president's report

Season 2008-2009 concludes another year of significant milestones for Anglesea SLSC. Thank you to our Directors, Committee and all members who contributed to fundraising activities and supported the club.

Our core business is to provide aquatic safety at Anglesea beach but as the public disperse along the surf coast and our club grows, so does our responsibility to respond to surrounding beaches.

Our club lifesavers carried out their voluntary patrol commitment professionally and to the highest standards expected of surf lifesavers across Australia.

Thank you Patrol Captains and patrol members for your dedication to being an Anglesea surf lifesaver. The community holds you in the highest regard as volunteers and as dedicated community service providers. Lifesaving is a life-long passport to friendship and sense of belonging.

The pinnacle of recognition in surf lifesaving is a National Award. Congratulations to Lachie Holbery-Morgan who achieved both Australian Lifeguard and Lifesaver of the Year. This is the first time a lifesaver has won these National Awards in the same year.

The club is working hard to reduce its debt on the storage facility. Members may be aware that over the peak summer season many of the trailers that are usually parked around the club are now secured at the facility, as part of our asset protection program and to provide more parking.

We are now in the possession of a new Holden Rodeo 4WD through the support of Orix Fleet who provided the vehicle at cost price and to

the Bendigo Bank, and Hayden Real Estate for sponsoring the lease costs. We have also secured a Polaris Ranger which is a huge hit at patrol and club activities and we are working with a sponsor to cover the gap between the grant received and the purchase price.

Patrols have certainly appreciated club and sponsor support with equipment and resources dedicated to lifesaving activities. Dr Andrew Reichmann again provided outstanding support at the Bronze Camp, Nippers and Patrol which is quite amazing considering he lives and works in Albury.

Anglesea SLSC is proud to have Linfox as its major sponsor, supporting our Nipper Program under the direction of Peter Foster. This is a partnership that grows in strength and I am sure all the Nippers, along with their mums and dads, appreciate the support. The Nipper program is a team effort from all the age group leaders through to the supporting mums and dads.

A future challenge for the Nipper Program is the conversion of the large participation over the peak summer period to more competitors at the Junior Victorian Titles. Anglesea juniors performed well at Sandridge this year although team events needed to improve significantly.

The club achieved the milestone of 40 years of Nippers. It must be highlighted our highly respected youth sponsor and long time member, John Turner, is credited as one of the people who started Nippers in Victoria at Pt Lonsdale SLSC. A celebration of 40 years of Nippers at Anglesea was held at the Anglesea carnival with Bruce (Mo) Edmonds and Peter Foster delivering speeches on the impact of the Anglesea SLSC Nipper Program.

Through sound planning by the Rock2Ramp sub-committee, this year's swim saw a necessary change in date which certainly increased attendance. The 'Burson Auto Parts' Rock2Ramp swim requires a great deal of assistance to achieve success. Thank you to members for your support on this long day.

Again Judy and Alex Sutherland, with their support team, coordinated an outstanding golf day with the sponsorship of Anglesea Golf Club. This is a vital fundraiser held in August when little income is being generated by club activities.

Congratulations to the IRB team under the direction of Jeremy Farrington achieving its best performance to date in competition, both at the Australian Titles and the World Titles but in the leadup won the 3rd Victorian Title in a row. The club provides a large support program in IRB's for patrolling, events management and competition. The club provides significant support and resources into this section of the club which also assists in member retention.

This year was the final of three consecutive years of the Australian Titles being held at Scarborough, Western Australia. It has been a demanding period on the club due to limited and expensive accommodation and support of equipment. Anglesea SLSC is very lucky to have Jim Geary as Director of Marketing and Sponsorship. The time Jim puts into the club is equivalent to someone in a full time role. Jim is on the phone day and night, prepares submissions, actively works around the club and follows-up in person. I am sure all members have observed the changes around the club and the promotion of sponsors over recent years.

This year Anglesea has achieved a record number of lifesaving awards which is attributed to the efforts of Vanessa Lamborn and Nick Creevy as Chief Instructors and Scott Yeomans as Director of Development. The club will need to review training systems and programs to ensure the energy level and costs are sustainable.

I must make special mention to Dr Jake Foster and all of our patrons. administration report

Season 2008/2009 has again seen Anglesea SLSC grow exponentially in all areas. Whether it be Scott Yeomans and his crew conducting a huge Bronze camp, the Rock2Ramp generating record numbers of entries, the Nipper Program topping 500 participants or the Door Knock setting new records, everything Anglesea has delivered has been on a massive scale. This has presented new challenges for the administration of the club to ensure we can cope with the demand.

