## **President's Report**


# Anglesea SLSC's 60th Anniversary season was another highly successful one as a result of the sustained effort across all sections of the Club.

Our core business is lifesaving and this season we undertook over 5600 hours of patrol, performed several major rescues and over 1100 preventative actions. Under the direction of Lauren Chan, ably supported by Patrol Coordinator David Simpson, the Patrol Captains and Vice-Captains and Gear Steward Nick Tait, we delivered on our obligations in an effective and efficient manner. A pleasing feature this season was the number of new members on patrol late in the season. As always however we will be reviewing aspects of our performance with a view to ensuring an even better delivery of our services next season.

Closely allied to our patrolling capability is the work done in the Training and Development Services area under Tim Mason and the Chief Instructors. Based on a training needs assessment and a comprehensive, structured training plan for developing qualified members, this year the Club put through in excess of 300 awards and ran another highly successful Bronze Camp that is lifting the quality and expertise of our patrolling members.

Michael Sculz and his Nipper team again delivered a great program to our 500+ Nippers with a lot of very positive feedback. Special mention needs to be made of Janet Jones and her development of the Starfish Nipper Program for kids with special needs. What a great innovation and there has been interest shown from as far afield as the UK. Congratulations also to those Nippers who represented Anglesea at the State Titles at Lorne under really adverse conditions and to the parents who supported them.

Managing such a large Nipper program brings special challenges in respect to resources and risk management and satisfying LSV requirements is not getting any simpler. To this end we are currently reviewing the structure of this area in time for next season.



In the competition arena Anglesea again hosted a very successful carnival in early January and then backed-up to stage the Victorian Titles in March. Anglesea came a close 2nd in the Vic's but then stamped its authority at the National level with 2 Gold, 9 Silver and 7 Bronze medals across the Masters and Senior competitions, being the top Victorian club in both areas. Gary Brennan and Kevin Rigg need to be congratulated on their management of this area especially under the very difficult conditions that arose at Kurrawa this year. I would also like to make special mention of Tom Cullen who came on board as our Vic Titles Event Manager and delivered a terrific event.

This year saw us celebrate our 60th Anniversary and it was wonderful to be able to welcome back so many of our past members to help us celebrate the occasion in early February. One of the highlights was the inaugural Competition Hall of Fame and the announcement of John Worrell as a Legend of the Club.

## To run a successful Club is a team effort and I would like to acknowledge and thank:

- All of our Directors and our Committee who work hard year round to ensure we remain at the forefront of every aspect of lifesaving. In particular I must acknowledge the tireless effort of Co-Club Captain Matt Solly. Matt epitomises the true 'clubbie' in his single minded endeavours to ensure Anglesea is at the forefront of lifesaving in all its aspects and that it is seen as an integral part of the local community. He is a wonderful role model for our younger members.
- Our sponsors for your support of our club events and the club in general. We hope that your association with our club continues to be a positive one for your company.
- The organising teams of our three major club fundraisers the Golf Day, Rock2Ramp and the Door Knock. It takes a lot of work to prepare, conduct and review these events and the funds that they raise are essential for keeping the club financially sound.
- Our club patrons Dr Jake Foster, Robert Harding, Garry Johnson, John Worrell, Andrew Ramsden, Geoff Inman and Frank Herd for your ongoing support and valued contributions to our club.
- The Anglesea SLSC Foundation who continue to work quietly in the background and provide significant financial support.
- Our Office Manager, Diane Feudoloff, for the outstanding job she continues to do in keeping things ticking along.

Overall, financially the club has performed well this season and the audited financial report is contained later in this Annual Report. As foreshadowed last year we are considering the re-development of the lower clubhouse to make it fit-for-purpose for the next 50 years. This will not be a quick fix as there are considerable issues to be overcome in respect to planning and financing. The building sub-committee is working hard on the planning and a finance committee is developing a funding strategy to ensure that we build a facility that best meets the long term needs of the club.

