PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Season 2015-2016 concludes another year of significant milestones for Anglesea SLSC.

We have a clear direction with the 2015-2020 strategic plan and eight strong strategic priorities. Being a large club and active in many facets of lifesaving, we have an impressive and healthy membership with varying views regarding its direction and the paths to take. The consultation process has been robust with workshops and numerous consultation meetings up to Board level to achieve a consensus on the pillars of our future.

It is important that members are aware of the club's purpose, vision and mission which can be found on the club website.

Our core values, in the way we conduct ourselves, is most important. We are welcoming, inclusive and supportive; open to communication; respectful to each other and the community; responsible, while seeking innovation and excellence.

As a leading Australian lifesaving club, Anglesea performed its patrols, managed by David Simpson, Director Rescue Services, with excellence during the season. There were numerous rescues and first aid events including a number outside core hours where our Club Captain, Mathew Solly, featured in many of these difficult and challenging incidents. The skill levels and standards of our members are sound due to the energies of Tim Mason, Director Development, and his enthusiastic

team. Lifesaving has predominantly young members, they need support and guidance to achieve the levels of excellence we seek. It is incumbent on the more senior members of the club to help nurture and support our youth.

The club continues to be successful with grants and sponsorships. We have a new 4WD donated by Alcoa as a farewell gesture; a grant for a solar hot water system which is now connected and, as I write this report, a grant for solar power. Jim Geary continues his portfolio with enthusiasm. A sincere thank you to all our club sponsors, event coordinators, patrol captains, trainers and assessors. We have many wonderful people involved in our club, which contributes to its outstanding success.

The Patrons and Anglesea Supporters Group have made many significant contributions to the club and members over the season and we thank you for your ongoing support.

We always welcome parent support from the Nipper area as they follow their children's lifesaving career journey. Another successful year with Naomi Symington, Director Youth Development; Janet Jones, Starfish and Big Nipper, Fraser MacVean, who is stepping down. Thank you for your contributions, Fraser.

The new building project is a strategic priority in developing



the club's infrastructure to ensure its facilities cater for a growing and increasingly diverse membership base and greater community involvement.

The Chair of the Building Group, Andrew Suttle, and the Chair of the Finance Group, Peter Foster, are working tirelessly on behalf of members to achieve the necessary milestones in a complex process. We have a working group who have committed many hours of their time to support the building project. Special mention to Peter Williams and Michael Carr for their support.

It is time new energy takes the reigns as presidency. I wish to thank the Board and Committee on its outstanding achievements over my current term as president. I acknowledge that the roles of the Board are demanding, complex and time-consuming, which should be appreciated by members. Stepping down are Angela Brennan, Director Surf Sports; Emma Moore, Vice President; Mathew Solly, Club Captain; and Kevin Rigg, Director Facilities. We farewell Diane Feudoloff, our club administrator for many years, who is moving on to new life challenges. Anglesea has been a Victorian leader and one of the first clubs to engage an administrator to assist with the high demands running a club. Thank you to Jennie Mauderer and Jaci Chin-Jewson who have hit the ground running taking on administration roles supporting Ingilby Dickson, Director Administration, and Richard Carr, Director Finance.

Congratulations to the many Anglesea nippers who participated with pride and the Anglesea/Mentone seniors who again won the champion club at the 2016 Victorian state titles. Special mention to Prue Weber who has been elected as Life Saving Victoria – Life Member.

Also my congratulations to Matt Solly being made a life member of ASLSC at last year's AGM.

I sincerely thank you, the members, and your contributions which have made us a strong and successful club.

ADMINISTRATION REPORT

My sixth year as administration director continuing to provide voluntary services to our surf club and it's been another big year.

The administration activities cover a wide range of services that we provide to the club to keep the paperwork and the office processes moving forward. These include:

- Running the administration office.
- Managing our outsourced relationship with the café and bar.
- Organising external venues and activities, mainly in the winter, to utilise our facilities – mostly the Ray Marsh room.
- Providing administration support to all the other key activities across the club including of course the key fundraisers (door knock, Rock 2 Ramp swim, and golf day).
- Organising this annual report, which is always a challenging exercise.
- Working closely with the finance director Richard Carr to ensure our accounts are in order and the administration function meets our strict governance processes.

