President's Report

One of the incredible strengths of Anglesea SLSC is the support of the generations of members, from patrons to nippers with their mums and dads. The club continues to grow stronger with the development of skill levels and providing the resources to carry out our lifesaving activities.

The club is the proud owner of a new storage facility at 5 Inverlochy Street, Anglesea. You can't miss it in the industrial estate, it has a 40ft container with the Club, Linfox and Blue Scope Steel logos blazed across the side of the container. When driving through Anglesea next please inspect our new asset, the result of the members' hard work. Special mention to our club benefactors John Worrell, Frank Herd, Gary Johnson, Bob Harding, Andrew Ramsden and Tim Mason who have supported this long-term investment.

The long term plan is to pay off the loan and use this investment to borrow against and then re-develop the clubhouse. The longer term goal is to provide a club facility that is integrated with lifesaving activities and further develop a partnership with the local community.

A new innovation this year has been the introduction of Information Resource Officers. In the first year of operation, sales of club uniforms were significantly up and our Nipper and 'G' boards survived the summer in good order. Club members have a focal point to access club information and direction every day over the peak summer period.

The club has implemented a number of changes this year such as the Café and bar. We are always working towards improvement and the challenge is ahead of us.

The 'Deck Café' grows from strength to strength with many local community visitors enjoying the club who have never visited before. The Deck Café provides services for members and the community and is value added to our membership. The views and services lend to the promotion of the club.

Anglesea members have been involved in a significant number of rescues, body recovery and first response to patient clinical needs. Our patrol members have carried out their duties with distinction, which is a reflection on our drive for a progression of lifesaving awards. Thank you Scott Yoemans, Nick Creevey, Vanessa Lamborn and their large team of instructors who held numerous education and training programs.

An interesting development of the Nipper program is not just parent support but also a large number of younger members supporting the program with leadership and water safety. Congratulations to Peter Foster and the Green Team for an outstanding program.

Anglesea performed at a high level with patrol inspections this season, however there were significant gaps identified in Anglesea Surf Rescue and patrol members missing patrols. Our club uniform has been refreshed by Tracie Price; looking good Tracie.