A need for a more businesslike approach to running the club has come about due to a period of unprecedented growth for the club. In 2005 the club was excited about finally breaking the 1000 member barrier, however in the past 4 years the club has soared even higher to record a current membership of over 1800. With this in mind the new strategic plan

aims to ensure the club is a self sustainable service provider and community partner

In 2006 the directors of Anglesea SLSC decided to initiate the development of a Strategic Plan for our club. The strategic plan provides an insight into the direction and the key initiatives for the club over the next three years. The next 3 years will be critical to our strategic objectives over the next 10 years and will be the foundation for our future success. Our aim is to create value for the Anglesea community and the members that enjoy the magnificence of the local environment.

Anglesea SLSC membership is predominantly Melbourne based (some 65%), but over the past few years we have made it a focus of the club to build better relations with the local community and also offer lifesaving

opportunities to those who would not otherwise have access. Clearly the days are long gone where clubs would post signs saying 'Members Only' where now most clubs have a more inclusive 'New Members Welcome' approach. But at Anglesea we are taking that one step further by saying, 'Everyone is Welcome' whether they be potential members or not, the club should be used as a resource for the entire community, after all the more people exposed to lifesaving the better. This is evidenced by the ongoing commitment to providing services like the club café, the club shop/information centre and of course all the partnership that have been developed with local community groups and schools.

In addition to providing opportunities for external groups we continue our proud tradition of supporting the development and leadership opportunities of our own members. This is demonstrated by Anglesea having 2 participants and a facilitator attending the SLSA National Leadership College in December 2008. The participants being Andy Doyle and Lachlan Holbery-Morgan and the facilitator being former Sir Adrian Curlewis Scholar and Club Captain Bronwyn Baker. Our President Warren Clarke also attended the 2008 SLSA Leaders' Conference in August 2008, ensuring that all our current and emerging leaders are skilled up to carry out their responsibilities.

With Malcom Legge stepping down as Green and White Rag newsletter editor I have been ably assisted throughout the season by Malcolm Plant, so thanks to Malcs for all his help. The web site is growing and is now due for major overhaul, but in the meantime Jim Geary has been driving its use within the membership and loading the site up with all the information any member could need. Great work Jim!

Looking forward to next season there will be a big push by Anglesea SLSC and Life Saving Victoria to ensure that ALL members have to attain their Working With Children Check. I reiterate that this applies to ALL members so there will be a significant push during the off season to make sure members comply with this government requirement. We will be working hard to ensure that all members



realise that as of next season, the WWCC will be a compulsory part of attaining or renewing membership with the club.

Personally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank Diane Feudoloff and Judy Sutherland who continue to operate the daily activities within the club office and have assisted

me greatly in taking on this new role. As a general statement I would also like to thank ALL members who continue to give so much to the club, whether it's the President or the person just doing their hours on patrol, every contribution counts and we should not measure our contribution against others but only by what we are each able to give. rescue services report

This season has seen Anglesea SLSC maintain and improve on its already impressive patrolling and lifesaving capabilities, and what a fantastic season it's been. Anglesea has done a great job at Patrolling our beach and from a rescue service stand point I couldn't be more proud. All of our achievements reflect clearly the quality of all Anglesea SLSC members, This season the club was able to field ten core patrols, each patrol boasting well above the minimum state required awards and members. This is truly a testament to the lifesaving strength of Anglesea SLSC.

Some note worthy aspects of the season include the revamping of the IRB shed, it has been transformed into a functional gear shed, the first aid room is also in the best condition ever and our first aid equipment has had a make over with 2 new first aid kits and 2 new Oxy Bags. Moreover, the club has also purchased a Holden Rodeo twin cab Ute and a 6 wheel Polaris for beach use. Many thanks must go to Jim Geary for most of this new equipment, he has done a fantastic job in terms of gaining sponsorship.

Each Season Life Saving Victoria conducts a state wide patrol competition, this involves patrols being inspected and audited at random through out the season, during this season Anglesea SLSC had two patrols that managed

to score full points plus extra bonus points! This further highlights Anglesea's dedication to patrolling excellence. During this season Anglesea Main Beach had approximately 120 000 visitors with 14 rescues, 49 first aid cases and 1502 preventative actions.