This year we've seen a significant step-change in the administration office with Di Feudoloff deciding after almost 16 years to move on to her next career chapter. Di has looked after the office and administration requirements of our club with great diligence and service to ensure that all of our volunteers, and particularly those directors that need some help from time to time, are kept in line in terms of expenditure and various administration processes! We wish Di well in her next chapter and a more formal thanks will take place at the AGM.

One of the key activities that I've been engaged in recently is finding Di's replacement when we ran via local advertisement of the role, and I'm pleased to announce (for those that have not yet met her) we have appointed Jaci Chin-Jewson who started post-Easter of this year. Jaci comes to us with a similar background and skills within the local community at Jan Juc and so is well aware of the activities involved in a surf club and volunteers. We welcome Jaci to the Anglesea family.

The other big change we have managed over the last few months is the café and bar operator changeover, from Chris and Amanda who ran The Deck café to our new operators Matt and Jemma, who now run what is called Captain Moonlight. Chris and Amanda were formally farewelled over the Easter period and were our first real end-to-end service provider, meeting our café and bar services over the last 5 years and have laid the foundation for utilising our club and engaging better into the local community by providing

a point of focus (particularly in the winter months) to allow walkers, cyclists and other members and non-members to utilise our fabulous facilities. Chris and Amanda have now moved on to warmer climates of Queensland and we wish them well. After an expression of interest process we finally appointed Jemma and Matt and their Captain Moonlight brand who took over post-Easter, and for those that have had the opportunity to review their services the response to date has been fantastic. They've changed the menu and service a little to ensure that we continue to reach out to members to seek their engagement, and the recent initiative of Friday night happy hours and Sunday BYO dinners have been a great success. The look and feel of the café and the Ray Marsh Room has also improved with chairs that Jemma found for us and that the club have purchased, and they've also invested in improving the kitchen, bar and general ambience of our facility, with more to come which will happen post-AGM with a mini-refurbishment. Welcome Jemma and Matt.

Our shop has again been managed by Tina Kay who continues to provide a fantastic service and ensure our uniforms and merchandise are all available and well-priced and also generate a small return to the club. This year we were able to show a net return of \$19,000 and at the same time continue to have good stock management and minimum losses, which is no mean feat across our various volunteer activities. Looking forward to continue supporting Tina in the new year and we're hoping to add some further opportunities for improvement with an email/online offer as well.

The office and banking area has been well managed over the year by Di with great support also from Judy Sutherland which we'd like to acknowledge and thank, as she's advised this will be her last year as treasurer. Many thanks Judy. We also have a lot of support from Richard Carr's office through Mark Griffin: when he's not doing his busy day job making Richard look good, he does provide a great deal of support to Di and more recently Jaci and Judy in regard our accounting packages and software and ensuring it stays effective.

The other activity that we'd like to become better at is cost-to-serve transparency of the various activities that the surf club provides to our members and the wider Anglesea community. Our plan this year is to provide a brief description of that cost-to-serve basis and in future years provide a greater level of detail so we can understand what the contribution that the café's providing to the club, the cost of running patrols, maintaining our training services and of course the



cost to run competitions so that members can get a better understanding as to where their membership fees go and also improving the cost-effectiveness of how we interface with the wider community. High level cost-to-serve details of this year include:

- Café and Ray Marsh Room contribution to the club \$14,000
- Patrols and rescue service net cost to serve for the season \$10,000
- Training and Development cost net of capital \$3,000
- Competition costs in total across R&R, boats, craft and beach \$14,000
- Shop contribution \$19,000

These costs-to-serve are after any specific capital spent in these particular areas, for example a boat or ski in the competition area, or specific costs such as a new boat. As always, doing this type of analysis often raises more questions than it answers but it's been a question from members in the past to provide more transparency than just our accounts, which are consolidated. Hopefully this is useful.

The other point I'd like to make is I also look after the SRC training each year which is part of the youth development activities. This year's been my 10th year to provide support and leadership to the SRC program, where we've now seen well over 500 young under 14-year-olds achieve their SRC certificate and be able to start their journey in life saving

through patrol activities and hopefully through to bronze and wider community engagement and service. This year I've been greatly supported by Derek Stott, Noel Langford, Sarah Gardiner and Jakob Shaw who all provide their volunteer service to meet the strict requirements of ensuring our under-14s are trained well enough to be able to facilitate and participate in the important patrol activities of our club.