From time to time I hear members comment that the Club is changing, that we risk becoming a social club, not a lifesaving club and that perhaps we should return to an earlier operating model. Let me be very clear. Change is inevitable and Anglesea SLSC will always look forward while acknowledging, building upon and drawing from the successes of the past. Everything we do, every decision taken, is with a view as to how that supports our core business which is providing a lifesaving service at Anglesea and its environs.

In conclusion I would like to thank the wives, husbands, partners and families of our members for your support which is vital to the effective operation of any volunteer organisation.

# **60 Years of Surf Life Saving**

#### Several hundred people helped Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club celebrate its 60th anniversary over the weekend of 3rd, 4th & 5th February 2012.

On Friday night over 130 past and present members, many who had travelled from interstate and one who had travelled from as far away as the USA, gathered to catch up and share their memories. The highlight of the evening was the presentation of SLSA 60 Year Service Awards to Wally Hanlon and John Worrell, both Life Members of the Club. Wally had travelled from Queensland to be at the weekend and was accompanied by a number of his children and grandchildren. A number of 50 and 25 Year SLSA Service Awards were also made and Club stalwart John 'Jimpy' Shears was presented with his own engraved bar stool.

A history display, covering 60 years of service to the Anglesea community, was on show over the weekend and was a source of many memories, one or two debates over the size of waves, or who was responsible for the surfboat being upside down!

On Saturday the Club held a traditional midday swim with over 70 taking part. It was noted some of the older groups, in particular the Over 70's and Over 80's, had lost a little of the speed they once showed. The swim was followed by a BBQ on the surf club deck

On Saturday night, over 230 people attended the Inaugural Anglesea SLSC Competition Hall of Fame Awards, to honour those who had made a significant contribution to Anglesea's success in the competition arena. The five inaugural inductees were the 1962-1964 Senior Rescue and Resuscitation Team of David Kennedy, Robert Kennedy, John Allen, Ian Smith, Bill Knott, Tony White, and coached by John Worrell, Stuart Fox (now CEO Hawthorn Football Club), Robert King, Shane Edmonds and Abby Lewtas. In addition, John Worrell was inducted as a Competition Legend - the highest honour which can be bestowed upon an inductee of the Anglesea SLSC Competition Hall of Fame, in recognition of his outstanding and lasting contribution at the highest level, to the culture, heritage and development of the club.

The weekend ended with a quiet Sunday and promises to meet old friends again in another 10 years.

As a further part of its 60th Anniversary, Anglesea, for the first time in 25 years, hosted the Victorian Surf Lifesaving Championships on the 10th and 11th March. Over 1000 competitors took part in an action packed weekend.

## **Administration Report**

The Administration year has been positive - with the club going well and with a number of good outcomes, trying to keep up with our Club of the Year Award from the previous year, with a consistent Leadership model now under Peter Williams.

The Café and Bar outsourcing to Amanda and Chris Gross and their Deck Café was finally confirmed pre Summer for a three year arrangement, with a review which will take place shortly. Feedback to date has been very positive, with the improved furniture, facilities and certainly hours availability to club members has been received well. Chris and Amanda have ensured, during the winter periods the Café is open Friday nights and over the weekends to hopefully provide focus around the club's usage and for members to use the facilities and the café as a nucleus for discussion and activities.

On the membership front, we have processed 1940 members - up a little on the previous years, which is a huge administration task as it usually comes in from September through to January. I would remind and ask members to try to utilise the online facilities, as it does alleviate some of the administration. Family memberships are still a little difficult with the online process, but please prevail as it does help our processing. Speaking of administration, I would like to thank Di Feudoloff, with support from Judy Sutherland, for managing all our administration, paperwork and lots of other activities which go outside the task of administration from time to time. The administration then goes through to our Finance Director - Shane Edmonds, where we see the accounts at the end of each year - again, good to see Shane's report showing a positive contribution.

Fundraising was again positive this year with the Golf Day, Rock 2 Ramp and Door Knocks all doing well – at or above our targets, to ensure good cash flow momentum for the club and to ensure our beaches are kept safe and our facilities in good shape.