For the first time ever Anglesea SLSC participated in a regional search and rescue exercise run at Pt Lonsdale, this was a fantastic opportunity for Anglesea members to work with other clubs and emergency services, including Police, Ambulance, CFA, Coastguard and Torquay Marine Rescue in a rescue scenario on a large scale.

Another highlight for the club this season was the Rescue Services section nipper carnival for grade 5 and 6 students from eight primary schools in the Surf Coast area, this event was a great success and saw over 300 students participate in

Lifesaving activities and learn important surf awareness skills. Special thanks to all who volunteered their time to run the day.

development services report

The Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Development Section has again enjoyed a successful, memorable and record-breaking season. As we look back on the past few seasons, one thing has become clear; the Development Section continues to grow and continues to benefit other sections of the club as new members stream in through one of the many training programs we conduct, most notably, our December Bronze Camp.

The upgraded audio-visual outfitting of the Ray Marsh room provides our club with an unrivalled state of the art training facility, equipped with the best of new technologies and of course a great view to go with it! This facility provides a strong platform from which Anglesea could seek to pursue its commercial training activities. Branching out to the broader community, I believe, would not only reinforce our community message, but also provide another welcome revenue stream to continue funding the important work we do.

The club's Chief Instructors, Nick Creevey and Vanessa Lamborn continued to impress and inspire, particularly amongst our younger ranks, driving a program that saw the majority of our younger patrolling members attain new qualifications and boost their lifesaving skills.

As in 2007/2008, a demanding and ambitious training calendar was launched with courses being conducted at an average of two courses per week both at the club and in Melbourne. The strategy of offering training in Melbourne continues to be popular, particularly outside of the summer months. With the overwhelming majority of members living in metropolitan Melbourne, ensuring we maximize training opportunities for our members is of utmost importance in order to contribute to the broad aim of boosting our club's image from a 'summer' activities base, to an entity that boasts competition, lifesaving training and social functions on a year-round basis.

Our biggest season... ever!

Proficiencies have become one of the most demanding areas of the Development Section. Requalifying and up-skilling some 1800 members is no easy task. Over 1000 proficiencies were conducted in season 2008/09, and this again enshrined Anglesea's place as the largest and most qualified membership of any Victorian lifesaving club.

Bronze Camp '08 '150 People. One Beach. One Week. One Camp. One Club.'

The 2008/2009 season saw Anglesea SLSC take on the challenge of running a Bronze Camp bigger than any we have conducted before. '150 People. One Beach. One Week. One Camp. One Club' was our theme and a total of 178 members were involved in the camp, as candidates, instructors and support personnel and a record 124 new Bronzies joined our patrolling ranks from Bronze Camp alone.

The weeklong camp saw a necessary departure from the traditional club-based camp, with half the candidates residing in the bunkhouses and half residing at the Anglesea Beachfront Family Caravan Park, where we hired all of their cabin accommodation. A large marquee was erected on the oval at the caravan park, and this served as the central whole-of-camp meeting, training and dining hall facility.

Planning such an ambitious project was no easy task. What had begun as a half-serious suggestion in a discussion I had nearly a year earlier with Andy Doyle and Nick Demiris was now a project in planning. Both Andy and Nick joined Nick Creevey, Vanessa Lamborn and I to plan Bronze Camp 2008; a camp that would become the envy of surf clubs across the country.

Bronze Camp '08 saw the inception of a new range of marketing and promotional material, including glossy brochures and the launch of the new camp website (www.BronzeCamp.com.au) and online registration and administration system that was custom built for the camp. This system proved to be extremely useful in assisting with the increased administration requirements for the camp.

Highlights of the camp included a range of activities to complement the training and make the camp a bit more fun and enjoyable for everyone involved. These included flare demonstrations and presentations from Police Search & Rescue, a realistic scenario

involving a diving emergency, Anglesea Idol, the inter house karaoke competition and a large coordinated search and rescue exercise which involved the Southern Peninsula Rescue Squad helicopter, which proved to be a big hit to cap off the camp.

