To this end we are working to revamp a few existing activities while introducing some fresh new initiatives including:

- Family Outdoor Movie Night/s
- Senior Club Championships (in January)

With the support of two new Vice Presidents; Matt Symington and Chris Foley and our new Club Captain; Ashlea Smith, we also aim to improve the level of transparency from the Board to all members as can be seen by a number of changes now underway for the upcoming season:

- Establishment of a Governance Advisory Committee and a Finance, Risk & Audit Advisory Committee;
- Launch of a new mobile friendly website to improve communication before the season starts;
- Strategic and Operational Risk Management policy and procedures;
- The development of a new "on patrol" induction program;
- Looking at how to engage with and improve competition coaching.

Our competition partners Mentone LSC have organised a board and ski seminar with renowned coach Clint Robinson on **Saturday 3 September**. Details are:

Session 1 (Ski – First & Second Year)

Time: 10.00 - 11.30am; Format: On Water; Focus: Essential Ski Skills & Technique

Session 2 (Board Paddlers U14 - U17 & Parents / Coaches)

Time: 12.00 noon - 1.30pm; Format: Clubhouse Q&A / Video; Theme: Preparing for the competition season

Issues to be covered / discussed:

- What training should I be doing?
- What should I be doing in August & September?
- What should I be doing in October & November?
- What should I be doing in the December / January holiday period?
- What should I be doing in February?
- Are time trial benchmarks valuable?
- Are there any overwork injury risks? How do I avoid them?
- Weights? Should I be doing weights?
- Running / Swimming? Does this help?
- Is Manly / Freshwater valuable? Why?
- Victorians are always 30 metres behind after the first 80 metres! How do I improve my ability to get through the wave zone? And if I'm in the lead ... how do I hang on?

The cost for these seminars is \$30 for one or \$50 for both. Parents and coaches will not be charged. This is the only seminar that Clint is doing in Victoria preseason and all attendees will learn an enormous amount from the one of the best ever board and ski paddlers in Australia.
