support of the R2R along with XOSIZE and Hahn Super Dry through Lion became major sponsors of the swim.

The Rock2Ramp also continues to enjoy the ongoing support of Interface Recruitment, Mantra Hotels & Resorts, Brown Magpie and Forage wines without whom we would not continue to offer the place getters in each age group category the best prize pool of all surf coast based and possibly other swims.

The nipper program continues to have sponsors queuing up with ongoing support from John Pereira and Easybookings.com.au, Lorraine Lee Linen and Interface Recruitment. In November 2013, I was also very excited to be able to negotiate some advertising space on 5 large format digital billboards (very large TV screens) located at major intersections in the Melbourne metropolitan area through Octopus Media.

The primary aim of the advertising space was to promote our "annual" fundraising appeal. As a number of these billboards were located near bayside clubs, we created two 10 seconds ads featuring ASLSC members, one specifically promoting the ASLSC, the other asking the public to "support their local club". The ads ran on rotation from January through to April 2014 and although, the ads did little to generate donations, they provided a huge impact on brand awareness for lifesaving in general through what was a free advertising campaign that has a commercial cost in the order of \$600k, money Anglesea nor LSV would ever spend on this activity.

Andrew Patrick Ramsden 3.11.1934 - 17.10.2013

Andrew joined the Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club, together with his brother Richard, in 1954. He obtained his Surf Bronze Medallion on 29/11/1954, No V2, and immediately became involved in surf boat competition. He was elected Club Surf Boat Captain in 1956 and swept Senior and Junior crews to several carnival victories. He continued patrolling the beach until 1960 and there after was an Active Reserve member, until 1983 when he was appointed a Patron of the Club.

Andrew was instrumental in obtaining sponsorships for and personally contributing to the acquisition of several surf boats. In recognition of this, a boat was named after his wife, Anne. Just prior to his death, Andrew was responsible for some of his fellow Patrons contributing to the purchase of a fully equipped surf boat which was christened by his wife Anne, and was named 'Andrew Ramsden' in his



honour.

Andrew made a major contribution to Surf Life Saving Victoria in obtaining the 'Big M' sponsorship for the State and while being the Chairman of SLSV Foundation successfully assisted with funding for the building of the Headquarters of Life Saving Victoria at Port Melbourne.

Andrew will be missed by all who knew him and will be long remembered for his devotion to and generous support for the Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club.

Francis J Flynn 1.5.1946 - 18.1.2014

Frank had an incredible affinity for the ocean and surfing and usually surfed nearly every day before work as a physiotherapist. His knowledge of wave formation, change of tides, rips and run outs was second to none.

In 1966 he won the Marathon Barwon Board Paddle & a Board Paddling Competition in Queensland.

Frank gained his BM in 1966 & then again in 1985. He had an Instructors, ARC and Radio Operators Certificates. He was an ASLSC Committee member 1966-67, 1997-99 & Club Honorary Physiotherapist in 1997. He was a great Club person always trying his best in individual & team events, and assisted with the handicapping for the Club's Pt Roadknight Race.

During the 1980s he competed in Masters Life Saving events, supported the Clubs younger members with training in the Club's 'Mazda' High



performance squad. With Bruce Tayler the then SLSV Development Officer, designed a shorter version of SLISA's Rescue board in 1987, after much delay a version of this was finally approved by SLISA in 1989.

Frank's daughters Melissa & Shannon were very active in the Club, while son Nick pursued other sports, we extend to them our sympathy.

Royston Arthur Bell

29.12.1944 - 4.5.2014

Roy joined Anglesea SLSC in 1973, gained his BM on 6/1/1974, ARC 1976. He was Clubhouse Manager 1974-76, General Committee 1976-80; First Aid Officer 1980-82 & Gear Steward Assistant 1980/81; Roy was a patrolling member for 6 Years, an early member of the Polar Bears, & a member of the Boat section.

Roy's Club House Managers Report in 1975/76 ASLSC Annual Report noted:

"The Committee was concerned about the lack of interest shown by most members in the cleanliness of the Clubhouse, T.V. Room & most especially the kitchen & Bunkhouse"

He will be missed by many.



Graeme William G 'Bill' Knott

1938 - 2014

Bill joined the club during the 1954/55 season at the invitation of Richard Ramsden and gained his Bronze Medallion on 29/11/1954. It did not take Bill long to learn the skills of swimming in the surf, body surfing using the currents and run outs to his advantage, to get out the 'back' with or without a belt, he also became a valuable member of the Anglesea Senior R&R team and Belt Races.

Bill had early success in the State & National Teams both as a Junior and as a Senior, being selected in the Victorian team 5 times from 1955-63 and the National Team against New Zealand in 1961.

At the 1963 Australian Titles he was equal 2nd in the Senior Belt Race and 2nd with the Senior R&R, and in 1964 Nationals gaining 3rd with the Senior R&R Team..

At the Victorian Titles Bill competed with Anglesea in the Senior R&R Team which in 1959 was placed 3rd, 1960, and 1st in 1963, 1964... Bill also won numerous Anglesea Club Titles, was a member of the Club Committee 1956-64, and a patrolling member for 8 years.

In February 2012 at the Club's 60th Anniversary Bill with his Senior R&R team mates Robert



& David Kennedy, John Allan, Ian Smith, Tony White & coach John Worrell, were inducted into the Club's Inaugural 'Hall of Fame', a wonderful tribute and honour to all.

Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and are net of any rebates and discounts received.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

Bank overdrafts also form part of cash equivalents and are presented within current liabilities on the balance sheet.

Dividends are recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

It is not practical for the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Foundation to maintain an effective system of internal control over cash receipts in the General Cheque Accounts until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, my audit in relation to cash receipts was limited to amounts recorded and our audit in relation to the statement of financial position is limited on this basis.

Qualified Audit Opinion

In my opinion, except for the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had the limitation discussed in the qualification paragraph not existed, the financial report presents fairly in accordance with the basis of accounting as described in Note 1, the payments and receipts of the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Foundation for the period ended 30th April 2014 and its bank balances as at that date.