I would like to make mention of the Camp's Senior Leadership Group, which included: Scott Yeomans (Camp Director), Nick Creevey and Vanessa Lamborn (Chief Instructors), Nick Demiris (Operations Manager), Andy Doyle, Jeremy Farrington, Lachie Holbery-Morgan and Jasmin Ellis (Senior Instructors/House Leaders), Isabelle Targett (Catering Coordinator), Ben Marks (Water Safety Coordinator) and John Cooper (Logistics Coordinator). Special thanks to our club Doctor, Dr Andrew Rechtman, who again generously donated his time to serve as Camp Doctor and to assist with emergency care and first aid training. Together with the 38 other trainers and operations personnel the entire Bronze Camp '08 team did a wonderful job in making an ambitious camp a phenomenal success.

Your work in expanding our training team and spearheading an innovative, responsible and member-friendly new training regime has been greatly appreciated. Indeed Nick and Ness are among the youngest members to take on the demanding role of Chief Instructor, yet, they have certainly completed their terms with distinction. Both Nick and Ness can be proud of the Development Section they now pass on to the new Chief Instructors; the section is the biggest it's ever been, it provides unparalleled opportunities to members, is successful and is revered by every other club across the state.

As Life Saving Victoria's State Training Supervisor I am fortunate to work with a dedicated professional and volunteer team at LSV HQ in Port Melbourne. To Simon Wilson (LSV Director - Training and Assessment), Nick Bugeja (Manager - Training) and Stuart Wall (State Assessment Supervisor) my sincere thanks for your tremendous work and support.

As you might be aware, I decided not to seek another term as a Director at Anglesea SLSC. With ever increasing work and university commitments, I have decided to focus on completing my tertiary studies and taking some time away from the hectic world of surf club management. Serving on the club's Board has been a great honour and privilege and I thank you all for having entrusted me with such an important position for some two years.

I make apologies here as it is impossible to mention all the great performances throughout the season. As much as I would like to mention all 108 members who have competed in IRB, Masters and Senior carnivals it is not possible.

Firstly a huge thanks must go to all the parents and supporters of the competition teams, section captains, officials, team managers, water safety etc. For them often it is a thankless chore. To all of you, we would have no competition team without you and I very much appreciate all your efforts.

Some of the key developments have been to see us once again competing in R&R with our U17 team winning most competitions for the season and coming away with the U17 and U19 State Title.

Our running area led by Hayley Atkins although relatively small in numbers has had a very successful season with Hayley being the standout, competing in the Queensland 'Ocean Assault' series and coming away from the Nationals with a Bronze medal in the flags and a finals berth in the beach sprint. Matt Dyson, Simon Faulkner, Kate Walker and Peter Hapgood were the other very consistent performers throughout the season.

The boat section also provided very consistent performances throughout the season. We sent four crews up to the Australian Open at Broulee in February and two crews to the Aussies. Once again Joe Bergin committed a huge amount of time and effort to getting the most out of his crews and although Joe will say that he didn't get the results that he wanted, the crews were all very competitive all season. Thanks also to Neil Heathcote for holding the boat section together, often not an easy task.

The water section saw some great performances throughout the season with our U15 boys dominating every carnival. The standout performances were Harry Pearce's Silver Medal in the Champion lifesaver at the Aussies and the strength of their teams making all finals (Cameron, Swim teams and board teams) at the Aussies and being very unlucky to

miss out on a medal in the board teams. Their team has now won the State Title for seven years as they have moved through since nippers.

We have been light on for female competitors in the water this season but the performances of Bridget Tribe, Sam Suendermann and Georgie Baker have been fantastic throughout the entire season

Thanks to Marc Lionnet we now have a great pool ski paddlers with 4 Anglesea members being chosen to represent Australia at the World Cup and World Championships for marathon kayaking. Reid Coutts and Nick Byrne had a great Aussies making the final of the Double but not getting the results that they probably deserved. They have another year in U19's to redeem themselves. With some new recruits on the way the ski section will only continue to grow. The old stager Shane Edmonds continued to be competitive with guys almost half his age and he gives faith to all older members of the club that they can still be up there.

At the time of writing this report the IRB season was just starting and the team is looking forward to defending its State Tiles as well as improving on its performances at the Aussies at Kawana later in the winter.

Looking forward to next season it seems as though our team will continue to get stronger with some new recruits having already been signed up.