The shop this year came into the Administration area of the club, and pleased to see the work done by Tina Kay who picked up the reins from Tracey Price and has continued to provide a great service to our club in merchandising and ensuring we cover our costs and provide a small profit. Tina is keen to ensure we use her retail and buying skills to ensure our merchandise is bought well, across Rock 2 Ramp, Bronze Camp and competition, where we spend quite a considerable amount on merchandising.

The Green and White Rag has unfortunately been a struggle with our President, Peter Williams, who picked up the work from Aby Lewtas who did a great job, prior to going overseas. We are still looking for someone to pick this up and meet our communication targets of distributing it four or five times a year.

We are now preparing for the summer period and looking forward to another positive contribution from the administration to assist in the success of the club and ensuring we continue to keep our beach safe

## **Rescue Services Report**

Another summer - another lifesaving season gone. This season was a new and reinvigorated one. With some familiar faces stepping down from club roles and/or patrolling, this left me stepping up into a new role as Director and David Simpson stepping up into Patrol Coordinator for the first time. This season saw over 100 new patrolling members take to the beach in their new red and yellow uniform at a time where Anglesea's beach is growing in popularity despite our fluctuating summer.

#### **KEY STATISTICS**

Despite the cooler days on the beach, and Anglesea's rising tide (at times up to the fence!), Anglesea's volunteer life savers performed their outstanding duties to the public in all sorts of weather. Our patrollers have kept busy administering first aid and with an increase in preventative actions from the previous season, Anglesea has had a decrease in rescues. Well done team!

#### **KEY HIGHLIGHTS**

This season we saw a number of highlights and new equipment. One noticeable one was the change of the blue surfer and boating flag to a black and white quartered flag. This is to be consistent with the rest of the country and signs overseas. Furthermore, just in time for those hot scorching days or cold, windy and raining days,



saw the arrival of two brand new red and yellow patrol tents. These are both more practical and operationally easier to use as they can together accommodate larger patrol numbers or be used individually to accommodate the smaller core members of patrol in those quieter times.

To assist the volunteer members at Anglesea SLSC to provide a safe environment to the public at such a high level, Anglesea SLSC received 4 new radios with waterproof bags and 5 new binoculars under relevant grants. Half way through the season also saw the implementation of the red broad brim surf rescue hats to protect our lifesavers from the sun as well as appear more visible to the public.



Our radio tower had a makeover of its own. A new bench and door was installed and the radios replaced. It is will increase its use next season. And if that wasn't enough for one season, we were still able to provide a public patrol for both days of the Surf Lifesaving Victoria State Titles near the Anglesea river mouth.

#### **FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS**

Season 2012/13 is looking at outdoing this past season. A patrol handbook is being reviewed for Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) members and the patrol system looking at being revamped and reinvigorated. A new uniform for ongoing ASR members is anticipated as is organising a few specialist groups to run patrols over the quieter times.

I would like to thank my team of volunteers for the endless hard work during the 2011/12 season. Without these people, providing a lifesaving service to the public would not be possible and with that make my job much more difficult. The carnival gave us the opportunity to assess the planning and requirements which would come into play in March when we were to host the Victorian State Championships. We won the carnival, thereby getting us off to a strong start in our endeavour to win back to back state titles. As is always the case, there was to be much water under the bridge along the way.

Lifesaving clubs are very fluid places and there is always a significant number of members coming in and going out and this season. It was no different for us as many of our young competitors lives moved into different phases. Graduating students taking up University placements in the northern states, saw at least three key water competitors move on and while all of us at the club wish these competitors every success in their academic pursuits, there is no hiding from the fact this had an impact on the team's overall points score, especially at States. The club wishes everyone who moved on, success in their future endeavours and trusts they will one day return.