I'm looking forward to serving for another year in the Administration Director role and look forward to continuing to provide good support to a number of activities across our wonderful surf club.

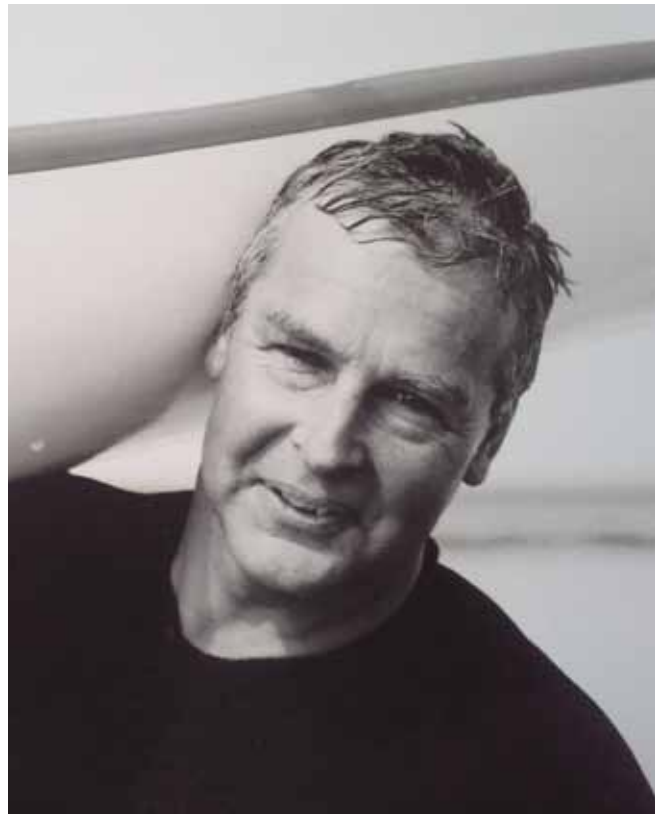


CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Without the ongoing support of key ASLSC members our equipment and behind the scenes planning would not be possible. It takes a team to ensure we can fulfill our club's SLSA and LSV requirements. Thank you to Tom Cullen as Patrol Coordinator, Lloyd Simpson as First Aid Officer, Ross Peasnell as Gear Stewart and Colin Anderson who maintains our IRB motors. A special thank you to the leadership and time our Club Patrol Captains commit to each year. They ensure our standards are met, services are delivered and their teams are available each rostered patrol. Thank you to Rosie Anderson, Kenny Yap, Tom Cullen, Ash Smith and Nick Tait (co captains), Seb Top and Jack Fry for another fantastic, safe and professional job they have all undertaken this season.

Thank you also to all 67 of our Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) members, I hope that you have enjoyed the challenges that ASR has given you the learning involved. Thank you also to everyone who returned for another year of participation and

a big congratulations for all first year members. Without our Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) members our beach would not be as safe as it is. I hope that you all continue to support Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) in the future. Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) is open to all members, if you are interested please contact David or Tom or speak to any of our Patrol Captains.

This season ASLSC members manned the beach for a total of 6,483 hours over 47 patrols. With a major focus on increasing on-patrol training and development of our core lifesavers, the Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) groups, and all members alike, it ensures the Anglesea Main Beach continues to be a safe beach for all members of the public. This year our lifesavers performed 1,209 preventative actions and 11 rescues. We performed 45 first aids, including 3 major first aids ranging from breaks and dislocations to spinal injuries. Thank you to every member who assisted on one or many of our patrols, including all of the members in the table below who completed 30 or more hours.

Congratulations to Andrew Rechtman on receiving a Life Saving Victoria Bronze Recognition Award for completing 102 hours of patrol. Andrew has now patrolled 796 hours in 10 years of patrolling. Completing over 100 hours in 2007, 2013 and now 2015 season.

RESCUE SERVICES REPORT (CONTINUED)

Next Season I am very excited to continue our hard work in increasing patrol participation with a focus towards increased knowledge, patrol readiness and clear pathways from the Silver Camp to patrolling, patrolling the Anglesea Beach and how we best do this. We intend to also introduce a new induction program for all first time patrolling members to ensure they are informed of their responsibility, rights and purpose when

patrolling. You will also see a new recognition for long term Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) members, a very exciting initiative that thank our key patrolling members.