There is still a lot of room for improvement. We need to improve the strength of our overall team with more, full club training sessions and move away from the sectionalism of our club. Fundraising will be an increasing challenge as new equipment will be required to get new members competing. I am hoping to see much more of our competition team at Anglesea over the winter months

irb report

In what can only be described as an amazing year, Anglesea's IRB team has had unprecedented success at all levels. The growth of this team over the last four years has allowed it to become a team that is stronger, more competitive, more professional and most of all, one that works together. The results below show the rewards of this highly talented group whom train at least twice a week, in what must be said trying conditions (think middle of winter, stormy weather, water temp 8 degrees).

2008 Victorian IRB Championships, held at Lorne

Firstly to the 2008 Victorian IRB Season. The season took us to all parts of Victoria: Mt Martha, Portland, Inverloch, Anglesea and Lorne. Some very picturesque beaches, which must one of the major benefits competing in any lifesaving sport. Having being the overall winner for the past two years, most teams set about trying to displace us from the top. It became evident towards the end of the season that the Anglesea crews were again finding form that shows why they are the best in Victoria.

The 2008 Victorian IRB Championships were held at Lorne, where a 2-3ft consistent wave allowed for some spectacular action. However Anglesea really showed its depth and talent with every Male and Female team making a final. It was these performances that allowed us to go three in a row. Anglesea once again was the Overall champion, winning by 7 points!

It was our two most senior male competitors Wayne Cartwright and Jeremy Farrington who led the charge. They won 3 out of 4 events coming 4th in the other. Our stranglehold in the tube race in both the female and male events continues, winning both events for the 4th year in a row. The tube event does typify the depth Anglesea has with 4 male crews and 3 female crews represented in the final.

Also handed out at the State Titles presentations were the Propeller Trophies, which are awarded to the crews who are most consistent throughout the premiership rounds during the season. Anglesea succeeded in winning 5 out of 8 including all 4 in the Female events.

2008 Australian IRB Championships, held at Shellharbour NSW

So whilst the Victorian Titles performance may have been impressive, the Australian Titles was simply awe-inspiring. Never has an Anglesea IRB team performed and represented Anglesea SLSC so well. Anglesea has never finished overall on the podium before, this year that changed. Finishing 3rd overall, Anglesea had arrived on the National stage sitting just behind two powerful Queensland clubs. These results included Anglesea's first ever gold medal at an Australian IRB Championship. We have tried for many years but never climbed reached this pinnacle. The team, Anglesea C, who won the Female Mass Rescue will now also be represented on the Propeller Trophy as no Victorian team had ever won this event at a national level. It is fitting that Anglesea C, won the gold in the female mass rescue as Jasmin Ellis and Brooke Dalvean suffered heartbreak last year in the same event where they were

up the front of the field, only for a mechanical failure to end their race. It proves that they are both two very strong competitors that are willing to chase their goals.

So in addition to the gold medal we also won 4 bronze medals. Bronze in the female mass rescue, so we had first and third in that race, really showing we have strength in our top two female teams. Bronze in the female tube rescue, defending their bronze medal from last year. Bronze in the female teams race, the second time the Anglesea girls have stood on the podium in this event. Bronze in the male tube rescue, the second only ever medal Anglesea has won in any male race.

Eleven of our 27 competitors who went to this years Australian Titles came home with a medal. I hope that all those Anglesea members who went, watched or read about these results are proud of what this team has achieved and are motivated to come back even stronger next year.

Rescue 2008, held at Warnemunde, Germany

So whilst many were enjoying the off-season once the Australian Titles finished, a group of 6 Anglesea IRB team members headed over to Germany to represent the club at the World titles. It was worth their efforts as every member came home with a medal and took Anglesea to become world champions! It is something we can claim for two years as the world championships only happen every two years. Winning the overall title was a first for any Victorian Club at any World titles. It was also the first time Anglesea has ever won a gold medal in a World IRB competition and the first time we have won any medal in a male event at a world Championship. Congratulations to all our competitors who made the effort. It is a unique experience representing Anglesea SLSC outside of Australia and all those who represented the Anglesea IRB team, not only did you bring home a medal but also many stories of fun, success and a commitment to head over to Rescue 2010 in Egypt.

Summary:

This highly successful IRB team is becoming a solid backbone, in which the Anglesea SLSC club can continue to grow. Not only is the team successful within the competition arena, reaching new heights each year but we are

also helping redefine the club by taking various leadership positions in the committee and at LSV. It is with teamwork and dedication that is proving to be the successful formula for all those involved.



I am also very thankful to the teams three coaches Wayne Cartwright, Julia Cullity and Jeremy Farrington whom spend countless hours getting all our team members signed off and ensuring they represent Anglesea to the best of their ability.