Anglesea hosted the Victorian State Titles, with the event taking place on the long weekend in March. Anglesea entered a large contingent of competitors and additionally mobilised a large team of helpers who were ably led by Tom Cullen. We posted many significant results, some of my personal highlights being Sam Phillips' win in the surf race and Joel Simondson's efforts in competing with a broken foot, still managing to win individual races and contribute to teams as well. The Beach, Boats and R&R sections all contributed, with another highlight being the R&R Section winning the perpetual trophy for the first time ever. Thanks must go to Peter Williams, Tom Cullen, Kevin Rigg and the many helpers who contributed to our hosting of a very successful event, we will no doubt repeat when we do it again next year. Overall, we came second, and we look forward to chasing the title again next year.

Anglesea, once again, sent a large team to the Australian Titles. While everyone is aware of what transpired with the tragic loss of Matthew Barclay, we did still compete and manage to get on the podium a few times. On behalf of the whole club I would like to thank everyone who assisted in the search for Matthew, especially Michael Rigg who in his untiring capacity as a IRB water safety team member spent many hours on the water in difficult and trying conditions. Yet again, we were the number one Victorian team on the points table. A key result

in the open championships was Cat McArthur & Tom Penney winning silver in the Open Mixed Double Ski - this was Anglesea's first craft medal for many years and the achievement is worthy of high praise. Other podium appearances were Sam Horne's silver in the 2K run, Marcus Jones' silver in the U15 flags, Callum Beattie-Powell's bronze in the U15 beach sprint, Claire Lewtas' bronze in the open flags and the Open Women's R&R team also winning bronze. In the Masters, yet again, our small contingent achieved significant results in the water, on the beach and in the boats. An unexpected highlight was the 140 years plus Men's Beach Relay winning back to back gold medals and there was no hiding the sheer joy of the Masters Women's boat crew winning silver. Thank you to all the coaches, support staff, competitors and mum's and dad's for their fantastic efforts once again this year.

Easter saw a relaxed environment for competitors, with the club championships taking place and the annual Roadknight race. The surf was big and everyone who ventured in had fun. The chief judge (aka the director of competition) was tested time and time again by many of the competitors' interpretations of the rules, however, all is fair and a good time was had by all. The Roadknight race took place after a big night in the clubhouse where plans were hatched and came to fruition in the light of day, in retrospect might best have been left in the clubhouse the night before! That being said, 15 competitors comprised 10 teams and the handicapper had his work cut out for him. Trying to estimate the time taken for a floating bath tub to get to Roadknight and back was definitely a challenge. In the end the boys in the bath tub (Sam Phillips & Tom Penney) went off scratch along with a swimmer, followed by various ski teams, ski and board paddlers. At the end of the race Rohan Fanning was victorious having swum there and back in just over 47 minutes. For the record the bath tub did it in 60+ minutes (we stopped counting...). We look forward to a new sleeker, streamlined (and waterproof) bath tub at next year's event.

We also need to recognize Claire Lewtas and Tom Penny who were selected in the state team. Tom was also selected to the Wieland Shield together with Wayne Cartwright as team manager.

# **Anglesea Surf Boat**Section Report

Anglesea's boat crews put in a creditable performance during the past season, culminating in a bronze medal for Doug Solly's 'Anglesea Angels' in the 130+ years section at the Australian Masters at Kurrawa Beach. This followed another bronze at the ASRL Championships at Stockton Beach in February, in the 160+ age section and a win at the Victorian Masters. The crew performed exceptionally well in open women's competition throughout the season.

In the 240+ Master's category, the 'Anglesea Swampys' were again, competitive (despite the onset of years!) with a bronze medal at the ASRL Championships at Stockton while suffering some misfortune at each of the Victorian and Australian championships where success was thwarted by some unkind surf – although their 'wipe-out' at the latter event was one of the more spectacular performances of the day. Special thanks to Eliza and Karen for stepping in with the blokes to enable them to compete in several of the carnivals and the Aussies.