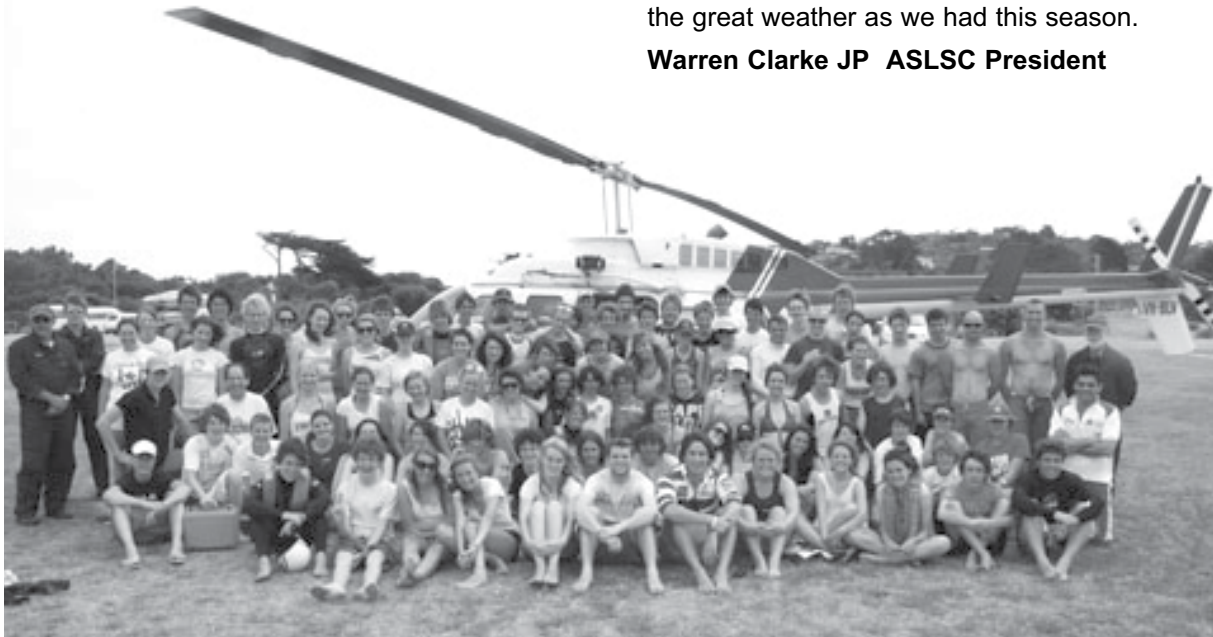

Rescue Services Report

'Two Students Drown at Anglesea' read the headlines on 10 December 2007, immediately the 07/08 Anglesea SLSC patrol season had one of the most eventful beginnings, one that will be talked about, well into the future.

I would like to highlight the work of 11 dedicated patrol members who worked over two hours in the effort to rescue, revive and subsequently retrieve the bodies of two tourists at Hutt Gully, 2km west of the Surf Club. Lachlan Holbery-Morgan, Andy Doyle, Paddy Hernon, Scott Yeomans, Ken-Gene Yap, Tim Dodd, Morgan Day, Tombo Fahey, Morgan Day, James Chan and Ben Marks.

In up to 8 foot surf, as the temperature dropped from 20 to 11 degrees, and with dusk approaching rapidly, the above named coordinated with Police, Ambulance and other Marine Rescue organisations in an operation lasting over two hours. These members were first on scene with significant numbers, a rescue boat, first aid equipment including an oxygen kit, defibrillator and communication resources. In the coming days they would endure front page spreads and prime time television of gruesomely reminding pictures, never ending pressure from the media all whilst conducting one of the largest and most successful Bronze Camps for the Club, with over 100 candidates and training officers participating at the camp. On behalf of myself, and the whole club I would like to thank all those who were involved and assisted. You have brought a great deal of admiration to the work of the club, and are exceptional ambassadors of the work we perform.

Whilst this would be one of the most dramatic incidents for the season, the rest of the year was far from dull. Patrol members racked up more first aids, preventative actions and beach attendance figures than previous seasons comparatively, with 29 first aid cases, 1440 preventative actions and 40,437 beach attendees. This was well up on last season's totals of 25 first aid, 1224 preventative actions and 35,305 beach attendees. The high number of preventative actions performed during the season is a strong indicator that the efficiency of work being performed by the patrolling members is increasing, with rescues down from

seven last season to only one this season.

The season also saw four critical incidents including a suspected spinal injury and a

shark that forced closure of the beach, and two ambulance attendances. Whilst some members have voiced concern for the direction of the area and that the patrolling strength is dwindling, it's pertinent to highlight that all major incident and rescue statistics have steadily been decreasing across the past five seasons, whilst trends of preventative actions, active patrolling membership numbers and proficient awards are on the rise.

My and the Club's thanks are extended to all patrolling members, but most especially the members of Anglesea Surf Rescue (ASR) and their captains; Lachlan Holbery-Morgan, Bronwyn Baker, Chris Symington, Lisa Williams and Paddy Hernon, Paul Lunny, Jeremy Farrington, Joe Bergin and Scott Yeomans. This season has been one of the most involved and strenuous, but the success of the section can be largely attributed to obvious dedication, skill and experience of our Patrol Captains and their teams. Congratulations to Dr Andrew Rechtman who will be receiving the Life Saving Victoria Bronze Award for Patrolling. Andrew completed 126.5 hours of patrol this season and was a very recognisable and enthusiastic patroller for the club.

As a club 4768.50 patrol hours were completed from November to March.

Of concern is that many of the top patrolling members do greater than 50% of their hours at clubs other than Anglesea. I believe this illustrates the rising number of Melbourne based members choosing to complete their hours at Melbourne clubs. This is an issue that will have to be followed intently, as patrol hours at Anglesea are down by over 300 in comparison to last season.