Undefeated at Victorian SLS Carnivals in season 2015/16.

Selected in the Victorian Team for the National Interstate Championships.

Nominated as both Junior and Senior Athlete of the Year for the 2016 Awards of Excellence.

Sally Cumming – while most of the competition season was not great for Sally as she was injured, she was able to keep her motivation going throughout and produce her best at the right time of the season by defending her 30-34 Years Women's Beach Sprint title at the Australian SLS Masters Championships. This was Sally's fifth year in a row of winning the Beach Sprint title which is an amazing achievement in itself. Along with the Gold, Sally also claimed Silver in both the 30-34 Years Women's Beach Flags (behind our very own Abby Lewtas) and 140 Years Women's Beach Relay together with Abby, Naomi Symington and Ilona Plant.

For the first time in its history, an Open Men's crew from ASLSC was invited into the Ocean Thunder Series, an illustrious event that only the top crews in Australia are invited to participate in. Although the crew did not get the results they wanted their confidence was being built and success was achieved in making the elimination final in only their second appearance. Also representing at a National event was the 'Anglesea Agents' Masters ladies crew who again competed in the coveted George Bass Marathon. This event runs for 7 days and covers 190km. A tough race by all accounts in sloppy, wet conditions saw the crew put in an admirable display by finishing 4th in their division.

Australian Surf Rowers League (ASRL) Open Championships & State Representation

A goal of the section was to achieve representation of 3 crews at State level. This was almost achieved with both the U23 Men & Women securing the status of top crews in Victoria to represent the BIG V at the Australian Surf Rowers League (ASRL) Open Championships. Unfortunately the Open Men sitting in equal second place, could not get over the line in the main event and missed out on selection. A huge Congratulations to both the U23 Men & Women on this huge achievement. Four crews eventually competed the ASRL Open Championships held in February at Shell Harbour SLSC. The Masters Men, the U23 men's and women's State team crews (who also rowed in their age groups) and the Open Men. Both the U23 crews raced well in representing Victoria & gained valuable racing experience. The crews did their respective divisional racing (U23's & Open Men). The U23 men were up first and throughout their 5 races showed form to only miss out on the finals by 1 point. It was a great effort men. The U23 women looked strong throughout the racing and comfortably made it through to finals, however a wave at the right time for the other crews saw our girls being swamped and missing out on going through to the top 8 and finishing in the top 12. The Open men also made it through a tough draw to reach the finals and finish in the top 12.



State Titles

The section represented the club very well at the State Titles, including the Open Men in the Lifesaver relay. A great tussle with the ASRL Open Champs, Torquay ensued and overall we finished 2nd to Torquay in the event - a massive effort by all involved. The Open Men made it to the final, finishing 4th, with the performance of the day going to the U23 girls who came away with the Gold medal having a clean sweep in all three races. This put them in good stead for a potential Aussie Champs finals berth.

The Aussies

Attention then turned The Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships. The boat section was given a great start to the campaign with the 'Anglesea Agents' in the Women's 140 division rowing extremely well through their rounds and bringing home a Bronze medal. The Masters Men 'Drifters' unfortunately did not have a great start rolling in their first race, but regained composure in the following rounds. A big thanks to David Love who came across from Rosebud to fill in the position for Barry White. In the open divisions, our U23 men & women, reserve grade and open men's & women's teams competed. The U23 girls made it through to the final day of racing after impressing the crowd by rowing hard in their heats, but they missed out on making the medal race. All the other crews raced well but missed out getting past the elimination rounds.

- 212 New Bronze Medals over all
- 114 new IRB Crew following Bronze Camp
- Program operating at around the financial breakeven point for the year

Bronze Camp has had a proud tradition of honouring the history of our club, The John 'Jimpy' Shears Shield is awarded to the best Bronze House and all of our Instruction tents have been named after a club figure. This year we were proud to name our fourth instruction tent the 'John Worrell Tent' and it was wonderful to have John address the new Bronzies and witness the unveiling of the new tent.

Very pleasing to see such high levels of patrolling activity from our teenagers in particular from those who attended development week. A real credit to the training program and the Instructors who have encouraged their efforts. The only blip has been the low level of participation from the Bronze Instructors Camp attendees. Many of them are entering VCE and had other commitments but it is in contrast to the 60%+ involvement last year.