A big thank you to David North, Paul Day, Mary Kennedy Jones, Mike Martin, Carol Martin, Ken-Leon Yap, James Creevey, Ben Hamberg all of whom have helped us out with officiating this year. It isn't easy standing on the beach in the middle of winter but we do really appreciate it. We'd also like to give a big thank you to Matt Culka, from St Kilda whom became our team manager late in the season, including coming up to the Australian Titles with us. We wouldn't have achieved the results we did without you.

Thank you to our sponsors: Sensis, Alcoa, Barwon Water and Easton Builders, all whom have helped us out with equipment.

I am thoroughly enjoying being part of this team and hope that we continue to reap the rewards of our hard work in the years to come.

It has been an exciting year with many fine achievements on the competition front be it individual, team or section level.. The great results were kicked off with the efforts of the IRB team in winning their 3rd Victorian title in a row which was followed up by 3rd place in the Aussies titles and a great result at the worlds along with a small contingent from our beach and craft sections.

Over the summer period our competition section has continued to show good promise with continued successes from the more 'mature' competitors with the youngsters developing very good skills across a range of disciplines.

Although our competition results provide us some high visibility of our sporting achievements this is augmented with the very high standard that we are setting through our development and rescue services sections.

We continue to lead the way in providing best of breed training and development to our members and we have been very successful in recruiting and developing our lifesavers of tomorrow with the record numbers qualifying with bronze medallion and SRC. Our longer term patrol members provide great mentoring to our newest recruits which is recognised and we saw the club achieve due recognition across a number of areas including Lachie Holbery-Morgan achieving his state and national awards.

These results really provide the club a sound and rounded foundation on which to build the marketing in the club on.. So far our marketing framework has proven itself with our existing sponsors expressing how satisfied they are with how we promote our relationships to the community including the media and also provide branding exposure we offer across our assest. Our marketing program is being recognised by many people and we continue to have 'walkups' where new sponsors are actively seeking out marketing opportunities with us.

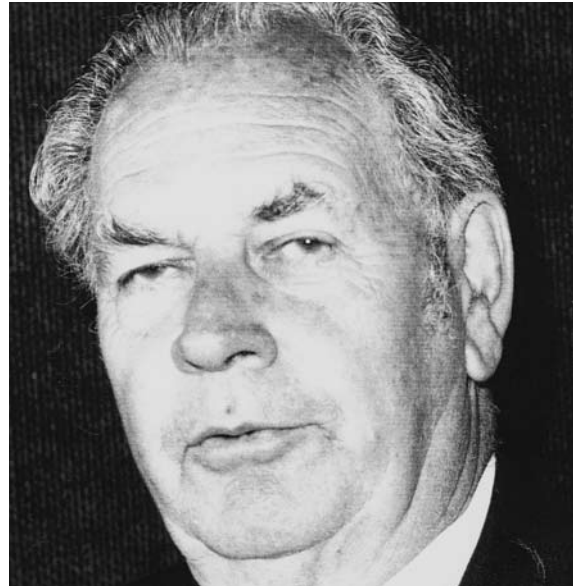

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ending 30 April 2009

Statement of Accounting Policies

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus View and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Standards board and the Associations Incorporations Act 1981.

The financial report has been prepared on a cash basis, based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Incorporation in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Income tax

The income of the Incorporation is exempt from income tax in accordance with the provision of Section 23 (g) (iii) of the Income Tax Assessment Act, as the Incorporation falls within the definition of a society, association or club established for the encouragement of a game or sport.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a specific identification basis and include direct costs and appropriate overheads, if any.

Property, Plant and Equipment

All assets have limited useful lives and are depreciated using the straight line method

over their estimated useful lives. Assets are depreciated from the date of acquisition.

Depreciation rates are reviewed annually for appropriateness and the rates used for each class of asset are as follows:

Buildings	2%
Equipment, Boats, Boards & Ski's	33%
Furniture, Fittings & Equipment	20%

Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.

Revenue

Revenues are recognised at the fair value of the consideration received net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST) payable to the taxation authority.

Interest revenue is recognised as it accrues, taking into account the effective yield on the financial asset.

The gross proceeds of non-current assets sales are recognised at the date control of the asset passes to the buyer.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the assets or as part of an item of the expense. Receivable and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.