It was good to welcome Joe Bergin and his crew back to Anglesea this year with new-comer Don joining James, Jamie and Andrew. The crew competed well in Reserve Grade competition although we expect them to step up again in future into Open competition where they have previously been among the top crews. Work, travel and family commitments this year, seriously disrupted training and competition and prevented the crew from reaching its full potential. It just missed wins at Jan Juc and in the Reserve Final at the Vic Championships. However, it did set the Anglesea team up with a silver medal in the Lifesaver Relay at the Vics.

Our 'regular' reserve grade crew, the 'Fins' swept by Doug Solly and later by David 'Fan Belt' Eades, also performed well despite a disrupted season. Early morning and early evening training sessions did however, prove challenging for both the crew, and for commercial shipping, as the crew's attempts to navigate by the stars generally ended in the main shipping channels. The 'Fins' won bronze in their age category at the Victorian VSRL Masters Championships at Lorne and made the Reserve Grade final at Jan Juc. An important win was in the first heat at the Anglesea carnival immediately after the beachside tribute to the late Simon Hunter, well know to boaties around the coast.

A particularly positive sign was the appearance of an under 18 boat crew early in the season which showed great potential. School commitments prevented the boys from competing beyond a couple of early carnivals but if we can attract young people of this calibre, the boat section will be assured of success in the future.

It is anticipated that several crews will also feature in this year's World Life Saving Masters to be held in early November at Christies Beach S.A. with good prospects in a couple of sections.

We encourage anyone with an interest in surfboat rowing to make themselves known to Paul Hearne, Doug Solly, Fan Belt, Joe Bergin or myself and join in with others in what is one of the most exciting and rewarding activities in surf life-saving. Already, we have started to introduce some new (and ex) Club members to boat rowing with crews building for next season. We would certainly welcome others to join in, so if you have family, friends or know someone that might be interested in becoming involved get in touch with one of the above. We are aiming to meet during the Winter for a row at Anglesea or Pt Roadknight on the first Sunday of each month to coincide with Polar Bears (which is a great opportunity to meet other club members and get to know one another).

Thanks to Paul Hearne as boat captain, and Doug Solly for sweeping duties, as well as doing some of the 'grunt' work around the section.

## **R & R** (Section Report)

After winning the State Titles, the team went to the Aussies. It was not smooth sailing at the Aussies for anyone this year, and with the change in circumstances to the R&R competition, a medal was by no means assured, especially as our 'patient' could no longer compete. Stepping up to fill in was young Maddie Brown. Maddie did a great job as a 15 year old competing against much older and experienced swimmers and, at the end of the day, the open women's team scored the bronze medal - a fantastic effort under the circumstances!

Our U19 team was essentially a new team retaining just one of the previous year's Aussie gold medallists in Shea Curwell (reel). Making up the rest of the team was some new recruits - Lachlan Travers (belt swimmer) & Maddie Brown (patient) - as well as some experienced competitors transferring in - Georgia Wyett (1st line) & Kirsten Davis (2nd line). They scored a silver medal at States and competed at the Aussies against some very experienced teams.

Our U15 team - was all new to R&R and based out of Mentone. The team comprised: Julia Howell, Darcie Van Den Broek, Shannon Russo, Ruby Martin & Gabby Blink. Their coach nicknamed them the 'Meerkats' because they could not stop looking around - this is an excellent survival trait in meerkats, but a deduction in R&R.

This year at States we made sure we competed in as many events as possible. Previous competitors including Warren Clarke, Callum Brennan &

Paige Brown helped us out and competed across various teams. In addition, our U15's, U19's & Open Women's competed across other events as well.

Well done to all our Masters Beachies, as they show many of our Open and underage competitors just what club, team and squad commitment and loyalty are all about. A special mention and many thanks to Ben Owzinksy who rocks up to every carnival, always has a big smile on his face, runs the open men's 2km having a great time start to finish, rain hail or shine. Once again, great club spirit.

To be honest at Open and under age level this was a difficult season, one that tested my resolve. We had a few athletes with their minds on the job at hand, but for others studies, injuries and life in general played havoc and as a squad and more so as a competition team we were thin in numbers and team unity was fragmented.