School Bronze Camps

This year we hosted School Bronze Camps from St Kevin's College and Albert Park College. That enabled us to offer paid employment to some of our Senior Instructors to teach those candidates. All students joined the club and a number subsequently patrolled and did their IRB Crew Course.

The Albert Park College Camp was done in conjunction with Port Melbourne LSC and has deepened our relationship with that club. The students did some lead up lessons at PMLSC before camp.

St Kevin's had wanted to have a camp integrating an outdoor education opportunity with an outside of school community engagement. They were very encouraged by the results.

Both Schools are planning to return next year and well done to Lachie Appleby and Annabel Mason who led the Camps.

Requal Sessions

During the season we requalified 480 Bronze and more than 700 other awards in what was a remarkable series of Requals.

The season was more confused than normal because of the Wye River Fires which cancelled the Boxing Day Session. We invited all Wye River and other affected people to come to our requals later in the season and a number were able to take up that offer.

We encourage all people who have an award to keep their awards current. In particular Resuscitation and First Aid Award holders need to practice and retest their CPR skills every year. The Requal is not a pass or fail session, but rather designed to reteach you until you are able to reach the required standard.

Ongoing Profitability

We were able to Requal more than 500 people and issue more than 700 new awards to our members this year. Those awards represent a significant increase in the knowledge and abilities the members of our community and helps reduce drowning, our key objective. They also skill our patrols to a standard that enables us to patrol the beach.

Our activities contributed nearly \$100,000 to the local camps, shops and providers.

We were also able to make a small positive contribution to the club.

That we can achieve so much whilst making a contribution to both the local community and to the club should be a source of great pride to our members.

Senior and Chief Instructors

All of this would not be possible without the fantastic Senior and Chief Instructors who so willingly give of their time and showcase all that is wonderful about the youth coming through our system.

Our goal should be to create the framework and structure to enable them to become the best contributors they can be.

BUILDING REDEVELOPMENT UPDATE

The past year has seen significant progress in respect to the lower clubhouse redevelopment project.

Our applications for Coastal Consent and Planning Permission was submitted late 2014 and in November 2015 Surf Coast Shire arranged a consultative meeting with objectors (there were 14 in total) and club representatives. As a result of feedback at that meeting the club agreed to undertake additional community consultation and to review aspects of the design.

Consultation sessions were held in January and March and concerns raised, together with feedback from within the club, are currently being addressed with the building plans being revised accordingly.

Once the revised plans are finalised the club will be resubmitting the application for Coastal Consent and, once issued, the application for Planning Approval. It is expected that this process will take between 6 and 12 months.

At this time we would expect construction to commence either late 2017 or early 2018 and is likely to take around 18 months so at a minimum one season will suffer significant disruption and the club is currently planning how best to minimise the impact of this on patrols, training and nippers.

The club is budgeting \$5 million for the project and the club has received a state government grant of \$1.5 million toward the cost of the project. These funds will be administered through Life Saving Victoria's Facility Development Program. A further \$1 million in pledges has been received to date from Cornerstone Donors.

We reiterate our thanks to all members for their input to date. This is not a simple project but most items are on track. Once the design is finalised and we obtain Coastal Consent fundraising will become the main focus.

MARKETING REPORT

This year has seen the Anglesea SLSC receive a number of significant asset acquisitions including the final installation of a Solar hot water system that has reduced our reliance on the 4 electric hot water services and hopefully provide better availability of hot water to showers etc. The aim of this project has been to also reduce the load on our electrical system which has suffered ongoing outages for a number of years. The solar hot water system was funded through the Surf Coast Solar Towns program championed by our Federal member, Sarah Henderson.

As many members are aware, our long term community partner and supporter, Alcoa has closed the power station and has made significant final donations to the many not for profit organisations in Anglesea and the Surf Coast with the Anglesea SLSC receiving a grant of some \$40k. This funding has allowed the club to purchase of a new patrol vehicle which has now been configured to SLSA requirements and will be hitting the beach this coming season. Alcoa's generous donation was also supplemented by Bayford Motors who supplied the vehicle at cost price saving the club additional funds for which we are grateful for.

Our major sponsors including Garry Johnson and Burson Autoparts, Lorraine Lee, Seaband, new major sponsor New Balance and the Herd family continue with their generous support of club activities.