To the section officers, IRB Captain – Jeremy Farrington, Gear Steward - Mick Rigg and Lloyd Simpson, for his outstanding commitment

to the upkeep of First Aid equipment my thanks for an excellent standard of equipment provided, without which the success of the season, area and patrols could not have been possible.

In January the club was shocked to learn of the passing of Tim Gates, a seasoned Surf Life Saver from Fairhaven Surf Life Saving Club. Anglesea SLSC members were amongst the first responders to the incident at Fairhaven, and turned out in force to see off a great surf lifesaver at a service held on Fairhaven beach. My thanks again to all those involved, your efforts gave Tim the best chance of survival. I would also like to extend sincere condolences to the Gates Family, and the Fairhaven SLSC for their loss.

Lastly I would like to thank the members of the Anglesea Police, the Anglesea Ambulance Officers, CFA Anglesea, Torquay Marine Rescue, Anglesea Motor Yacht Club, Life Saving Victoria, the Australian Lifeguard Service, Regional Officer Matthew Ponsford, Assistant Regional Officer Paul Lunny and Torquay, Jan Juc, Fairhaven and Lorne Surf Life Saving Clubs for continuing support on an operational level.

Development Services Report



The Anglesea Surf Life Saving Club Development Section is the largest in the State and the frequency and standards of its operational activities rival, and in many cases exceed, most districts. This is highlighted by fact that our Development Section is directly responsible for approximately 10% of all awards and proficiencies processed in the State of Victoria.

This in itself is a remarkable statistic, but it is also one that shows that the Development Section does far more than just the December Bronze Camp. Indeed, our Bronze Camp is now one of the largest and most successful Bronze Camps in the country and has become the envy of clubs across Australia.

It is a testament to the strength of our Development Section that two of our members have gone on to be elected as two of the three most senior Training and Assessment officers in the state; LSV's Director of Training and Assessment and State Training Supervisor.

New team, new plan

With two new Chief Instructors, Nick Creevey and Vanessa Lamborn, taking over this season, the Development team set an inspirational agenda to grow the section and build on the successes of the past. This season there was a conscious effort to structure the development

calendar, to increase the availability and frequency of courses for our members, both locally in Anglesea and for our expansive Melbourne-based members.

Courses were conducted throughout the year in a variety of locations. Our strategy was achieved, by scheduling courses at times that maximized the number of members available to attend and assist on such course, by taking into account various academic, professional and other lifesaving commitments. This has proved to be incredibly successful, evidenced by the substantial increase in the number of members undertaking awards.

The season kicked off with a range of first aid and emergency care courses, being held in July and continued with a series of patrol and powercraft awards leading up to the start of the patrol season. This phased in approach ensured our patrols were adequately equipped with a number of newly qualified members. As the end of November neared, our focus moved to the club's annual Bronze Camp and finalizing the six months worth of planning that went into what was our largest Bronze Camp on record.

Development Services Report

Bronze Camp

Bronze Camp involved over 120 members, 100 of whom lived-in on-site. The sheer number of members residing on the premises pushed to the club accommodation to its absolute limits and necessitated the conversion of the gym into accommodation to cope with the overwhelming demand for the camp. On top of the standard Bronze Medallion training, the camp also saw the likes of a Marine Safety Victoria presentation and demonstration, including the chance for several candidates to set off flares, which was generously organized by our Club Captain, David 'Ducky' Marsh. The candidates also enjoyed being dazzled by the lights and music of 'Anglesea Idol' a karaoke competition, that went towards the overall new 'Bronze Camp House Competition'. Other activities included presentations from LSV on the range of activities and opportunities available to members and presentations from the various sections of our competition team.

To cap off all of their training the candidates were exposed to some very realistic scenarios, including a very realistic looking lacerated limb and the chance to use the services of the Southern Peninsula Rescue Squad's rescue helicopter to winch several casualties to safety. All of this ensured our 'bronzies' were well prepared for their assessment on the final day, which was held together with other local clubs at Jan Juc Surf Life Saving Club. Getting to the assessment was a significant logistical challenge in itself. Transporting 100 people 'down the road' isn't a simple feat, and with an 8.30am start time a novel solution was devised.