The light at the end of the tunnel were the U/15 boys team who were some of our most consistent performers all season and their results at States and Nationals speak volumes as to what being an Anglesea Beachie is all about. Two silver medals at Nationals for these boys, one to Marcus Jones in the flags with an injured thumb and silver to Callum Beattie - Powel who dragged himself back from the disappointment of the relay not making the final to refocus and run the race of his life in the sprint, showed the determination and belief we need back in this team.

Claire Lewtas was not only the best female beach competitor for this club, but one of the best in the nation. Claire gained State selection for the interstate competition, dominated the State titles with three gold medals and then took equal fourth in the National sprint final, then her first individual Open medal in the flags with a bronze medal. What I was most proud of was how Claire stepped up to the plate as a leader during the season, especially at the Nationals, were in her own time and initiative helped our junior athletes in warm up and technique work prior to competition.

Lloyd Knight due to injuries to other squad members spent most pre-season training by himself, so it was a great effort for him to make the semis of the Open men's sprint, flags and relay. Chris Watts was our other State representative who along with Claire made the final of the U/19 men's flags for the second year in a row.

Sam Horne one of our most consistent performers all year in the 2km was in fourth position with 100m to go. With the whole team cheering him on Sam dug deep, pumped his arms hard, found an extra gear and kicked home in the final twenty metres to take bronze. Sam will be in U/17 age division again next season,



so we look forward to bigger and better things in 2013. Daniel Stonehouse also in the U/17 age division competed in all events, gaining huge points for us each week. The U/15 team move up into his age division next season which will create a very strong U/17 squad for us.

Brendan Maher showed just how fast he can run at the States and looked like he would make the National Open men's sprint final before doing a hammy in the relay semi. Brendan is back training with the squad and looks set for a good season next year. Michael Beltrame, or Bel's as we call him was injured all season and then puts it out there to make the National Open men's final to finish eighth. Bel's has already put in a few solid months of pre-season training and I can only imagine what a fit Bel's is capable of.

Molly Blanchonette is another athlete who was injured for nearly the entire season, but came back at the States for a silver and bronze medal and then giving our Open women's team the depth we needed to beat the Mordialloc women's team to take gold. We need Molly, Hayley Atkins, Matt Dyson and Annabel Rodway, back next year, not only because they are great competitors, but because they create character and spirit for the team that as a squad was missing this season. We need all these athletes, fit, well and ready to go next year.

David Walker and Kate Walker are not only back in training, but completing five to six sessions a week, along with Lloyd, Bel's and myself Both athletes have committed themselves to the Beach team with Kate helping me with recruitment and ideas for how we can move forward in 2013.

Ryan Hartshorne (Rhino) like Sally, both of whom have been mentioned in the Masters section, played an integral role in the Open division, not just because they make Open carnival or State finals and in many cases finishes top three, but because they give this team structure, maturity and unselfish leadership.



The Bronze Camp is now a smoothly oiled machine, with our fantastic group of Senior Instructors understanding the structure of the camp and being gently pushed out of the way by the up and coming Junior Instructors.

Bronze Plus Camp remains a hot bed of development, with ongoing, sometimes spontaneous, changes to the curriculum continuing to occur. This year a real focus on IRB started with the planned introduction of a Victorian Boat License course and the shifted into running a variety of Crew and Drivers Courses. Thanks to Nick Tait and Issac Newcomb for their great work with the changes.

Despite the work done in the IRB area to fix the clubs shortage of drivers, we were only able to get 7 new drivers qualified over summer, but we think the changes to Bronze Plus, combined with some other changes to the running of IRB courses, along with 4 new IRB Trainers and a new IRB Assessor, will mean we will double the number of awards this coming year.

The Junior Instructors Camp not only produced 32 new Bronze Instructors, they all had a great week.

It provided a great spring board for a number to assist in other courses over Summer and become an instructor in those courses.