The boat section through Scott Penning has also been active during the 2015/16 season and has established a core group of sponsors including Bayford, Morris Finance, Telstra Business Centre Geelong and Senator Cranes who provide funding to support training and competition activity.

There were also numerous other grants received from organisations such as realestate.com.au, Beach Surf Equipment Fund and the Surf Coast Shire which were used to support our lifesaving activities including the purchase of rescue board, first aid equipment including defibrillators.

We have also continued to enjoy the support by our long term sponsors including Alcoa, Burson Autoparts, Hardings Hardware, Hamlan Homes / Squeekies, MC Herd Wholesale Meats, Funky Trunks / Funkita and XOSIZE for the Rock2Ramp, one of our major fundraising events.

The Rock2Ramp also continues to enjoy the ongoing support of Interface Recruitment, Mantra Hotels & Resorts and Angove Wines without whom we would not continue to offer the place

getters in each age group category the best prize pool of all surf coast based and possibly other swims.

The nipper program continues to have sponsors queuing up with major support from Lorraine Lee Linen, Seaband, Interface Recruitment, New Balance and also local business's in Ocean Road Landscaping and A-Z Plumbing and the Anglesea Big 4 Holiday Park.

I would also like to thank Coulter Roache Lawyers for pro bono legal advice and we need to acknowledge the outstanding support we receive from WestCarrHarvey Accountants and Business Consultants for their ongoing financial advice and support in managing our accounts.

Our sponsors are an important part of the Anglesea SLSC family as without their support the purchase of our equipment needs, mandatory gear etc would not be possible which would make the conduct of our programs near impossible.

Our longstanding relationship with the Anglesea Community Bendigo Bank continues to provide benefits of around \$1-1,200 per quarter based on accounts linked to the club. We are now seeing more members or their family move their banking facilities to the Bendigo Bank and 'tag' their accounts to the club.

In addition, we have agreements with Great Ocean Properties, Budget Printer Cartridges and two Hotel / Motel chains including the Mantra Group and Choice Hotels and any accommodation booking made through these generate a commission.

We continue to enjoy a close relationship with our local media partners including the Geelong Advertiser, Surf Coast Echo and in particular the Surf Coast Times, who provide coverage for our events but also recognition for the efforts and achievements of members.

We also have many companies who support our club and when making purchase decisions we should consider goods purchased from our sponsors and supporters particularly those who may be involved in running a business on a day to day basis.

In closing, I would like to thank on behalf of the committee and members of the Anglesea SLSC, all our sponsors and supporters and also the grant benefactors for their ongoing support and generosity in supporting our club.

This group camped at the foreshore Caravan Park in their tents. They met up with Harold Menelaus on the beach and did many activities together, (Harold later became the 2nd President of ASLSC). They undertook several rescues during their visits before the surf club was formed, using the lifesaving reel found in the old Anglesea Royal club's shed in the sand dunes.

Wally obtained his Surf Bronze Medallion in the first BM group after Anglesea SLSC was officially formed on 28/1/1952. no 31056

Wally gained an Instructors Certificate in March 1953, (Jimmy Shears & his brothers were part of that group). Wally was the club's Chief Instructor 1953-54, he was on the Club's committee 1953 -1968. He was Vice President 1961-68, and an active patrolling member for 6 years.

Wally became a Life Member of ASLSC in 1966. In 2002 Wally received a SLSC 50 year Service Award & in 2012 when he & his family came to the Club's 60th Anniversary, he was presented with a SLSC 60 Year Service Award.

He was a great help to David Baker (first President of ASLSC) on the formation of the club and we thank him for his guidance during those early years.

Ian Reginald O'Brien

27/10/1952 – 30/12/2015

Ian joined ASLSC in October 1968, he gained his BM on 22/12/1968 no V3281.

He participated in many of the club's activities, riding his board or crewing in a surf boat. He was appointed Junior Club Captain in 1969 & 1970, was made best Clubman in 1968/69 season & best Junior Boatman in 1970/71. He was on the committee 1971 & 1972. Ian was an active patrolling member for 9 years & left the club during 1977/78 Season.

Ian often spoke of his wonderful time he had at the club during the late 60's & 70's, the waves he caught and will be missed by many especially his family by his sudden passing.