The use of a double-decker party bus made the task of moving such a large group of people an effective and enjoyable activity. While the assessment was a success, especially considering the numbers being processed the only problem occurred on the return trip, when the bus broke down, requiring a push start by our newly qualified lifesavers. Thankfully, the bus returned to life and while late in their return, concluded their journey with the presentation of the newly struck Gympy Cup, named after club legend John 'Gympy' Shears.

Such a large and successful camp does not occur without a great deal of work and support. Special thanks must be extended to Dr. Andrew Rechtman who generously served as our Camp Doctor. Andrew not only proved to be so valuable for his medical skills but also as one of our group trainers. Similarly, Jasmin Ellis who recently joined our club, agreed to assist, bringing not only her skills as a trainer and professional lifeguard but also as a paramedic. Once again, having a doctor and a paramedic on the camp not only proved to be invaluable but I'm sure put parents' minds at ease.

The other two people that can't go without a mention are Catherine Wilcox and Jessica McKeown who had the massive task of cooking for and feeding over 100 people three meals a day for an entire week. For anyone this would be an impressive feat but the fact that these girls are only 18 years old is even more impressive.

One of notable mention is the January SRC squad which is run every year by four parents that have affectionately become known as 'the four amigos', Ingilby Dickson, Michael Lombard, Bruce Anderson and Ian Hanley all of whom do a stellar job in planning and conducting this very successful and popular course.

The end of the 'silly season' didn't mark the end of the training calendar though, as several

Facilities Report

Although commencing Director of Facilities in November 2007 a number of projects were completed. The patrol and equipment area has been labelled and designed for patrol efficiency.

During the latter half of last year the Anglesea SLSC Foundation provided funding to modernise our audio – visual equipment in the Ray Marsh Room. This included a wide screen TV and permanent overhead projection as well as much better sound equipment. At the same time an agreement was reached with Coast Watch to supply and install an external web cam that systematically views the main surf and Roadnight beaches, housed on the Alcoa Tower. All members can now log into our web site and view the weather/surf conditions. Scott Yeomans was instrumental in bringing this equipment together and installing it with the support of Chris Kennedy (Brighton LSC).

Several changes were needed for our facilities, over and above the general maintenance a Surf Club like ours normally experiences. The first one was the enlarging and remodelling of the Club Shop. I thank Steve Tribe and working group who helped me with this remodelling. This facility upgrade resulted in a well stocked and pleasant shop that was supervised by Tracey Price and staffed by Leena Zhou, Tom Meredith and Andrew Niece. The turnover and sales of club uniform rose considerably this year.

During early December the Club Gym was modified to allow for extra accommodation for our caterers the 'Dancing Goats'. The Club Café was extremely successful and well attended, especially on Nipper mornings and the evening meals were very well received.

A grant was obtained to install a security system to protect the club assets, particularly the Ray Marsh Room, thank you Jim Geary and Scott Yeomans for your ongoing support with coordinating the installation.

The club has also received a grant via the CSESP for improved lighting and the installation of split system air conditioning to extend the use of the Ray Marsh Room, particularly

over the winter period.

A large project has been the purchase of a storage facility at the

Anglesea Industrial Park. To date we have coordinated the storage of an Anglesea club container with one paying customer, Jan Juc SLSC storing their container. The club is currently going through a process to subdivide the property to increase value and to also obtain a permit from The Surf Coast Shire, to assist the front section of the property with income generation.

Community understanding and expectations in regard to sustainability are rising quickly and the club has an on-going obligation to develop our facilities. The challenge will be to now incorporate a sustainable blueprint for future operations and developments. Progress has been made this year obtaining a grant from the Federal Government Community Water Grant with the installation of two rainwater tanks. We also thank Geoff Inman for providing the pumps to the water tanks.

I would like to conclude with thanking Mick McConnell, Bill 'Gunna' James and David Eades who at various times helped keep our club facilities running.