In addition to the Bronze Squad run in January, a number of smaller groups for Nipper parents were organised by Matt Solly, which enabled those people to get their awards.

Each year, a number of parents are interested in doing a Bronze, but are worried about the water component. Apply Senior First Aid is a 2 day course which has all the Bronze, apart from the water and radio sections to enable people to be able to patrol, as well as providing great instruction in CPR. It is a bridge into Bronze.

This year we created 9 new SFA Instructors and 4 Assessors, which will let us offer the course to 14 year olds, as well as parents over the coming summer. This will be an exciting development and is typical of how we need a year or two in order to train the trainers, before we expand the courses we offer.

We were also able to obtain some significant assistance from the government, to provide all the training. It has enabled us to offer some fee relief to parents who completed the application forms and also provided funds to let us enhance and expand the quality of the classrooms for next summer.

I would like to thank all the trainers and assessors who helped over summer. There were more than 50 people involved and every little thing they have done is appreciated. We are committed to expanding the number of trainers and assessors, so to be able to better share the load among a broader group. In particular I should thank the Chief Instructors - El Beavis, Caitlin Paton, Toby Dickson and Michael Teal for their efforts.

We plan to run an assessors course in the next few months, as part of the lead up to next summer and are also in planning with LSV to become a Licensed Training Provider for LSV. This will enable us to provide employment opportunities to our instructors and a constant revenue base for the club in delivering courses to schools and community groups throughout the year.



### Notes to the Financial Statements

#### Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the requirements of the .

The financial report covers ANGLESEA SURF LIFESAVING CLUB INC. as an individual entity. ANGLESEA SURF LIFESAVING CLUB INC. is an association incorporated in Australia.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the economic entity in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

#### Income tax

The income of the Incorporation is exempt from income tax in accordance with the provisions of Section 23(g) of the Income Tax Assessment Act, as the Incorporation falls within the definition of a society, association or club established for the encouragement of a game or sport.

Non-member income of the association is only assessable for tax, as member income is excluded under the principle of mutuality.

#### **Inventories**

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

#### Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

#### a) Property

Freehold land and buildings are measured on the fair value basis, being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction. It is a policy of ANGLESEA SURF LIFESAVING CLUB INC. to have an independent valuation every three years, with annual appraisals being made by the directors.

The revaluation of freehold land and buildings has not taken account of the potential capital gains tax on assets acquired after the introduction of capital gains tax.

#### b) Plant and equipment

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining the recoverable amounts.

#### c) Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives to ANGLESEA SURF LIFESAVING CLUB INC. commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Properties held for investment purposes are not subject to a depreciation charge. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the Improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

#### Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and in all call deposits with banks or financial institutions, investments in money market Instruments maturing within less than two months, net of bank overdrafts.

#### Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

#### Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking in to account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established. Dividends received from associates and joint venture entities are accounted for in accordance with the equity method of accounting.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### **Employee entilements**

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee entitlements expected to be settled wiithin one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount.

Contributions are made by ANGLESEA SURF LIFESAVING CLUB INC. to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.



#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2012

#### 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The Trustees of the Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Foundation have prepared the financial statements of the Foundation on the basis that the Foundation is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial reports. This financial report is therefore a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in order to meet the needs of the Foundation's beneficiaries.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below which the Trustees have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of the Foundation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of this report are as follows:

#### **Financial Assets**

Investments are measured at net market values. Dividends and interest are brought to account when received.

Financial assets are initially recognised on the cost basis, including acquisition charges associated with the financial asset. The carrying amount of financial assets are reviewed annually by the Trustees. The recoverable amount is assessed from the quoted current market value for shares in listed companies or the underlying net assets for other non-listed corporations. The expected net cash flows from investments have not been discounted to their present value in determining the recoverable amounts, unless otherwise stated.

#### **Income Tax**

The income of the Foundation is exempt from income tax in accordance with the provisions of Section 23 (g) (iii) of the Income Tax Assessment Act, as the Foundation falls within the definition of a society, association or club established for the encouragement of a game or sport.