John Angus Laird

16/8/1935 – 13/5/2016

John was educated at Geelong Grammar and played football with Geelong in the VFL. He was a keen longboard rider, fisherman and Anglesea Lifesaver, gaining his BM at Anglesea on 24/1/1954 no 45068 and his instructors Certificate during 1957/58 season.

John was on the ASLSC Committee 1956-62, Board and Ski Captain 1956, Registrar 1957-59, Gear Steward 1959, and was awarded Best Clubman in 1956/1957. He competed at Torquay at their Olympic Carnivals, when the first International Carnival was held, in November 1956.

John was an active patroller & competitor for many years and was the Club's 2nd Honorary Architect from 1969-81. He participated in many a working bee, assisted in building the Boat shed on the beach, in front of the dunes in 1956, and then the 1961/62 building of the Clubhouse on the cliff. John was involved with many communities in Anglesea and will be missed.



Lindsay Edward John

2/4/1939 – 2/3/2016

Lindsay joined ASLSC 31/1/1963, gaining his BM 23/2/1964 no 1835. & Instructor's Certificate in 13/12/1964 no V416, and was an active patroller for 9 years before resigning from the club in December 1976.

Lindsay was an active and successful ski competitor during the late 1960's, & early 1970's especially in the Double ski events where he excelled with Peter Howard as his partner, they were very successful in the double ski event at the SLSC Titles held at Nth Cronulla NSW in 1968 in gaining a 2nd place, this was Anglesea's first ski event medal at the Australian Titles, the partnership was very successful for many years at the Victorian state titles & carnivals.

During the late 1960's Lindsay pioneered a design of a round bottomed fiberglass ski, with assistance of Peter Howard & others, this was a great improvement from the traditional flat bottomed plywood ones that the ski paddlers of the day were using.

We hope the Ski paddlers of today thank Lindsay for his Ski innovation when they are paddling amongst the waves.

Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Foundation For the year ended 30 April 2016

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

The trustees of the Foundation have prepared the financial statements of the Foundation on the basis that the Foundation is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. These financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of beneficiaries, the information needs of stakeholders and for the basis of preparation of the Ancillary Fund Return.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the trustees have determined are appropriate to meet the purposes of preparation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention, except for certain assets, which, as noted, have been written down to fair value as a result of impairment. Unless otherwise stated, the accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the prior year.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful debt has been created.

Financial Assets

Investments held are originally recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company that remain unpaid at 30 April 2016. Trade payables are recognised at their transaction price. They are subject to normal credit terms and do not bear interest.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the entity has a legal or constructive obligation resulting from past events, for which it is probable that there will be an outflow of economic benefits and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured using the best estimate available of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue from interest is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Revenue from dividends is recognised when the entity has a right to receive the dividend.

Based on our review which is not an audit, except for the effects on the financial report of such adjustments, if any, as might have been required had the limitation on our audit procedures referred to in the *Basis for qualified opinion* paragraph not existed, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the 30 April 2016 financial report of the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Foundation does not present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Foundation as at 30 April 2016, and of its financial performance for the year ended on that date, in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards.

Basis of accounting and restriction on distribution

Without modifying our conclusion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Foundation to meet the requirements of the Foundation's rules. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

The financial statements cover Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. as an individual entity. Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. is a not for profit Association incorporated in Victoria under the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

The principal activities of the Association for the year ended 30 April 2016 were .
Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and are net of any rebates and discounts received.

Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment of losses.

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight line basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss , except for goodwill.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Employee benefits expected to be settled more than one year after the end of the reporting period have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may satisfy vesting requirements. Cashflows are discounted using market yields on national government bonds with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cashflows. Changes in the measurement of the liability are recognised in profit or loss.

Employee benefits are presented as current liabilities in the balance sheet if the association does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least one year after the reporting date regardless of the classification of the liability for measurement purposes under AASB 119.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depending on whether the outcome of the services can be estimated reliably, if the outcome can be estimated reliably then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period. If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

Revenue from training services is generally recognised once the training has been delivered.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

Qualified Opinion

Based on our review which is not an audit, except for the effects on the financial report of such adjustments, if any, as might have been required had the limitation on our audit procedures referred to in the *Basis for qualified opinion* paragraph not existed, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the 30 April 2016 financial report of the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. does not present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Anglesea Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. as at 30 April 2016, and of its financial performance for the year ended on that date, in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards.

As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