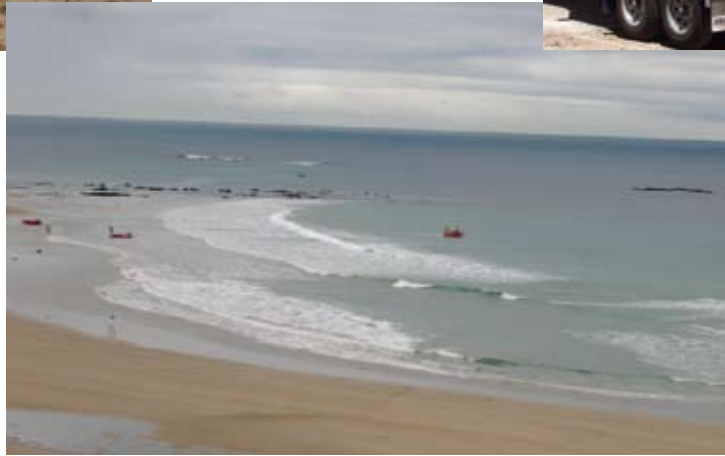

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ending 30 April 2008

Statement of Accounting Policies

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus View and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Standards board and the Associations Incorporations Act 1981.

The financial report has been prepared on a cash basis, based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Incorporation in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Income tax

The income of the Incorporation is exempt from income tax in accordance with the provision of Section 23 (g) (iii) of the Income Tax Assessment Act, as the Incorporation falls within the definition of a society, association or club established for the encouragement of a game or sport.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a specific identification basis and include direct costs and appropriate overheads, if any.

Property, Plant and Equipment

All assets have limited useful lives and are depreciated using the straight line method over their estimated useful lives. Assets are depreciated from the date of acquisition.

Depreciation rates are reviewed annually for appropriateness and the rates used for each class of asset are as follows:

Buildings	2%
Equipment, Boats, Boards & Ski's	33%
Furniture, Fittings & Equipment	20%

Cash

For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand, at banks and on deposit.

Revenue

Revenues are recognised at the fair value of the consideration received net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST) payable to the taxation authority.

Interest revenue is recognised as it accrues, taking into account the effective yield on the financial asset.

The gross proceeds of non-current assets sales are recognised at the date control of the asset passes to the buyer.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the assets or as part of an item of the expense. Receivable and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.



We are pleased to be able to report that the Foundation has survived the economic downturn and has continued to provide financial support for the Club. The value of total assets increased by 15% to \$280,000 and income available for distribution increased by 22% to \$19,500. Late last year, the Trustees were concerned about the possibility of a weakening in the economy and elected to realize capital profits, restructure investments and hold cash to take advantage of high interest rates. The Trustees resolved to subsidize the interest payable on the mortgage entered into by the Club to purchase the property at Inverloch Drive and to do so until such time as the property becomes self funding.

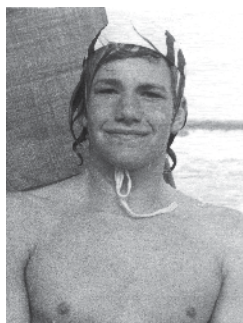

He was SLSV Junior Iron man title holder in 1980, 1981. He also won many State & National swimming titles and regularly competed in ocean swims & triathlons. Selected over the years in several SLSV Teams, both interstate and overseas tours. He gained the ASLSC Margaret Worrell Memorial Trophy awarded for life saving competition three times.



In the early 1990's Sean lost a leg as a result of a car accident, never to be put off he worked hard and became a paralympian, and became the first disabled person to swim the English Channel, then pulled an engagement ring from his bathers and

proposed marriage to Sue at the completion of the swim. Sean will be missed by many in the lifesaving and swimming communities, a life cut short too soon.

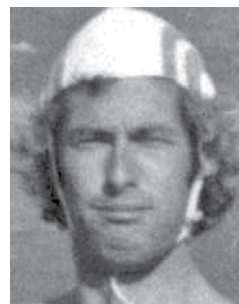
Jim for many years, assisted the club and always held the club in high regard for what it was able to accomplish with limited funds. His children were Nippers and Bronze holders.
